DISALLOWANCE OF BILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it is amongst other things enacted, that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now-reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly : And whereas on the fourth day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon : And whereas in a Despatch bearing date the thirteenth day of October, in the year last mentioned, the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has intimated that Her Majesty has been advised to withhold her assent from such Bill : Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare and proclaim that Her Majesty's assent is withheld from the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the session held in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to explain to whom the term " Crown " as used in certain cases shall apply.*

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRIGHTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the householders and landowners at Brighton, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say :—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRIGHTON.—Commencing at the south-western angle of the Brighton special survey; thence northwards by the shores of Port Phillip Bay to the northern boundary of the said special survey; thence east by the northern boundary of the said special survey to a road known as Tucker's road; thence south by the eastern side of Tucker's road to the main road from Melbourne to Frankston; thence by the north-eastern side of the said main road to the southern boundary of the special survey aforesaid; and thence west by the southern boundary of the special survey to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Brighton."

MUNICIPALITY OF DUNOLLY.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRES AND THE DANGER TO LIFE AND PROPERTY ARISING THEREFROM.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule, &c.: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Dunolly, That it shall not hereafter be lawful for any roof or other exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, or any such material to be placed upon or on the outside of any buildings erected or to be erected within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, nor shall it be lawful for any such now in use to be repaired or renewed with a like material, unless such building or erection shall stand and be twenty clear feet apart from any dwelling-house, store, or other building whatsoever.

That no person shall be permitted to keep any stack or stacks of hay, corn, or straw of any description on premises within the said boundaries, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building of which no exterior part shall be of canvas, calico, or any similar fabric, or shall stand twenty clear feet from any dwelling-house or other building whatsoever as aforesaid.

That upon complaint in writing being made by any ratepayer that any chimney or flue is constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials of which the roof or other part of the building or any adjoining building is constructed, or that any such chimney or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke, so that it becomes a nuisance or dangerous to any neighbors, or if it shall appear to the council or their inspector or other authorised officer necessary at any time, he and they shall and may at any reasonable time proceed to inspect such chimney or flue, and if he or they shall find that there is reasonable cause of danger or nuisance, he or they shall forthwith serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of such premises, calling upon him or them to alter such chimney or flue so as to abate and remedy any such danger or nuisance, and it shall not be permitted hereafter for any one to erect any chimney, vent, or flue of any dangerous or inflammable material. And it is further ordered and enacted as aforesaid, that any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law shall be liable and subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for the first offence, and a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds sterling for any second offence or repetition of the same, such penalty or penalties to be recovered and recoverable in the manner provided by the said Act.

MUNICIPALITY OF DUNOLLY.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS, AND PREVENT ANY OBSTRUCTION UPON, OVER, OR ACROSS THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS IN THE MAIN STREET OF DUNOLLY.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district are empowered to pass bye-laws for the general good rule thereof; and whereas it is expedient to regulate and control the erection of shades or awnings over or across the footpaths in the main street or Broadway of Dunolly, and prevent any obstruction upon all footpaths within the municipality of Dunolly, so as to prevent such erections or obstructions becom-

ing public nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Dunolly, That any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade, awning, or other obstruction, over, upon, or across any footpath in the main street or Broadway, Dunolly, without first having obtained in writing the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more of the justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling. And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that every such shade, awning, or obstruction, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof at a distance of twelve feet from the boundary line of said main street or Broadway; and that no plate, rafter, or tie of any such shade or awning, or other obstruction, shall be of a less height above the surface of such footpaths than seven feet in the clear to the under side of such rafter, plate, or tie. And be it further ordered and directed, that it shall be lawful for the said council to direct and require the removal of any shade, awning, or other obstruction erected across, over, and upon any public footpath of the said main street or Broadway of Dunolly, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade, awning, or other obstruction shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor or subsequently thereto. And it shall be further lawful for the said council to give notice to remove any such shade, awning, or other obstruction by means of the surveyor or other officer of such council; and any owner or occupier who shall refuse or neglect to remove any such shade, awning, or other obstruction within forty-eight hours from the time of such notice of removal being given, shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence, refusal, or neglect, a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 10, made by the municipal council of Dunolly, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

No. 5. For the better prevention of fires, and the danger to life and property arising therefrom.

No. 7. For the expenditure of the first moiety of £1000, granted out of the public revenue for the year 1858 to the municipal district of Dunolly.

No. 9. For regulating the mode of voting at the elections of councillors.

No. 10. To regulate the erection of shades or awnings, and prevent any obstruction upon, over or across the public footpaths in the Main street of Dunolly.

ASSESSMENT AND RATES.

The council met on Friday, the 24th September last, for the purpose of hearing and determining any objections to the list of ratepayers, but no objections were made, and the list was confirmed.

A court of petty sessions was held on the 3rd December for hearing appeals, but no parties appeared. The amount of assessment was at the rate of one shilling per pound, and represents a value of £11,984. A voluntary rate of sixpence in the pound, approved at a public meeting of ratepayers, to cover the item of £283 10s., under the head of "Deputation Expenses," &c., is in course of collection.

MISCELLANEOUS.

In reviewing their proceedings for the past half-year, the council consider they have much reason to congratulate the ratepayers upon the extensive public works which have been completed satisfactorily. The plank footpaths and stone kerbing of the Main and Victoria roads have now been tested sufficiently to prove their durability and comfort. The formation of Peel, Eureka, Barkly and Humfray streets, will, it is expected, prove a great boon to the inhabitants, and a strong inducement to those desirous of obtaining permanent locations to make extensive improvements upon the defined lines of survey. It is, however, to be regretted that the factious opposition of another local body should have delayed the council from laying off other equally important lines of communication, which would not only facilitate the passage of traffic, but considerably increase the municipal revenue, for it is apparent (judging from the results shown since the completion of the streets before referred to) that the frontages would be taken possession of speedily, substantial buildings erected, and the assessment, in consequence, materially augmented.

The council, in their last report, had occasion to allude to the dilatoriness of the Government as regards the drainage of the main Geelong road through this municipality. The apathy then complained of had been maintained until very recently, when, after repeated applications and remonstrances, the cutting of the main channel was commenced, but immediately abandoned, owing to the obstructiveness of several mining companies and their representative body.

The consequence was that during the first heavy rainfall the properties of freeholders on the Main road to the amount of several thousand pounds was destroyed in one night.

The chamber of commerce, mining board and municipal council have applied since then for a commission of enquiry to be appointed to report upon the necessity of drainage, and the means to be adopted for that purpose; but no intimation has been received to the effect that this request will be acceded to.

The council had an interview with the Chief Secretary on the occasion of his visit to Ballaarat, and brought under his notice, in detail, the pressing wants of the district. Mr. O'Shanassy promised that those matters under his control should have prompt consideration, and that the attention of the President of the Board of Land and Works should be directed to such grievances as had reference to that department.

Competitive designs having been called for a building to contain Town Hall, Police Court, Mechanics' Institute, Public Library, &c. (the cost of which is estimated at £10,000), the first prize, £100, was awarded to Mr. Christopher Porter, Geelong; and the second, of £50, to Mr. Richard Lambeth, of Melbourne.

The site of the proposed building being occupied at present by two places of worship, belonging respectively to the Wesleyans and Hebrews, the Government have declined to proclaim it until an arrangement for their removal had been entered into with these congregations.

A deputation from the council waited upon the Vice-President of the Board of Land and Works and the Engineer-in-Chief in support of a memorial from the ratepayers, praying for the

establishment of the railway terminus in the Eastern Municipality, when they were informed that although the eligibility of the proposed site was fully appreciated, it was deemed premature to decide upon it at present.

A permanent water supply for the use of the inhabitants has continued to engross much of the council's attention. Several sources have been suggested from time to time, but the only one of these at all feasible was that from the German Swamp. On this the necessary surveys and calculations were made, and it was found that nearly £50,000 would be required to carry out the scheme, and that, when completed, it would possess no advantage over the more inexpensive supply from the Wendouree Swamp. The difficulties which stood in the way of proving our right to the free use of the waters of the Wendouree have at length been removed, and a select committee of the Assembly has sat and taken evidence on the subject. Although it would be premature to anticipate the nature of the committee's report, still the preponderance of evidence in favor of the Eastern Municipality leaves little room to doubt that the report will recommend to the House of Assembly all that we have long contended for.
