POSTPONEMENT OF THE NEXT WARRNAMBOOL AND BELFAST GENERAL SESSIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such courts should be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions of and for the districts of Warrnambool and Belfast respectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions at Warrnambool and Belfast aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—At Warrnambool, from Saturday, the seventh day of May now next ensuing, to Thursday, the twelfth day of the same month; and at Belfast, from Thursday, the twelfth day of the said month of May, to Friday, the thirteenth day of the same month.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of April, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

FOOTSCRAY PETITION.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy-two householders, resident at and near Footscray, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are all householders within the meaning of the Act above referred to, and resident within the area hereinafter described; that such area is less than nine square miles, that no one point therein is distant six miles from any other point, and that it contains the number of householders required by the said Act.

They further state that they are desirous that the Government township of Footscray and the neighborhood should be constituted a municipal district, to be bounded in manner following, viz.:—Commencing at a point being the intersection of the western boundary line of section 8 of the parish of Cut-paw-paw with the Stony Creek and the north-west corner of the municipal district of Williamstown, and thence bearing south to the south-east corner of section 9 of the said parish; thence in a line bearing west to the south-west corner of the said section 9; thence in a line bearing north to a point on the western boundary of section 16, at the south side of a certain street reserved out of the said section 16, known as Suffolk street; thence along the south side of Suffolk street bearing east to another reserved street called Church street; thence by Church street in a line bearing north-east and east to the western boundary line of section 15; thence in a line along the said western boundary line of section 15 to the north-west corner thereof; thence in a line bearing east along the northern boundary line of the said section 15 to the Saltwater River; thence by the Saltwater River to the south side of the railway; thence in a line to the north-east corner of the Government township of Footscray; thence by the eastern and southern boundary lines of the said township to the western side of the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra and the Stony Creek to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray your Excellency that the beforementioned boundaries may be declared the limits and constituted the municipal district of Footscray, and that your Excellency will be pleased to issue the necessary Proclamation for declaring it a municipality, and defining its limits accordingly."

The petitioners state that they are all householders resident in and around the township of Buninyong, and within the district proposed to be erected into a municipality.

That a public meeting was held on the 7th of March last, whereat a resolution was passed to the effect that the meeting was of opinion that the establishment of a municipal council would be beneficial to the township and the district in general.

That the township of Buninyong is the oldest inland township in the western district, and the proposed municipal district contains a population of about 5000.

That there is within the proposed district a considerable quantity of land under cultivation, and that extensive mining operations of a permanent character are being carried on therein and in the neighborhood.

That within Buninyong division of the mining district there are 40 engines employed in mining, 78 puddling machines, 4 steam quartz-crushing machines, and 40 whims, besides 4 steam saw-mills, and fellmongery and other works.

That the average quantity of gold raised weekly within the immediate vicinity is upwards of 1750 ounces, and the quantity is steadily increasing.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRIGHTON.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS.

WHEREAS for the better protection of the public footpaths and watercourses of this municipality, it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the council of the municipal district of Brighton, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, &c., any person who shall ride or drive any horse or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any carriage, cart, barrow, or other vehicle upon or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses of the municipal district of Brighton, or who shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds:

Provided that every owner or occupier, or the several owners or occupiers of any gateway, yard, or lane, to which access by horses, beasts, carriages, or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, driving, or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses, who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, as may be necessary for approach and access to any such private gateway, yard, or lane, at the expense of such owner or occupier, or respective owners and occupiers, and under the superintendence of such officer as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.

The owner or occupier of any building or premises who shall cause or suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any such building or premises into or over any public footpath or highway within the said district, and shall continue to allow such water to be discharged or overflow after receiving three days' notice from the duly authorised officer of the council, shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:

Provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building or premises into the public water tables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, or respective owners and occupiers, and under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of Brighton, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

OFFICERS.

On the 6th October, Mr. Bayly was re-appointed town clerk, salary £150 per annum; Wm. Young, Esq., manager Bank of Victoria, was re-appointed treasurer without salary; and Mr. John Burnie was appointed rate compiler and collector, salary £80 per annum.

The salary of the town surveyor was fixed at the rate £250 per annum, but no appointment was made until the 10th February, when Mr. John S. Jenkins was appointed to the office.

The following bye-laws have been passed:—

No. 12. For fixing a rate of One shilling in the pound:

No. 13. To regulate the conducting the elections of members to serve in the municipal council.—Gazetted 22nd March.

No. 14. For rescinding clauses 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of bye-law No. 9, for conducting public meetings and elections, and so forth.—Gazetted 28th January.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Messrs. Gray and Co. have completed their contract for the supply of 400 cubic yards of metal, and have been paid off.

Contracts were taken by various parties for a supply of blue stone metal to the extent of 850 yards, at 10s., and they have all been satisfactorily performed.

Contracts have been entered into with Messrs. Scott and Houghton for the fencing in of the Public Park, and with Messrs. Burrows and Swinton for the erection of entrance gates, and which works are now in progress.

Application to Government was made for the grant of a piece of land as a place for public recreation, and the most eligible piece at their disposal was granted, but from its position was found to be ill adapted for the purpose, upon which application was made for an exchange for a piece of land occupied by the police. This application was at first declined, but the council feeling deeply the importance of obtaining a convenient site, and having failed in their attempt to secure one from Mr. Woodward determined to send a deputation of their chairman and councillor Whitehead to wait on the Commissioner of Land and Works, which resulted in their obtaining the police paddock for the purpose. The Government has also granted the sum of £500 towards the fencing in and improvement of said park; and a further application has been made for a share of the sum granted for such purposes for the present year.

Application has also been made for our proportion of the grant-in-aid of municipalities for 1859, a portion of which has been promised immediately.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDING ON THE 27TH JANUARY, 1859.

THE council have, during the above period, expended the sum of £455 19s. 9d. in the erection of a slaughter-house, which is now in use, and it is hoped that the annual income to be derived from it will compensate the council for the outlay. The council have also expended in other public works the sum of £1981 18s. 2d.

In consequence of no funds having been appropriated by the Government during the past year to the public gardens, the council have been under the necessity of granting the garden committee the sum of £120 in aid of the building of a gardener's lodge, and current expenses.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council, viz.:-

- For closing public ways during formation and repairs.
- For conducting municipal elections by ballot.
- For prohibiting the slaughter of cattle and sheep except at the public slaughter-house.
- For preventing accidents by fire, and regulating water carriers.

A volunteer fire brigade for the purpose of working the engine purchased by the council has been established in connexion with the council, the foreman and assistant foreman being paid by the council and responsible to them for the care of the engine.

At the close of the municipal year, Messrs. Smith, Henty, and Richardson retired from the council by rotation, and Messrs. James Trangmar, James Fethers, and William Corney, were duly elected by ballot to fill the vacant seats at the council table.


