## NOTICE TO WHOLESALE DEALERS IN WINE, SPIRITS, OR FERMENTED MALT LIQUORS, AND BREWERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons dealing as above, in quantities of not less than two gallons, upon which the duty has been paid, unless registered in accordance with the Acts 13 Victoria No. 26, and 20 Victoria No. 4, are liable to a fine of £30.

Certificates of Registration will be granted by the clerk of the bench at the place nearest to the residence of such dealer at which a Court of Petty Sessions is established, within a district duly proclaimed under the Act, or at the office of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at the Immigration office, King street; and any person who shall not have duly paid the legal fees of registration into the Treasury, or to a receiver of revenue, will be deemed or taken to be a person not registered within the meaning of the Act.

## NOTICE TO ROAD CONTRACTORS.

FURTHER REGULATIONS PASSED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

THE Board of Land and Works orders that from and after the 1st July next, contractors tendering for works under the Department of Roads and Bridges be required to attend the opening of the tenders in the Board-room, at the Crown Lands Office, either personally or by an authorised agent.

Immediately upon the conditional acceptance of a tender by the Board, the accepted tenderer or his agent shall pay in cash a preliminary deposit of £10 when the amount of the contract is under £1000; or £25 when the amount of the contract exceeds £1000; such sum to be absolutely forfeited in the event of his not entering into the requisite contract agreement within one week.

Contractors will also be required to make such alterations in the schedules to their tenders (not affecting the bulked sum in the body thereof) as may be necessary to bring them into conformity with the specification and general conditions of the contract, and as may be required by the Inspector-General of Roads, failing which such deposit to be in like manner forfeited.

A letter, embodying the abovenamed condition, to be signed by the contractor when paying the amount of the deposit.

## NOTICE TO POUNDKEEPERS.

IT is pointed out for the guidance of Poundkeepers that no claim preferred by persons impounding cattle for damages in excess of the gazetted rates allowed by the Governor can be legally received or entertained by the poundkeeper.

Persons impounding cattle who claim damages in excess of the gazetted rates are to be informed that, under the 32 clause of the Impounding Act, they must elect either to claim the authorised rates only, or to sue the owner of the cattle by which the trespass has been committed for the special damage claimed.

## POSTAGE STAMPS.

EVERY Officer in the department of the Attorney General, in the receipt of postage stamps, is expected to keep an account of them in the following form, namely:—

In like manner the officer taking charge is to satisfy himself that the balance he receives agrees in all respects with that appearing in the account; and, should any discrepancies be afterwards discovered, he will be held responsible.

The officer retiring and his successor should go through the account together, and certify conjointly to its correctness.

All requisitions for postage stamps must be transmitted to these offices for approval, and should show the balance in hand on a certain day.

## RULE AND ORDER PASSED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS FOR THE PRESERVATION OF FOOTPATHS.

IT is ordered by the Board of Land and Works, under the powers conferred upon them by 17 Victoria No. 29, c. 15, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to drive any cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or to ride or drive, or permit to be driven, any animal upon or along any formed footpath, or in or across any side drain, or to cross any footpath, except for the purpose of access to any side road, or to private property.

Persons infringing or violating the above rule and order will render themselves liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

**PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.**  
DAYLESFORD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty-one householders at Daylesford, in the county of Talbot, praying for the erection of the said township into a municipal district.

The petitioners state, that they are all householders resident in and around the township of Daylesford, and within the district hereinafter described:

That such district contains a large quantity of land under cultivation, and that extensive mining operations of a permanent character are being carried on therein and in the neighborhood:

That at a public meeting, held on the 18th of May, 1859, a resolution was carried unanimously, that the establishment of a municipal council would be beneficial to the township and district in general:

That they are of opinion that the district hereinafter described should be created a municipality, its area containing a population of more than 300 householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point, with the following boundaries, viz.:-

Beginning at the north-east corner of allotment 9, section 7, parish of Glenlyon; from thence west 77 chains to a creek unnamed; from thence along the said creek south to the north-west corner of allotment 1, section 7, parish of Wombat; from thence south 39 chains; from thence west 56 chains; from thence south 40 chains; from thence due west 175½ chains; from thence due south 248 chains; from thence east 128 chains; from thence north 86½ chains, east 25½ chains, north 55½ chains, east 76 chains, north 23½ chains, west 4 chains, north 70 chains, east 27 chains, north 39½ chains, east 14 chains, and north 97 chains, to the commencing point aforesaid.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"And your petitioners therefore pray that the said district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality under the name of 'The Municipal District of Daylesford,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15."

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**  
No. 1.—SMITH WARD, MELBOURNE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by One thousand and three householders in the ward of the city of Melbourne called Smith Ward, praying for the erection of the said ward into a municipal district under the said Act.

The petitioners recite the 1st and 2nd sections of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, and state that they are in number One thousand and three, all resident within the district called Smith Ward, and request that the substance and prayer of their petition may be published as directed by the said Act, in order that in due time, if no sufficient cause is shown to the contrary, the district hereinafter described and named may be proclaimed a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

Smith Ward, bounded on the south by a line running east along the centre of Victoria street from its intersection with Elizabeth street to its intersection with Nicholson street; thence by a line running north along the centre of Nicholson street to its intersection with the north side of Reilly street; thence by a line running east along the said north side of Reilly street to its intersection with the centre of Smith street; thence by a line running north along the said centre of Smith street to its intersection with the southern side of the Heidelberg road; thence by a line running easterly along the said southern side of the said road to its junction with the west side of the Merri Creek; thence by a line running up the said creek to its intersection with the south boundary line of the Brunswick municipality; thence west along the said boundary line to its intersection with the east side of the Sydney road; thence by a line running southerly along the east side of the Sydney road to its junction with the north end of the Madeline street extension; thence by a line running west at right angles to east (crossing the Sydney road) to its intersection with the west side of the Sydney road; thence by a line running southerly along the said west side of the Sydney road to its junction with the northern side of the Flemington road; thence by a line running south-easterly along the centre of Elizabeth street to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to take the premises into your gracious consideration, and cause the advertisement of the substance and prayer of this petition to be made in the *Government Gazette*, as required by statute, and in due time thereafter, if there be no counter petition signed by a greater majority (*sic*) of householders of Smith Ward and delivered, then, in pursuance of the aforesaid statute, to proclaim the locality presently known as and called Smith Ward to be a municipal district, to be known by the name and style of the 'Barkly Municipality,' or such other name as your Excellency shall adopt, all within

the meaning of the said statute, or to do, order and proclaim otherwise in the premises as it may seem meet to your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council."

That the position of the contiguous municipality of Fitz Roy, which is situated immediately south of their locality, and lies between them and the city, is such that they are anxious to be embraced within it, and the council of the said municipality has expressed its willingness to accede to their desire, and to make all the necessary improvements without delay.
