# PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to proclaim, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, the roads in the said colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act. Now therefore, I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the road hereinafter described shall be and be deemed a Main Road under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MELBOURNE AND BALLAARAT ROAD:—Commencing at the Junction Inn, on the Mount Alexander road, about one mile north-west of Keilor, in the county of Bourke; thence in a westerly direction to the Kororoit Creek; thence in a westerly direction via Melton and crossing the Djerriwarh Creek to Bacchus Marsh; thence in a westerly direction via Ballan, county of Grant, to Ballaarat, in the county of Grenville.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

# SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, AT JAMIESON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the township hereinafter defined to be a town for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore, I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the township hereinafter named and defined shall be a town wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

JAMIESON TOWNSHIP RESERVE.—Commencing at a point on the east boundary bearing due east one mile from the junction of the Jamieson with the Goulburn River; bounded on part of the east by a line bearing north one mile; on the north by a line bearing west two miles crossing the Goulburn River; on the west by a line bearing south two miles; on the south by a line bearing east two miles again crossing the Goulburn River; and on the remainder of the east by a line bearing north one mile to the point of commencement.

## THE HEIDELBERG ROAD DISTRICT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in conformity with the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales*, trustees were appointed for a road known as the parish road leading from the suburban allotments in the parish of Jika-jika, near Melbourne, to the village reserve in the parish of Nillumbik, River Plenty: And whereas by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, in the sixteenth year of the same reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, the said Act of the fourth year of Her Majesty's reign was repealed, and it was amongst other things provided that the trustees of any parish road duly elected under the provisions of the said repealed Act should be and be deemed the district road board for the locality through which such parish road may pass, extending three miles on either side thereof, and should continue in office and exercise all the powers of a district road board under the provisions of the now reciting Act until a road district should have been proclaimed and a district road board appointed under the provisions thereof in or for the said locality or some part thereof: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim the locality through which the said parish road passes to be a road district: Now therefore, I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in me vested by the Act secondly above mentioned, declare that the portion of the county of Bourke hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the point where the Heidelberg road crosses the bridge over the Merri Creek; bounded on the south by the Lunatic Asylum reserve; on the east by the River Yarra to its junction with the River Plenty; thence by the River Plenty to a point where it is intersected by the north boundary of section No. 8, parish of Keelbundora; on the north by the north boundary line of sections Nos. 8 and 9, said parish, to the western boundary of said section No. 9; thence on the west by the western boundary line of same section, running south to the southern boundary of said section, and thence by a line due west to the Darebin Creek; thence by the Darebin Creek to a point where it is intersected by the southern boundary line of section 122, parish of Jika-jika; thence by a line due west along the southern boundary of said section 122 to a point where it is intersected by the western boundary line of section or portion of 113, said parish of Jika-jika; thence by a line running south along the western boundary of section or portion 113 of said parish to where it is intersected by the southern boundary line

of section or portion 88 of last-named parish; thence by a line due west along the said southern boundary for a distance of forty chains; and thence by a straight line running south-easterly home to the starting point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Heidelberg Road District."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore, I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Talbot hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-east corner of the parish of Muckleford; thence due west by the northern boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence due west to a point in the eastern boundary of block 6, section 1 A, parish of Maldon; thence due north to the north-east angle of the said block; thence to the north-west angle of the said block; thence due south to the south-west angle of block 7, section 11 A, of the said parish; thence due west by the northern boundary of the parish of Tarragower to a point in the centre of the Loddon River; thence southerly by the centre line of Loddon River to its junction with the Loddon or Joyce's Creek; thence southerly by the centre line of the Loddon or Joyce's to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Franklin; thence due north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Franklin and Yandoit to the north-west angle of the parish of Yandoit; thence due east by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Strangways and Guildford to the south-east angle of the parish of Guildford; thence due north by the eastern boundary of the said parish to the north-east angle of the said parish; thence due west by the northern boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Muckleford; thence due north by the eastern boundary of the parish of Muckleford home to the starting point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Newstead Road District."

The number of volumes is 730, inclusive of 130 duplicate volumes lent by the trustees of the Melbourne Public Library; and of the former number 355 volumes have been purchased by the council, 139 are on loan from various gentlemen in the locality, and 106 have been generously given by individuals who are anxious for the success of this movement. The average attendance of readers to the present time (20th September) amounts to 198 per week, principally young men; and the reading room in the Mechanics' Institute is open during the day from Ten to Four, and from Six to Ten o'clock in the evenings.
