THE Commissioners of Audit, when accounts, either of revenue or expenditure, or when any other documents relating to accounts, such as declared returns, reach them in an incomplete form, or when they find occasion to make any remark on such accounts or other documents for the information and guidance of the officers concerned, are at liberty to communicate directly with such officers on the subject.

All officers receiving communications from the Commissioners of Audit respecting their accounts or returns, are enjoined to pay prompt attention to such communications, and to reply to them with the least possible delay.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING INTERCOLONIAL TELEGRAMS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of September, 1860.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Mr. Nicholson
Mr. Greeves
Mr. Bailey

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for Electric Telegraphs*, it is among other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor and Executive Council to make rules and regulations for the transmission and conveyance of all despatches, messages, or communications by means of any line of electric telegraph in Victoria, and for the payment of such fees, rates, and dues as may be deemed expedient:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct, that on and after the 1st October, 1860, all telegrams received from connecting lines beyond the borders of Victoria be

transmitted to their destination through or over the lines of this colony only on the following conditions, that is to say:—

A uniform divisional proportion of the amount of charges accruing upon the transmission of any telegram between Sydney and Adelaide, or *vice versa*, or between intermediate places in either of the colonies of New South Wales or South Australia, to be equally apportioned between the Governments of New South Wales, Victoria, and South Australia, in proportions of one-third to each.

A uniform divisional proportion of the amount of charges accruing upon the transmission of any telegram between Sydney and Melbourne, or between Adelaide and Melbourne, or *vice versa*, and intermediate places in either colony, to be equally apportioned between the Governments of the two colonies interested, in proportions of one-half to each.

Accounts to be compared and checked by telegraph daily, at each boundary or terminal station. Monthly statements to be furnished by the respective officers to each Government, and payments in full on account of the balance due on either side to be made quarterly.

That on the arrival of the Royal Mail steamers, European reports sent by telegraph for the press, if transmitted prior to eight p.m., be charged the same rates as private telegrams.

And the Honorable John Robinson Bailey, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE CONEWARRE ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the seventh day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the boundaries of "The Conewarre Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the description of the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Conewarre Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east of portion A of section 24, in the parish of Conewarre, and bounded on the west by a line bearing north to the south-east angle of portion P of section 3 in the said parish; thence easterly on the north by the north side of a Government road to the south-east angle of allotment K of section 4 in the said parish; thence northerly by a line to a point one chain north of the north-east angle of allotment J of the section 4 of the said parish; thence on the north by the south and east boundaries of the racecourse to the River Barwon; and thence easterly and southerly by the River Barwon and the Lake Conewarre, and again by the River Barwon to its confluence with Bass's Straits; thence southerly and westerly by Bass's Straits to a point on the sea-coast in a direct line south of the southernmost angle of reserve 60, in the said parish; thence on the west by a direct line north to the commencing point.

THE BARRARBOOL ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight-Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the seventh day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the boundaries of "The Barrarbool Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Barrarbool Road District shall be and comprise so much of the county of Grant as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of portion 1, north of section 25, in the parish of Barrarbool; and thence, being bounded on the north by the River Barwon, westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Gnarwarre; thence on the west by the western boundaries of the parishes of Gnarwarre and Modewarre bearing south to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; thence by the south boundary of the said parish; thence on the east by the east boundary of the said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Duneed; thence on the south by the south boundary of the parish of Duneed to the north-west angle of the parish of Puebla; thence south by the west boundary of the said parish and by the south boundary of the said parish to a point on the sea-coast in a direct line south of the southernmost angle of Reserve 66 in the said parish; thence on the east by a direct line north to the north-east angle of block A, section 5, of the parish of Conewarre; thence westerly to the south-west angle of section 16, parish of Duneed; thence north to the north-east angle of section 25, parish of Barrarbool; thence due west to the commencing point.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight-Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Clunes.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

Kew.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy-two householders resident at Kew, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

Q.10052. The petitioners state that they are all householders within the meaning of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, are more than one hundred and fifty in number, and are all resident within an area of nine square miles, containing a population of more than three hundred householders.

That they are desirous that the village of Kew and its neighborhood should be constituted a municipal district, and governed by a local council.

They propose that the boundaries of the district shall be the following, *viz.*:—Commencing in the centre of the Government road bounding portions 71, 72, 73, 74, and 75 of the parish Boroondara; on the south at the junction of that road with the River Yarra Yarra, and bearing east from the said commencing point along the centre of the said road to the end thereof, and thence further east along the centre of a private road to the centre of the Government road which bounds Elgar's Special Survey on the west; thence bearing north along the centre of the last-mentioned road to portion 52 of the said parish; thence bearing east fifty-links to the south-eastern corner of the said portion 52; thence bearing north along the said eastern boundary line of the said portion to the River Yarra Yarra; and thence by the River Yarra Yarra to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency that the before-mentioned boundaries may be constituted the limits of the municipal district; that your Excellency will be pleased to constitute the same under the name of 'The municipal District of Kew' and also be pleased to issue the necessary proclamation for declaring it a municipality and defining the limits accordingly."

"Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased forthwith to proclaim that Chewton aforesaid be declared a municipality."

MUNICIPALITY OF DUNOLLY.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DUNOLLY FOR THE CURRENT YEAR 1860 AND 1861.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair average annual value. Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Dunolly, that the assessment on the annual value of property in houses and lands within the municipality of Dunolly, estimated at £9051 10s., as approved of by justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 12th day of June, 1860, and ending the 12th day of June, 1861.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND THREEPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT MUNICIPAL YEAR 1860-61.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district according to their fair average annual value, whether occupied or not, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling of such average annual value. Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Sandridge, that a rate for the current municipal year of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling, on the annual value of all property in houses and lands, whether occupied or not, within the limits of the said municipal district, be imposed and levied, and be due and payable in equal portions, on the first day of November, A.D. One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and the first day of May, A.D. One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.

6. The supplies are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the officer in charge, except in the case of aboriginal stations, which are to be supplied under the Melbourne contract, and the several articles are to be delivered at the Government Stores.

7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles when required, within twenty-four hours, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense, over and above the contract price, will be deducted from his account.

8. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly in the prescribed form, and to forward the same in a complete state, signed by the officer by whom it was incurred, to the Government Storekeeper for examination and payment, at the Government Stores, Melbourne, or the Treasury Pay Office of the district, as the case may be.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.

11. In the country districts, when a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, and in all cases when the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor, in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have the power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 7.

12. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Government Storekeeper, to such mulet not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct.
