HEATHCOTE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT. PETITION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-two householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote, including the chairman and councillors thereof.

The petitioners state they are all householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote.

They refer to the creation of the municipality on the 19th of August, 1859, and draw attention to the power conferred in the Municipal Act 18 Vict. No. 15 to alter or vary the boundaries of a proclaimed district.

They further state that they find it will be for the benefit of the municipality that its boundaries should be altered, and the following boundaries (which are within the limits prescribed by the Act) substituted, viz.:-

Commencing at a point on the north-west boundary of country allotment number forty-eight, in the parish of Heathcote, sold to Henry Welch; thence true north thirty-two degrees east along the said boundary of country allotment number forty-five, and crossing the Melvor Creek, to a point on the north-east side of the main road; thence by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the north-eastern side of main road through Heathcote, from Sandhurst to Kilmore, to a point on the town boundary of Heathcote; thence along said town boundary north-easterly to a point; twenty-five chains from the north-east side of the said road; thence again by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the north-east side of the said main road to a point bearing true north thirty-four degrees east from the eastern angle of Heathcote suburban allotment number eighteen A; thence by a line true south thirty-four degrees west to a point twenty-five chains from the said main road; thence north-easterly by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the south-west side of the said main road to a point on the town boundary; thence by the town boundary south-easterly and north-westerly to a point twenty-five chains from the said main road; and thence finally by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the said main road to the point of commencement.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention. That the position and advantages proposed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition. And the petitioners pray as follows:- "That your Excellency will be pleased to exclude that portion of Smith Ward lying east of Nicholson street from the jurisdiction of the [recently] contemplated municipality of Carlton; and further be pleased, with the consent of the council of Fitz Roy to alter the northern boundary of that municipality as follows:-From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street, along the centre of Nicholson street northward to the southern boundary of Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary line to the Merri Creek; along the centre of the said creek southerly to the centre of the Plenty road;

thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point in the said road opposite the centre of Smith street; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street."

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1859.
PUBLIC WORKS.

THE following works have been executed during the last half-year, viz.:—

About three thousand cubic yards of metal have been purchased, which is now in course of being spread. The following streets have been metalled, viz., Bank street west, portions of Coventry and York streets west, Moray street from Dorcas to Bank street, Clarendon street from Napier to Raglan street, and portion of the Three-chain road.

The erection of the toll-house and appurtenances at the entrance to the Three-chain road, and the partial formation and metalling of portion of that road. The tolls have been let for 1860 for the sum of £470.

Kerbing of Bank street west, and portion of Park street west, also stone kerbing and channelling at the corners of a number of streets in the township.

Channelling has been laid in Ferrers and Park streets, formation of pitched crossings to Little Park street, and at the intersections of Montague and Bank streets, Park and Cecil streets, Napier and Clarendon streets.

A number of crossings to private streets and rights-of-way have been constructed the cost of which has been partially borne by the council.

Flagging has been laid down in Montague street east side from the Sandridge road to Bank street, in Coventry street north side from Cecil to Clarendon street, and south side from Cecil street to the Railway, in portions of Cecil street, in Market street north side from Cecil to Clarendon street, in York street north side from Cecil to Clarendon street, in Moray street from Bank to Dorcas street, and in Clarendon street from the Orphan Asylum to Napier street.

Moray street has been formed to its permanent level from Park street to Bridport street, and the footpath in other portions completed. The street will shortly be opened for traffic to the Sandridge road.

The drainage of the swamp east of Moray street has been effected by the construction of a large drain and culvert through the Sandridge road; this work has been hindered by the action taken by the Railway Company in obstructing the contractor in the execution of the work. The company have refused to form the continuation of this drain through their land in conformity with the plan prepared by them in the first instance, approved of by the council and adopted by the Government.

The council have brought under the notice of the Government a plan for preventing the inundation of the north-eastern portion of the district after heavy rains, by the overflowing of the Yarra, and the matter is under the consideration of the Inspector-General of Public Works.

SANDRIDGE ROAD.

The footpaths of the Sandridge road have been planted with elm trees, a handsome post and chain fence erected on each side of the road, the footpaths completed and kerbed so far as Montague street, 2500 yards of metal have been spread on the road, and a further quantity will shortly be procured. Further improvements are contemplated by the council. The tolls have been let for 1860 for the sum of £5207. A weighbridge has been constructed by permission of the council at the foot of Clarendon street.

HEALTH AND CLEANLINESS.

The council have given the important subject of the health and cleanliness of the district particular attention; a horse and cart has been provided, and a man engaged for the cleansing of the streets, &c. The extension of the Yan Yean water has at length been partially obtained. Application has been made to the Government for a site for public baths, and a suitable piece of ground for the purpose has been granted. Plans for the erection of the necessary buildings are in course of preparation. Bathing platforms and seats for the accommodation of bathers have been erected along the sea-shore, and the public have largely availed themselves of the convenience.

BYE-LAWS.

The council have adopted, and the Government has assented to bye-laws for striking a rate of 1s. 3d. in the pound, regulating the construction of awnings, and to amend bye-law No. 3 so as to enable the council to remove the Sandridge road toll-house from its present site.

FINANCE.

The council were not in a position during portion of the half-year to carry out many contemplated public works owing to the want of funds. This was attributable to the delay in the payment of the Government grant, and a number of liabilities on account of flagging stones, &c., falling due earlier than was expected. To meet pressing claims, and to complete works in progress, a loan of £2000 was obtained, which is now in course of repayment. The valuation of the rateable property of the district for 1859-60 amounts to £69,960 4s. 2d. A sufficiently large amount of rates have been collected to warrant the council in expecting a full share of the Government grant for 1860.

FALLS BRIDGE.

The exertions of the council in the matter of the erection of a bridge over the River Yarra at the Falls have at length been successful, a tender having been accepted by the Government for the construction of a wooden bridge with carriage-way 30 feet wide, and footpaths 5 feet in width.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

Councillor Service having accepted the office of Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, tendered his resignation on 31st October. The council in accepting Mr. Service's resignation passed a vote of thanks for the eminent services rendered by him during the time he occupied a seat at the council board.

The vacancy thus occasioned was filled upon the 3rd December, by the election of Mr. William Thistlethwaite.
