DISTRICTS FOR THE SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*; it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district or place in Victoria, a city, town, district or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the districts hereinafter defined to be districts for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the districts hereinafter named and defined shall be districts wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

THE CHILTERN DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point bearing south and distant one mile from the south-western angle of the town reserve of Chiltern; thence west two miles; thence north eight miles; thence east to the Indigo Creek; thence southwards by the said creek and a line to the north-western angle of the town reserve of Barnawartha; thence south five miles and fifty chains, more or less; and thence west to the commencing point, excepting the country comprised within the district of the Ovens.

THE CLUNES DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point bearing east, and distant one mile from the south-eastern angle of section VI. in the town reserve of Clunes; thence north one mile; thence west two miles; thence south two miles; thence east two miles; and thence north one mile to the commencing point.

THE MANSFIELD DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point bearing east, and distant one mile from the north-eastern angle of section II. in the village reserve of Mansfield; thence north one mile; thence west two miles; thence south two miles; thence east two miles; and thence north one mile to the commencing point.

THE SHEPPARTON DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point bearing east, and distant one mile from the south-eastern angle of section A in the town reserve of Shepparton; thence north one mile; thence west two miles; thence south two miles; thence east two miles; and thence north one mile to the commencing point.

THE VIOLETTOWN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-western angle of country allotment 1, parish of Shadforth; thence east three miles; thence south three miles; thence west three miles; and thence north three miles to the commencing point.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, reserved the pieces or portions of land hereinafter described for the purpose of saving water for public use.

PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 13 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention.

That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"That your Excellency will be pleased to exclude that portion of Smith Ward lying east of Nicholson street from the jurisdiction of the [recently] contemplated municipality of Carlton; and further be pleased, with the consent of the council of Fitz Roy to alter the northern boundary of that municipality as follows:—From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street, along the centre of Nicholson street northward to the southern boundary of Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary line to the Merri Creek; along the centre of the said creek southerly to the centre of the Plenty road; thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point in the said road opposite the centre of Smith street; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street."
