**PENCARROW LIGHTHOUSE.**

**W**ITH reference to the following notice, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 18th November, 1858, p. 156 :—

"Notice to Mariners.—Pencarrow Lighthouse.

"NOTICE is hereby given that on and after the 1st day of January next, a new Light will be exhibited on Pencarrow Head, at the entrance of Port Nicholson (Wellington), Cook's Strait, New Zealand.

"The new Light will be of the second order (catadioptric system) with eclipses at intervals of two minutes; it will be 420 feet above high water mark, and visible in ordinary weather at a distance of 30 English miles.

"The following are the magnetic bearings and distances of the site of the new Lighthouse :—

"From Baring Head, N.W. by N. 3½ miles.

"From Sinclair Head, E. by N. ½ N. 6½ miles.

"From outer rock of Barrett's Reef, S.E. by E. ½ E. 1 mile.

"From Steeple Rock, S.S.E. 2 miles.

"From Cape Campbell, N.N.E. ½ E. 33 miles.

"The Lighthouse is in latitude 41° 22' 0" S., longitude 174° 51' 15" E."

**MURDER.**

**FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSORY.**  
**WHEREAS** on the night of Saturday, the 23rd of last April, a party of Europeans, eight in number, attacked the Chinese encampment at Mosse's Creek, Ovens River, Buckland, in which about sixteen Chinamen resided, and burned down the tents and beat several of the Chinese: And whereas one of the said Chinese named Ah Sang died on the following morning from the effects of the blows inflicted: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds will be paid for such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of each of the persons implicated in the murder above described.

His Excellency the Governor will also extend Her Majesty's Free Pardon to any person implicated in such murder, who will give the required information, provided such person was not the actual murderer.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRIGHTON.

BYE-LAW No. 2\*.—TO ENABLE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BRIGHTON TO IMPOSE A RATE NOT EXCEEDING TWO SHILLINGS IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRIGHTON.

WHEREAS it has become expedient to repeal bye-law No. 2 of the municipal district of Brighton, intituled, "A bye-law for imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound on the rateable property of the municipal district of Brighton for the current year." Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Brighton, that on and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the said bye-law No. 2 of the municipal district of Brighton shall be hereby repealed, and the following shall be substituted in lieu thereof:—

Whereas by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such value: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Brighton, that a rate for the current year of One shilling in the pound on the annual value

of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the said municipal district, be imposed and levied, and be due and payable in equal portions on the first day of July and the first day of September respectively, in the present year 1859.

That the Government would advise the Geelong Corporation to expend a portion of the £10,000 voted them by the Honorable the Legislative Assembly in executing the works required to complete the works in La Trobe terrace.—Refused.

For a proportion of the amount of supplementary aid voted by the honorable the Legislative Assembly to municipalities, £2459 15s.—Granted.

A petition addressed to His Excellency the Governor, praying that an amount may be placed on the Estimates every year for the purpose of rewarding individuals who have been instrumental in saving human life.—Under consideration.

A memorial to His Excellency the Governor and Executive Council, for the chairman to act as a justice of the peace for the territory of the colony of Victoria.—Refused.

A memorial to the Honorable the Legislative Assembly was presented by George Board, Esq., M.L.A., requesting that the scheme for the better supplying the town of Geelong and suburbs with water, as recommended by the select committee appointed by the Honorable the Legislative Assembly, may be supported.

A deputation, consisting of the chairmen and councillor Scott, waited on the Treasurer to ascertain the amount of supplementary aid this council would receive during the present year.

A deputation, consisting of the chairman and councillor Garrett, waited on the Attorney General respecting the decisions of the police magistrate on certain cases brought before him by the town inspector, under the council's bye-laws, the police magistrate having considered such bye-laws illegal.

A conference was held by the chairmen of the South Barwon and Newtown and Chilwell municipalities, with the mayor of Geelong, for the purpose of reducing the present amount paid for licenses by carters, and to establish one uniform system of fees and registration by the three councils.
