### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

#### SWAN SPIT LIGHT.

IN accordance with a notice issued from this office, dated 7th February, 1860:

Masters of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the West Channel are hereby informed that on and after the 1st day of October next, from sunset to sunrise, a *Fixed Red Light* will be exhibited from a new lighthouse built on Swan Spit upon piles, and the lightship now moored there removed.

The Swan Spit Lighthouse is situated on the S.W. end of the spit, in fifteen (15) feet at low water, two hundred and fifty (250) fathoms off shore, with the following bearings:-

Upper Light, Shortland's Bluff, S. 56 W.
Royal George Perch Buoy, S. 37 W.
Fairway Beacon, on Swan Island, N. 69 W.

There are two small sand knolls outside of the lighthouse, with not more than twelve (12) feet of water over them, bearing respectively from the lighthouse E.N.E. and S.E. by E., distant forty (40) fathoms.

Vessels must not approach the lighthouse nearer than sixty (60) fathoms, outside of which distance there is a clear channel of one-third of a mile, with three, four, and five fathoms water. A gong will be sounded every ten (10) minutes during thick and foggy weather.  
**Caution.**—All persons in charge of vessels passing this lighthouse are cautioned against running foul of it, and are reminded that clause VII. of 16 Victoria No. 12 provides for the infliction of a heavy penalty for any injury done to lights, beacons, or sea-marks.

**WEST CHANNEL LIGHTSHIP.**

Notice is hereby given that on or about the 3rd of October next, the West Channel Lightship will be removed to Hobson's Bay for repairs, and her place temporarily occupied by the Swan Spit Lightship, which vessel will exhibit two Fixed White Lights similar to those now shown on board the West Channel Lightship.

**CHEQUERED BUOY ON WHITE STAR KNOLL, NEAR THE WEST CHANNEL LIGHTSHIP.**

The depth of water over the White Star Knoll having increased to sixteen (16) feet, the chequered buoy hitherto moored there will on the 1st of October next be removed. Vessels of heavy draught passing to the eastward of the lightship are cautioned not to approach within a cable's length.

**ROCKY PATCH OFF THE LITTLE RIVER.**

A sunken beacon, surmounted with a red ball fourteen feet high, has been placed in nine (9) feet water upon the southern end of a rocky patch situated between Point Wilson and the Halfway Trees, about a mile off shore, with the following bearings:—

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**  
CLUNES.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-nine householders of the township of Clunes, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that mining operations of an extensive and permanent character are now being carried on in the township by large companies, involving a great outlay of capital and employing a large population, and that the most efficient quartz crushing works in the colony are located there.

That the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable cost.

That there is also much land under cultivation in the immediate neighborhood.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense.

That the creation of the district into a municipality will tend greatly to advance its interests, and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest the following municipal area, viz. — Commencing at a point 120 chains south of the south-east corner of the post office reserve, by a line running west 120 chains; thence north 240 chains; thence east 240 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence west 120 chains to the commencing point; such area containing a population of more than three hundred householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly beseech your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Clunes,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

**MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.**

**BYE-LAW No. 46.—TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 7TH APRIL, 1861.**

**W**HEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and, the Legislative Council thereof, 19 Victoria No. 16, intitled, *An Act to amend an Act intitled an Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is thereby enacted that no toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district, save by bye-law, subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Williamstown, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling in the pound shall be, and be taken to be, the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and in lands within the limits of the municipal district of Williamstown, for the current year ending the 7th April, 1861, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the municipal council for the district of Williamstown, as required by the provisions of the 18th Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

**THE HAMPDEN AND HEYTESBURY ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the boundaries of "The Hampden and Heytesbury Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to vary and alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Hampden and Heytesbury road district shall be and comprise so much of the counties of Grenville, Hampden, and Heytesbury as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Situate in the counties of Grenville, Hampden, and Heytesbury, and bounded as follows, namely: Commencing at a point

in the centre of Emu Creek due north of the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden, and being bounded on the north by the centre line of the said creek bearing westerly to a point one and a half miles, or thereabouts, west of the junction of the Broken Creek, and thence being bounded on the west by the centre line of the said Emu Creek bearing southerly to the south-east bend of the said creek nearly due west of Mount Emu; thence southerly to the centre of Curdie's Creek, and thence by the centre of Curdie's Creek to the sea-coast; thence on the south by the coast line trending south-easterly to the Gellibrand River; thence by the Gellibrand River and the east boundary of the county of Heytesbury, bearing south-easterly, north-easterly, and north, to the south-west angle of section xv. of the parish of Pirron Yaloack, in the county of Polworth; thence further northerly by the east shore of the Tirrangower Morass and the centre of the Pirron Yaloack Creek to the Lake Corangamite; and thence further north by the western shores of the Lake Corangamite and the Gnarket Ponds to the crossing of the Gnarket Ponds by the Geelong and Cressy road through Foxbow; thence easterly by the north side of the last named road to its intersection with the centre line of the Woody Yaloack; thence further northerly by the centre line of the Woody Yaloack Creek to the south side of the Upper Western or Portland road; thence north-west along the said road to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; and thence by the said boundary to the commencing point.

**THE MOUNT ROUSE ROAD DISTRICT.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Villiers and Normanby, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say: Commencing at Mount Napier, in the county of Normanby; thence by a portion of the northern boundary of Henry Phillips's run, known as the Mount Napier station, to John Toomey's run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the eastern boundary of the county of Normanby; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Normanby to the county of Dundas; thence by the north-western, northern, and eastern boundaries of the county of Villiers to a point where the centre of the Belfast and Ararat road is cut by the county boundary in the township of Chatsworth; thence southwards by the centre of the Belfast and Ararat road to the northern boundary of the township of Caranutt; thence by the northern and western boundaries of the township of Caranutt to the centre of Muston's Creek; thence by the centre of Muston's Creek to a point in a direct line with the southern boundaries of the parishes of Purdeet and Yatmerone, in the county of Villiers; thence by a direct line to the south-east angle of the parish of Purdeet; thence by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Purdeet and Yatmerone to the south-west angle of the parish of Yatmerone; thence in a direct line to the south-east angle of section B4, parish of Napier, in the county of Normanby; thence by the southern boundaries of sections B4, B5, and B6, and the southern boundary of Phillips's pre-emptive right to the south-west angle of Phillips's pre-emptive right; thence in a direct line home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Mount Rouse Road District."

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Ripon and Grenville, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at a point about three and a half miles north of the south-west angle of the Buninyong Racecourse, county of Grenville; thence southerly to the Little Woody Yaloak Creek; thence by the centre line of the Little Woody Yaloak Creek to its junction with the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence northerly by the centre line of the Woody Yaloak Creek to the south side of the Upper Western or Portland road; thence north-west along the said road to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the said boundary to the centre of the Emu Creek; thence by the centre of the Emu Creek to its junction with Spring Hill Creek; thence by a line easterly to Lake Burrumbeet, near the source of Bailie's Creek; thence by the shores of that lake to the mouth of the Burrumbeet Creek; thence by a line bearing south-easterly home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Smythesdale Road District."

Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Fryers, and bounded on the west, north, east, and south, by the western, northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the said parish.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Fryers Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
