WILFUL MURDER.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSORY.

WHEREAS on Wednesday, the 16th day of February last, a woman known as Eliza Eskins or Askins was found murdered in a hut at Apollo Bay, in the district of Geelong: And whereas the deceased is supposed to have been murdered by one George Eskins or Askins, alias George Carpenter: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid for such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered the woman aforesaid.

PARTICULARS.

Description of the suspected murderer.—George Eskins, alias Askins, about 40 years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, with dark complexion, whiskers shaved off (when last seen), high cheek bones, and rather round features; a native of Ireland; a wood-splitter. He wore, when last seen, a white under-flannel, moleskin trousers, and black felt hat.

It has been ascertained that he came to this colony from California, and is also known by the name of George Carpenter. He stated, sometime prior to the murder, that he had been barman at the United States Hotel, Ballarat, for eighteen months, and was formerly in the employment of a Mr. Young, at the Barrabool Hills.

He was last seen leaving the hut where the murder was committed on the morning of the 16th of February, and is believed to have proceeded towards the coast with the intention of escaping by sea.
