THE following extracts from the *Queensland Government Gazette*, relative to the organization of the Civil Service of the colony of Queensland, and setting forth the conditions on which candidates are invited to compete in March next for admission into the junior grade of such service, are published at the request of the Government of that colony.

HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor is pleased to direct the publication for general information of the following extract from the proceedings of the Executive Council, with respect to the organization of the Civil Service of Her Majesty in this colony.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor,  
The Honorable the Colonial Secretary,  
The Honorable the Attorney General,  
The Honorable the Colonial Treasurer.

His Excellency the Governor lays before the Council the following

*Minute on the Organization of Her Majesty's Civil Service in the Colony of Queensland.*

1. I beg to direct the attention of the Council to the expediency, for many obvious reasons, of organizing on a permanent system Her Majesty's Civil Service in this colony; and also of testing, according to fixed rules, the qualifications of the young men who may, from time to time, be proposed to be appointed to the junior situations in any of the public departments.
2. I am confident that this Council will agree with me that individual merit, and not patronage or connection, should procure the first admission into Her Majesty's service of candidates for public employment; and also their subsequent promotion in the several Civil Establishments.
3. The system of competitive examinations has already been introduced with success both in the United Kingdom, and also in India, Canada, and other dependencies of the empire. This system has been found not only calculated to secure for the public service men of good character, sound information, ability, and efficiency; but also to apply a powerful stimulus to scholastic institutions, and to public education generally.
4. In accordance with the plan adopted in the United Kingdom, I propose that the clerical staff of each department shall be organized as follows:—
  - I. Chief Clerk, beginning at a *minimum* of £400, and rising by £20 yearly to a *maximum* of £500 per annum.
  - II. Clerks of *first class*, beginning at a *minimum* of £300, and rising by £20 yearly to a *maximum* of £400 per annum.
  - III. Clerks of *second class*, beginning at a *minimum* of £200, and rising by £20 yearly to a *maximum* of £300 per annum.
  - IV. Clerks of *third class*, beginning at a *minimum* of £100, and rising by £10 yearly to a *maximum* of £200 per annum.
5. The salaries recommended above are, of course, subject to the sanction of the Queensland Parliament. The important subject of the establishment of a system of superannuation allowances, such as are provided in England for old and faithful public servants, must also engage the attention of that Legislature.
6. It will also be obvious to the Council that it is not proposed to complete the above organization until the amount of business in the various public departments shall require it. At the present moment, and probably for some time to come, one or two clerks will be sufficient in many of the offices. But it is important to adopt *forthwith* a fixed system of classification, leaving the framework of each class to be filled up as public business may increase.
7. I propose, moreover, that promotion from the junior to the higher classes in the several departments shall take place only when the chief of the department shall have reported to the Governor in Council that the civil officer to be promoted has

been faithful and diligent in the discharge of his duties, and fully deserves this mark of the favor and approval of the Government.

8. I strongly recommend that admission to the junior or third class of clerks be procurable only by competitive examinations, open to all natural-born or naturalized subjects of the Queen.

9. For this purpose, I propose that a Board shall be instituted, to be called the Board of Examiners for the Civil Service, and to consist of the persons for the time being filling the offices following:—

Colonial Secretary,  
Attorney General,  
Colonial Treasurer,  
President of the Legislative Council,  
Speaker of the Legislative Assembly.

I propose, further, that three members of the said Board shall form a *quorum* thereof, and may exercise all the functions of the Board; and that the Clerk of the Executive Council for the time being shall act as Secretary to the said Board. The Board shall be empowered, when necessary, to delegate its powers to special examiners, to be approved by the Governor.

10. The duties of the Board will be to examine all candidates for the public service who may present themselves in accordance with the following regulations:—

11. Every candidate for admission to the junior or third class of the public service must present written certificates, satisfactory to the Board, proving—

- A. That he is above 16 and under 25 years of age.
- B. That he is free from any physical defect or disease which would be likely to interfere with the proper discharge of his duties. (Certificates to this effect must be produced from two legally recognised medical practitioners.)
- C. That his moral character is such as to qualify him for public employment. (A certificate to this effect must be produced from a legally recognised minister of religion, or from the master or tutor under whom the candidate may have been educated.)

12. All candidates who shall have complied with the above regulations will be subjected to an examination, during two successive days, by the Board; and those who shall have satisfactorily passed the examination will be appointed, in order of merit, to fill any vacancies which may exist in the junior grade of the public service.

13. The following shall be the indispensably necessary subjects of examination, in which all candidates must satisfy the Board:—

- A. Exercises designed to test handwriting and orthography. (Every candidate must show that he can write a clear, bold hand, and that he can spell correctly from dictation.)
- B. Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions.
- C. Geography, especially that of the British Empire generally, and of the Australian Colonies in particular.
- D. The outlines of English history, including the history and political institutions of the Australian Colonies.
- E. English composition, especially the power of writing letters on official business, and of making a *précis* or digest, in the form of a narrative, of official correspondence.

14. In addition to the above subjects, indispensable for all, each candidate may offer himself for examination, at his own option, in one or more of the following subjects:—

- A. Latin.
- B. Greek.
- C. One modern language, which must be either French, or German, or Italian.
- D. Pure and mixed Mathematics.
- E. Physical Science and Civil Engineering.

The Council express their entire concurrence in the views of His Excellency the Governor, and advise that the foregoing minute be published in the *Government Gazette*, with a notification of an examination to be holden of the candidates for such third class clerkships as may be required in the public offices.

No. 1.—BYE-LAW RELATIVE TO SITES OCCUPIED BY CRUSHING MACHINES IN THE DISTRICT OF ARARAT.—[17th January, 1860.]

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at Burnside's Hotel, Pleasant Creek, in the said district, on the seventeenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Machines; size of claim.*—The owner or owners, or the legal representatives of the owners, of any machinery may occupy and hold, by virtue of his or their miners' right or rights, claims in the form and according to the following scale:—If with frontage to any creek or natural waterhole, for each nominal horse power of the engine, one thousand (1000) square yards shall be allowed in the form of a parallelogram, or as near such form as the nature of the ground will admit of, having a frontage to such creek or waterhole of ten (10) yards with a depth of one hundred (100) yards.

2. *Artificial reservoirs; size of claim and conditions on which the same may be held.*—Where artificial reservoirs are required in order to obtain the necessary supply of water from surface drainage, the quantity of land shall be four thousand (4000) square yards for each nominal horse power as aforesaid, always provided that any miner or miners shall be allowed to work any auriferous ground, or to prospect any portion thereof, so long as the same does not interfere with or injure the works, and any person or persons may erect any tent or building thereon at a distance of not less than two hundred (200) feet from the centre of the works.

3. *Notice of application.*—Any miner seeking to occupy ground for the purpose herein specified, shall fix a substantial post three (3) feet above the surface firmly in the ground at each extreme corner of the land applied for, and on each post a notice in the following form shall be attached, viz.:—

"I (or We), A. B., hereby give notice of our intention to occupy the site here indicated, as a machinery claim, the superficial area of which is \_\_\_\_\_ square yards. My (or Our) engine is of nominal horse power."

A copy of such notice, together with a plan of the site, shall, within three days of the date of the marking out, be forwarded to the warden of the division, and advertised at least twice before the application is entertained, in some newspaper published within the district.

4. *Objections.*—Any person objecting to the granting of any site under this bye-law, shall, within fourteen (14) days from the date on which the notice was posted, state such objections in writing to the warden of the division, and if the objections be deemed by the warden to be valid, the application shall be refused, or a portion only granted of the ground applied for, as the warden may decide.

5. *Protection to claimholders.*—After a site has been granted the owners of it shall be protected against all injurious interference on the part of others, whether such interference relate to the supply of water, the ingress to or egress from their claim, or any other obstruction which may be calculated to interrupt the reasonable requirements of the works.

6. *Claimholders to commence work within reasonable time.*—Claimholders shall within a reasonable time after original occupation commence operations in a *bona fide* manner, and shall, except in cases of accident, scarcity of water, insufficient work, or causes over which they have no control, continue the same during all lawful and necessary days.

7. *Conditions of this bye-law not observed, claim forfeited.*—The conditions above specified not having been observed by the claimholders for three (3) consecutive months, or it becoming apparent that they are systematically avoiding the conditions on which the claim is held, the warden may, at the request of any miner or miners, declare it forfeited.

8. *Sludge to be provided for.*—Should the sludge from any machinery claim obstruct any road, or injure any person's property, the warden shall be empowered to assess such damage upon the holders of such machinery claim, and on his or their refusal to pay the same it shall be declared forfeited.

9. *Repeal bye-law.*—That bye-law No. 6, regulating the quantity and form of land which may be occupied by and for machinery used in crushing and extracting gold from quartz and other substances in the Ararat District, be repealed.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention.

That the position and advantages proposed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"That your Excellency will be pleased to exclude that portion of Smith Ward lying east of Nicholson street from the jurisdiction of the [recently] contemplated municipality of Carlton; and further be pleased, with the consent of the council of Fitz Roy to alter the northern boundary of that municipality as follows:—From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street, along the centre of Nicholson street northward to the southern boundary of Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary line to the Merri Creek; along the centre of the said creek southerly to the centre of the Plenty road; thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point in the said road opposite the centre of Smith street; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street."

**MUNICIPALITY OF HEATHCOTE.**

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF HEATHCOTE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Vict. No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in the colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the municipal council of any municipal district established under the same; and whereas by a proclamation dated 19th August, 1859, the district of Heathcote was proclaimed a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it ordered and enacted from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor:

1. That the council meet every Wednesday in their municipal chambers, High street, to transact public business, that their meetings be open to the public, but a majority may require the expulsion of strangers; minutes shall be taken of their proceedings, which shall at all times be open for the inspection of rate-payers.

2. That a Public Works Committee shall be appointed, consisting of not less than three councillors.

3. That a Finance Committee shall be appointed, consisting of not less than three councillors.

4. That a Legislative Committee be appointed, consisting of the whole council.

5. That the chairman shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees; that three shall form a quorum when the committee consists of the whole council, and two when the committee consists of three; the standing orders of the council shall be observed in committees, except the number of times limited for special business.

6. That the seal of the municipal council shall be a shield having on it the pick and shovel, rose, shamrock, and thistle, surmounted by the Royal Arms, and at the base of the shield the motto "Industria honorem meruit," the whole surrounded by a cartier having engraved on it "Heathcote Municipal Council."

7. The chairman shall take the chair at the appointed hour or as soon as a quorum is present, but should the chairman be absent when a quorum is assembled the council may elect a temporary chairman from their body.

8. That the order of business shall be—

Reading and confirming minutes,

Taking action thereon,

Reading correspondence,

Taking action thereon,

Receiving petitions,

Taking action thereon,

Receiving reports,

Taking action thereon,

Discussing and taking action on the motions of the day,

Any business the chairman may think fit to bring before the council.

Giving notices of motion.

9. All accounts brought before the council shall be referred to the finance committee to be examined and reported on, and no accounts shall be paid unless passed by the finance committee.

10. All accounts shall be paid by cheques signed by two councillors, countersigned by the town clerk.

11. No public work shall be undertaken until reported on by the public works committee, and all works shall be examined by such officer as the council may appoint, and be passed by the public works committee.

12. All laws shall be approved and passed by the legislative committee, and no bye-law shall be passed by the council until it has been exhibited seven days for the inspection of the rate-payers.

13. The town clerk shall have charge of the municipal seal, and shall not affix it to any document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bear the signature of the chairman. In cases of legal documents requiring verification before the chairman the town clerk may affix the seal to the chairman's certificate.

14. No motion shall be discussed or decided on unless notice in writing, signed by the proposing councillor, shall have been given at the previous meeting. This rule may, however, be suspended by the unanimous voice of the council in urgent cases.

15. Any councillor may demand the production of any paper or document relating to the subject under discussion.

16. Any notice of motion entered on the notice paper, and the councillor who gave the notice being absent, and no other councillor being deputed to bring the same forward, shall lapse.

17. No discussion shall be permitted on any motion not seconded, and no motion once brought forward shall be withdrawn without leave.

18. The chairman and councillors shall address the meeting standing; if two or more councillors rise the chairman shall decide the right of precedence, and no councillor shall speak twice on any motion unless in explanation or reply.

19. Any councillor may demand a call of the whole council to decide on any subject.

20. When a call of the council is made seven days' notice shall be given of such call, and any councillor absenting himself without reasonable excuse shall be deemed guilty of contempt, and may be fined in a penalty not exceeding ten pounds on conviction before two or more justices of the peace.

21. Any councillor guilty of a breach of order shall be punishable, unless on being called to order he make a satisfactory apology. Breaches of order shall be—

Addressing the council otherwise than standing,

Interrupting a councillor whilst speaking, except to a point

of order.

Presenting to the council petitions or other documents disrespectfully worded.

Refusing to cease speaking when interrupted by a call to order.

Making verbal and unwritten motions or amendments, Using offensive language, Imputing improper motives, Making personal reflections on a councillor.

22. The chairman shall decide in all points of order.

23. Any councillor may require the town clerk to take down in writing any words used by another councillor immediately on being used.

24. Any councillor who shall willfully disobey any legal order of the council, be guilty of any breach of order, or any person who shall interrupt the proceedings of the council shall be deemed guilty of contempt, and shall be fined in a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds on conviction before two or more justices of the peace.

25. No office at the disposal of the council shall be filled until five day's notice shall have been given in the local paper inviting applications for same.

26. No motion, the effect of which would rescind any motion previously carried, shall be entertained unless by a call of the whole council.

27. That it shall be in the power of the chairman or any three councillors to convene a special meeting on twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, given by the town clerk to each councillor, stating the special cause.

28. All communications addressed to the council must be couched in respectful language.

29. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided the same be done in writing, and presented not later than the next meeting of the council.

30. No councillor, or officer of the council, shall be received as security for any officer appointed, or any contract entered into by the council, and the expense of preparing all bonds shall be borne in all cases by the party giving the same.

No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is entitled and empowered to impose a rate on all houses, lands, and tenements within the limits of such municipal district, according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Heathcote, that a rate for the current year, ending 21st September, 1860, of One shilling in the pound on the annual value of all property in houses, lands, and tenements within the limits of the municipal district aforesaid, be imposed and levied, and that the said levy become due on and after 31st January, 1860.
