BYE-LAW No. 12.—FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TOLL-BAR NEAR THE SLATY CREEK BRIDGE, ON THE MELBOURNE ROAD.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is in clause 29 of the said Act provided, that it shall be competent for every municipal council to establish tolls, rates, and dues upon any road within the jurisdiction of such council: And whereas the municipal council of Creswick have erected a bridge and approaches over the Slaty Creek on the Melbourne road, and now deem it necessary (in order to provide for the forming, making, and maintaining of the roads within the municipal boundary) that a toll-bar should be erected on the west side of the said bridge, in such a situation as may meet the direct traffic passing to and from the said municipality; and that a toll should be levied on all waggons, drays, carts, gigs or other vehicles, and on all horses, horned cattle, sheep, pigs and goats, passing over the said bridge, according to the scale set forth in the annexed schedule: Be it therefore enacted by the said council, that so soon as this bye-law shall have received the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council, a toll-bar be erected as before stated, and the toll set forth in the annexed schedule be levied thereat; and any person or persons who shall in any manner evade, or attempt to evade, or aid or abet any person in evading or attempting to evade the payment of any toll authorised by this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20). And whereas it is expedient that certain parties should be exempted from payment of tolls: Be it therefore enacted that no toll shall be demanded or taken by virtue of this bye-law of or from any person in Her Majesty's service, or in the employment of the municipal council, or of any minister of religion, whilst in the discharge of their several duties, or of any person going or returning from any place of public worship, or any return vehicle having a ticket for the day.
