WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the acting Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the third day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the limits of the Ballaarat Circuit Court district were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the limits thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, alter the limits of the said Ballaarat Circuit Court District, and doth hereby appoint that the limits of such district shall be the limits hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

THE BALLAARAT CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT:—Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek, in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that creek southerly to its junction with Baillie's Creek; thence by Baillie's Creek northerly and easterly to the township of Carngnam; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of Williamson's Creek with the River Yarrowee; thence by a line easterly to the junction of the Lal-lal rivulet with the Moorabool River; thence by the Moorabool River to its source; thence by the Main Dividing Range to the range between the Bullarook Creek and Joyce's Creek; thence by that range and a line westerly to the junction of the Dry Creek with the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek to its source; thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Emu Creek, being the point of commencement aforesaid.

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary, and to direct that Circuit Courts should be holden at such towns or places within those limits as he should with the advice aforesaid think fit to appoint: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a Circuit Court shall be holden at the town of Ararat within and for the district hereinafter described, to be called "The Ararat Circuit Court District," and doth define the limits of such district in manner following, that is to say:—

THE ARARAT CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT:—Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek; thence by that creek to the southern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that county to the River Glenelg; thence by that river and a line north to Norton Creek; thence by Norton Creek and the River Wimmera to the southern shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by a line easterly to the River Avoca; and thence by that river and the Dividing Range to the commencing point.

And with the advice aforesaid doth further direct and appoint that the first Circuit Court within and for the said Ararat Circuit Court District shall be holden at the said town of Ararat on Monday, the twenty-ninth day of October, in the present year.

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

POSTPONEMENT OF THE NEXT GENERAL SESSIONS AT CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such Courts should be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Court of General Sessions for the district of Sandhurst was postponed as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions of and for the districts of Castlemaine and Sandhurst, respectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby postpone the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions in and for the districts of Castlemaine and Sandhurst aforesaid, during the year 1860, in manner following, that is to say:

The Court of General Sessions for Castlemaine, from the 27th day of August instant until such date in lieu thereof as may be hereafter appointed.

The Court of General Sessions for Sandhurst, from the 30th day of August instant, to Monday, the 10th day of September now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

THE PENAL HULKS "PRESIDENT" AND "LYSANDER" DISCONTINUED AS PRISONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant-Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, the penal hulk called the *President* was declared to be a public prison for the reception and safe keeping of prisoners: And whereas by another Proclamation under the hand of the said Lieutenant-Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the penal hulk called the *Lysander* was also declared to be a public prison for the reception and safe keeping of prisoners: And whereas by divers Proclamations subsequently made, the positions of the said penal hulks, and the boundaries around the same within which no person should come, have been from time to time altered: And whereas it is deemed expedient to discontinue the use of the said hulks for the reception and safe keeping of prisoners: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said two firstmentioned Proclamations, and so much of any other Proclamation as relates to the said hulks called respectively the *President* and *Lysander*, and I do hereby declare that the said vessels shall cease to be used as public prisons for the reception and safe keeping of prisoners.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

It was moved by Mr. Thomas Brooks, seconded by Mr. Dougall McDougall, That the members of the council for the district shall not receive any pecuniary remuneration. This was carried unanimously.

ACCOUNTS FOR MEDICAL ATTENDANCE.

THE following information is published with a view to facilitate the payment of medical practitioners' claims for incidental attendance on cases in watch-houses at the request of the police, examination of lunatics, &c.

Accounts should in all cases be made out on the proper form (L. 2), signed by the claimant and the officer at whose request the attendance was given, and forwarded to the Chief Medical Officer, Melbourne.

The fullest particulars of the service rendered should in every case be given on the face of the account, as the name of the prisoner or person attended, the nature of the disease or injury the place where the attendance was given, the distance from the medical man's abode, and the time of attendance, whether day or night, in the latter case stating the hour.

Accounts should be rendered as early as possible after the service is given, and as all accounts not marked payable at some particular pay office will be made payable in Melbourne, it is important that the claimant should state on the face of the account where he wishes the same to be paid.

All charges are to be in accordance with the following scale of fees, viz:—

For medical or surgical attendance, inclusive of all necessary medicines, within any city or township, 10s. 6d. per visit. At night, double this fee.

Travelling expenses 10s. 6d. per mile for each mile after the first.

For minor surgical operations, £2 2s.

The scale of payment for capital operations to be submitted to the Chief Medical Officer.

For examination of insane persons, and giving the necessary evidence and certificates, One guinea for each case; mileage at 2s. per mile.

EXTRACT FROM THE MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD HELD ON THE 25TH FEBRUARY, 1859.

Resolved, 1st, That whereas the funds placed at the disposal of the Commissioners of National Education for 1859 are insufficient to meet the expenses of the schools now under the Board, the commissioners have resolved that it would be inexpedient to continue the training establishment beyond the present term.

2nd, That Mr. Davitt be informed of this resolution of the commissioners, and that the commissioners will not need his and Mrs. Davitt's services after the 31st March, 1859.

3rd, That the option be afforded to Mr. and Mrs. Davitt of continuing for twelve months certain, from the 31st of March next, as head master and mistress of the model schools, on salaries of Five hundred pounds and Three hundred pounds per annum respectively, the engagement then absolutely to cease; or of terminating their engagement with the Board on the expiry of the present term (viz., on the 31st March next), in which latter case the commissioners will allow, by way of bonus, the sum of Five hundred pounds, the same being one half-year's salary at the present rate, and to be accepted as a full discharge, in full of all claims on the Board.
