**GENERAL REGULATION RESPECTING LEASES AND APPLICATIONS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS CROWN LANDS.**

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the fourth day of December, 1860.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make such regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, as shall appear to be necessary for prescribing the form of documents and leases to be issued under the said Act, the modes, times, dates, and places of the issue thereof, the conditions on which such leases shall be issued, and such regulations from time to time to alter, vary, or amend: And whereas divers regulations have from time to time been made under the said Act respecting mining leases, wherein certain acts, matters, and things, were ordered to be reported, done, or conducted, to, by, or in the name of the Honorable the Chief Secretary of Victoria: And whereas since the making of such regulations the office of the Honorable the Commissioner of Mines has been created, and it is expedient to substitute therein the name of the said Commissioner of Mines in lieu of that of the said Chief Secretary: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order direct, that wherever the name of the said Chief Secretary occurs in any of such regulations it shall be construed to mean and be deemed to refer solely to the said Commissioner of Mines.

And the Honorable John Basson Humffray, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### LAND TEMPORARILY RESERVED FROM SALE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, has, by an Order made on the 5th day of November, 1860, temporarily reserved from sale the land hereinafter described, situate at Yackandandah, as a site for an electric telegraph and post office:—

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND.—One rood, county unnamed, parish of Yackandandah, allotment 24, section 2, township of Yackandandah: Commencing at the south-west angle of section 2; bounded on the west by Wellsford street bearing north two chains fifty links; on the north by allotment 1 bearing east one chain; on the east by allotment 23 bearing south two chains fifty links; and on the south by High street bearing west one chain to the point of commencement.

Such land is accordingly excepted from mining operations within the meaning of the 4th clause of the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32.

#### COLAC ROAD DISTRICT.

RULES ADOPTED 18TH SEPTEMBER, 1860, BY THE COLAC DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

##### Order of Proceedings.

THE business of the board shall be conducted, except on special occasions, with open doors.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board, on every alternate Tuesday, at Ten o'clock a.m. The business to commence as soon as the quorum of three is present, but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

3. Special meetings shall be summoned at any time by the secretary, upon receiving a written requisition signed by two members, stating the matter to be discussed at such meeting.

4. No special meeting shall be held unless the secretary shall have given to each member notice thereof, by post, four clear days before such meeting.

5. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy.

6. At all meetings the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.

7. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

8. On the presentation of a petition, or the bringing up of a report, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained shall be, that the petition, or report, be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary, in writing, by the member bringing it forward, at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the papers.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting.

12. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee, shall, *pro hac vice*, be a member of such committee.

13. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board.

##### Order of Debate.

14. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

15. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded.

16. Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

17. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

18. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting.

19. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

20. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same year.

21. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

##### Contracts.

22. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised not less than twice. Each tender shall be addressed to the chairman, and such tender or tenders only be opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board. And when tenders are accepted a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and by two members of the board, one of whom shall be the chairman of the board, or, in his absence, the chairman of the meeting at which such tender is accepted; and the expense of preparing such bond shall in all cases be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

23. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the board.

##### Payment of Moneys.

24. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary, and no such cheques shall be given unless they be passed at a regular meeting of the board.

##### Local Assessment.

25. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left, stating that unless the amount be paid to the secretary of the board, before the expiration of one month from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery.

26. The collector shall pay into the treasurer's hands all moneys collected immediately after such collection.

27. The treasurer shall place all moneys received from the collector to the credit of the board in the Colonial Bank of Australasia, Geelong, within one week from the receipt thereof.

28. The collector and treasurer shall present their accounts at each meeting of the board.
