NOTICE TO WHOLESALE DEALERS IN WINE, SPIRITS, OR FERMENTED MALT LIQUORS, AND BREWERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons dealing as above, in quantities of not less than two gallons, upon which the duty has been paid, unless registered in accordance with the Acts 13 Victoria No. 26 and 20 Victoria No. 4, are liable to a fine of £30.

Certificates of Registration will be granted by the clerk of the bench at the place nearest to the residence of such dealer at which a Court of Petty Sessions is established, within a district duly proclaimed, under the Act, or at the office of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at the Immigration Office, King street; and any person who shall not have duly paid the legal fees of registration into the Treasury, or to a receiver of revenue, will be deemed or taken to be a person not registered within the meaning of the Act.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO FLEMINGTON AND THE VICINITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the district, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., that is to say:—

THE DISTRICT OF FLEMINGTON (INCLUDING ESSENDON, HAWSTEAD, AND KENSINGTON).—Commencing at a point on the Moonee Moonee Ponds intersected by the southern boundary of section 15, in the parish of Dousta Galla; thence west to the south-western angle of the said section 15; thence south to the south-western angle of portion D of section 6, in the said parish of Dousta Galla; thence west to the Saltwater River; thence southwards by the said river and the north-eastern boundary of the municipal district of Footscray to the north-eastern angle of the town reserve of Footscray; thence east to the western boundary of the municipal district of Hotham; and thence northwards by the said western boundary of the municipal district of Hotham, and by the Moonee Moonee Ponds to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

HEATHCOTE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

PETITION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-two householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote, including the chairman and councillors thereof.

The petitioners state they are all householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote.

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—FOR PROHIBITING THE KEEPING OF SWINE WITHIN CERTAIN BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN, AND FOR REGULATING THE KEEPING OF SWINE WITHIN CERTAIN BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, &c.: And whereas great nuisances do and may arise from the keeping of swine in populated places, whereby the public health may be endangered: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Ararat, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to breed or keep any kind of living swine in such portion of the town of Ararat as shall be included within the boundaries to be hereinafter set forth, and any person who shall so offend shall forfeit and pay on conviction thereof any penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And be it further enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any person to breed or keep any kind of living swine within that portion of the town of Ararat bounded on the east by Vincent street, on the north by a line parallel with but five chains north of High street, on the west by a line parallel with View Point street two and a half chains to the west of it, and on the south by a line parallel with but five chains to the south of Barkly street, under a penalty on conviction as aforesaid.

And be it further ordered and directed by the said municipal council, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to breed or keep any swine within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, that is to say, between Vincent street on the west and Maude street on the east, and between High street on the north and Moore street on the south, except under the conditions hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—That all styes in which swine are kept shall stand and be at a distance of not less than fifty (50) feet from any store, office, or dwelling-house:

That all styes in which swine are kept shall be paved or flagged with brick or stone, in such manner as shall be approved by the authorised officer of the said council, who shall have power to enter and examine all styes, and order the same to be cleaned; and any person who shall keep swine in any sty near to any store, office, or dwelling-house, than fifty feet, or who shall refuse or neglect to pave or flag any such sty, in the manner herebefore provided; or who shall refuse or neglect to keep such sty regularly cleaned out, or who shall allow the filth of such sty or other outhouse to accumulate, so as to overflow on any footpath, right-of-way, roadway, or out of the premises of the said person, or so as to become a nuisance by offensive smell, shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence, neglect, or refusal, any sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling:

Provided always, that nothing in this bye-law contained shall be taken to apply to any swine taken to any public abattoir or market within the said district or town, for the purpose of slaughter or sale, if slaughtered or taken away within forty-eight hours after being brought to such abattoir or market as aforesaid.
