MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 42.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE, FOR THE YEAR 1859.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore ordered and enacted, that the assessment on the annual value of property in houses and land within the municipality of Castlemaine, estimated at £82,691, as approved of by the justices of peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which a rate shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 28th January, 1859, and ending the 27th January, 1860.

BYE-LAW No. 43.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and land within this municipal district, one moiety to be collected on and after the 1st day of June, 1859, and the second moiety on and after the 1st day of December, 1859.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 42 and 43, made by the municipal council of Castlemaine, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 27th day of May, 1859, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 20.—FOR EMPOWERING THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRNAMBOOL TO CLOSE ANY STREET, ROAD, RIGHT-OF-WAY, OR FOOTPATH, DURING THE PROGRESS OF ANY WORKS AFFECTING THE SAME.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every municipal council shall have the care and management of the roads, streets, paths, and public thoroughfares: Be it, and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Warrnambool, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, it shall be lawful for the said council, or their duly authorised surveyor, to close up, and stop against public traffic any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or footpath, or any portion of any such thoroughfare, in such manner as to them or him shall seem best, during the progress therein or affecting same, of any works undertaken by the said council, or at their instance, or for the purpose of equalising the use and wear of any such thoroughfare, or any portion thereof: And be it further enacted by the said council, that any person or persons damaging, or removing any barrier of whatever kind, or any notice placed for the above purpose, or in any way making use of any such thoroughfare so closed or stopped up until the same shall have been re-opened by the council for public traffic, shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 21.—TO REGULATE AND FIX THE RATES OF TOLLS AND DUES TO BE TAKEN FOR WEIGHING AT THE WEIGHBRIDGE, MARKET SQUARE.

In accordance with the Municipal Act, section 26, it is expedient and necessary to fix by bye-law the rates of tolls and dues to be taken at the weighbridge erected by the municipal council of Warrnambool, on the Market square: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the said municipal council, that from and after the date of this bye law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, the following tolls and dues shall and may be levied for weighing at the aforesaid weighbridge.
