THE METCALFE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Talbot and Dalhousie, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 22, parish of Langley, in the county of Dalhousie; thence due west by the south boundaries of allotments 22 and 17 and northern boundaries of allotments 9 and 8 in the parish of Langley; thence due west by the northern boundary of the parish of Edgcombe to a point on the northern boundary of allotment 47 of the said parish which is intersected by the east side of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander, and Murray River Railway; thence northward by the said side of the railway until it cuts the west boundary of the parish of Elphinstone, in the county of Talbot; thence northwards by the western boundary of the parish of Elphinstone to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence north-westerly by the western boundary of a road which runs through the parish of Paraday, forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 11, 12, 13, 14, 16 of section III. of the said parish; thence north-easterly by the southern boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3 of section V. of the parish of Paraday; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 23, 22, 21, 18, section III. of the parish of Sutton Grange, to the centre of the Myrtle Creek; thence north-easterly by the centre line of the Myrtle Creek to its junction with the Coliban River; thence northwards by the centre line of the Coliban River to its junction with the River Campaspe; thence southwards by the centre line of the Campaspe River to its junction with Piper's Creek; thence southward by the centre line of Piper's Creek home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Metcalfe Road District."

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Hawthorn.

REPORT OF PRELIMINARY PROCEEDINGS, ACCORDING TO 18 VICTORIA No. 15.

On Wednesday, 1st August, 1860, in pursuance of advertisements in the *Government Gazette*, the *Argus* Melbourne newspaper, and *The Emerald Hill and Sandridge Post*, a public meeting of the resident householders and of the landowners within this district was held at the All Nations' Assembly Room, Nott street, at the hour of Ten o'clock of the forenoon, for the purpose of deciding the several matters set forth in the 10th clause of 18 Victoria No. 15. Andrew Plummer, Esq., J.P., of Bay street, Sandridge, presided at this meeting, having been appointed as chairman by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

The chairman commenced the proceedings by reading the advertisement calling the meeting and the 10th and 12th clauses of the Municipal Institutions' Act.

It was moved by Mr. Leigh, seconded by Mr. Sangster, That Mr. John Murphy act as assessor. This motion was carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. W. H. Gresham, seconded by Mr. J. G. Newman, That Mr. Henry George Slade Hammond act as assessor. This motion was carried by a majority of 11, there being 29 hands held up for and 18 against.

Messrs. Murphy and Hammond consented to act as assessors, and took their places accordingly.

It was moved by Mr. Wm. Bartholomew, seconded by Mr. Jas. Garton, That the council for the district consist of seven members.

Mr. W. H. Gresham brought forward an amendment, That the council for the district consist of five members.

This was not seconded, and the motion was put to the meeting and carried, no hands being held up against it.

It was moved by Mr. Jas. Garton, seconded by Mr. Wm. Bartholomew, That the members of the council for the district shall not receive any pecuniary remuneration.

This was carried unanimously.

The chairman and assessors declared the show of hands to be in favor of John Murphy, David Thomas, William Morley, Andrew Plummer, Thomas Swallow, Thos. Lloyd Pemberton, and George Hall.

The chairman then conferred with the assessors, and they mutually agreed to decide the election by a poll. The barriers placed to keep the people from the voting table were broken down, rendering it necessary to remove the table from where it was then standing to a raised platform behind; then

the police were overpowered, and were altogether unable to stop the crowd who rushed forward on to the platform, surrounded the voting table, and rendered it impossible to take any more votes. Many persons out of the crowd had to leap down from a door at the back of the platform to escape the crush, and a scene of general hubbub, confusion, and violence prevailed. The chairman and assessors, in consequence of the violent proceedings, were compelled to remove the box containing the recorded votes, and all other papers and books connected with the election, to the chairman's house. Before leaving, the chairman declared the meeting adjourned until Eight o'clock of the following morning. The chairman, with Mr. John Murphy, assessor, and Mr. Edward Clark, poll clerk, next proceeded to confer with the Honorable the Attorney General with regard to the difficult and unexampled state of the proceedings. The Attorney General advised that the chairman should announce the poll as it then stood as final and conclusive. Acting on this advice, the chairman and assessors proceeded to meet the householders and landowners at the hour of Eight a.m., on Friday, 3rd instant, at the All Nations Assembly Room, No. 1 street, when the poll was made up in the presence of the people then and there assembled. On Monday, the 9th of July, the council, as newly constituted, met and elected Alexander Mackenzie, Esq., chairman for the municipal year 1860-61. At this meeting the resignation of W. G. McKellar, Esq., as councillor, was received, and the usual steps have been taken to fill the vacancy on the 3rd August.

The finance committee, consisting of councillors Thorne, Matthews, and Herd, met fourteen times.

A committee for naming the streets met several times, and brought up a report, which, with some few alterations, has been adopted.

Communication has been had with the town council of Geelong, and the municipality of Newtown and Chilwell, on the question of the heavy dray license levied by the former body, and it is hoped that the subject is in a fair way of being favorably arranged.

Petitions have been adopted and presented to the Honorable the Legislative Assembly, by A. Thomson, Esq., asking for the permanent endowment of municipalities; and also for a more extended trial of endeavoring to procure supplies of water by means of artesian wells.

A petition to His Excellency the Governor is in course of signature, to have the river boundary extended from the banks to the middle of the river Barwon.

A suggestion was made to Government to make trial of tan or bark to preserve the floor of the Barwon Bridge; the Government declined, having made a trial on a similar bridge without advantage.

The traffic on the four roads interested in the toll has been taken, in order to expend the same in accordance with the by-law.

A statement of the gross receipts and expenditure of the toll fund, from the commencement of the collection to the 20th July, 1860, is appended, in addition to the general balance sheet.

The council have to express their extreme regret that their exertions to have the tolls supplemented by Government have not met with success.

Contracts are in progress on the Colac, Valley, Roslyn, German-town, and Mount Colite roads; also at Marshalltown, and for the new bridge at Germantown. Metal is being quarried and broken, and laborers have been employed repairing various roads in the district.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following works have been constructed during the last six months, viz:—

Roadworks.

Giffard street from the Esplanade to Electra street, thence along Electra street to Parker street, and down Parker street as far as Cecil street, to join road already metalled.

Melbourne road, from Ferguson street to John street.

Pathworks.

Twyford street, south side, from Gifford street to Morris street.

Cole street, west side, from Osborne street to Twyford street. Giffard street, from the railway crossing to the entrance to the public garden.

Hotham street, north side.

College street, east side.

Thomas street, south side, from Douglas parade to the Strand. Yarra street, south side, from Douglas parade to the west end of Mr. Ruffe's paddock, and on the north side from opposite that point to the Melbourne road.

Cole street, both sides, from Hammer street, over the railway bridge, to Osborne street.

Making the total length of roadway now formed, pitched, and metalled, six and three-quarters miles and two and a-half chains; and the total length of pathways nineteen and a-half miles.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council and received the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

No. 30. "For regulating bathing on or near the shores of Port Phillip and Hobson's Bays, in the district of Williams-

town, and for the conservation of public decency." Gazetted 15th May, 1860.

No. 44. "To regulate the landing of goods on the Stevedore street wharf, and to protect the wharf from being damaged." Gazetted 20th December, 1859."

FINANCE.

The sixth half-yearly instalment of £500, in part repayment of the £5000 loan, was duly paid to the English, Scottish, and Australian Chartered Bank, on the 6th of March.

The balance of the Government grant-in-aid for the year ending the 30th April, 1860, amounting to £906 19s. 11d., has been received.

PUBLIC PARK.

After repeated applications to Government, both by letters and deputations, the council has succeeded in obtaining a grant of land for a public park, containing about sixty-five acres. It is situated on the west side of the railway, between the North Williamstown Station and the Geelong line, and encircles the cemetery.

CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL.

At the first meeting of the council, after the general election, councillor John Kennedy Freyer was unanimously elected chairman of the council for the current municipal year.

SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.

NINTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT.

REPORT of the proceedings of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst, for the half-year ending 10th July, 1860:—

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works completed during the past half-year, or now in progress, are the formation of portions of Violet street, Barnard street, Thistle street, Pantom street, Beech street, Lucan street, Myers street, Honeyuckle street, &c.; kerbing and channelling in McIvor road and Vine street; flagging footpath in View place, planting Pall Mall, cutting drains, clearing stumps in several streets, providing new iron lamp, pillars and fittings for gas, contributions towards the construction and maintenance of sludge channel, with many other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works at a cost of £2246 18s. The want of funds has prevented a further outlay.

The expenditure for lighting, sweeping, and for prevention of fires, has amounted to £1021 2s. 9d. in the half-year.

BYE-LAWS.

No. 23, for suppression of nuisances, passed last half-year, has been twice amended to suit the views of the Government, but has not yet been assented to.

No. 24, for suppression of bell-ringing nuisance, has been passed and assented to.

FINANCE.

The debt owing to the bank at the commencement of the year has been paid, and the council have now a balance in their favor of £975 16s. 11d.

The sum of £5262 has been received on account of the Government grant. Of the rate struck for 1859, and in arrears, the sum of £5580 18s. 11d. has now been collected. The assessment has been revised, and a rate for the current year will be struck immediately.

In consequence of the increased labor, the salary of the market inspector and his assistants has been increased at the rate of £150 per annum.

ELECTIONS.

At the annual election on the 11th January, councillors Burrowes, Symonds, and O'Keefe, were elected, in the place of councillors retired—Messrs. Cahill, Carpenter, and Harris; and councillor Abbott was elected chairman of the council for the current year.

In February, councillor Boyd was elected in the place of Mr. McIntyre, resigned, and councillor Casey in the place of Mr. Simons, resigned.

MISCELLANEOUS.

In consequence of an intimation from the Government, that sufficient money was not in hand to complete the sludge channel, partly constructed, and maintain the existing one, until the completion of the new one, and that one or other work must be stopped, it was found necessary to send a deputation, consisting of the chairman, councillor Casey, and the town clerk, to wait upon the Government. They succeeded in obtaining the completion of the channel, having, however, to give a pledge in return—that the council would undertake, as soon as the necessary power was granted by the Legislature, to maintain the channel by funds derived from local assessment, provided that the Mining Board decline to do so.

In support of a petition, praying the Government to take comprehensive measures to secure proper water supplies for the gold fields, &c., the chairman, in company with representatives from other districts, waited upon the Executive, the council regret to say, though, without success.

Many other applications have been made to the Government in furtherance of the interests of the town. To induce the settlement of the endowment question, and the requisite amendments of the Municipal Institutions Acts, the council have initiated another municipal conference, which will shortly be held; the conference to have the requisite bill prepared and brought before the Legislature.

Steps have been taken to plant trees in the centre of the town, and also to bring the botanical garden reserve into use.

The council having complied with all the conditions of the Government, hope now that the cattle market will be immediately proclaimed, and the council empowered to put it in operation.
