By His Excellency Sir Henry Barriy, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), initituled, An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., X. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Honry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the district of Lethbridge hereinafter defined shall come under the operation of the following provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

V. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction for every such offence, neglect, or omission, pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

16. Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority.

GENERAL RULE UNDER THE ACT 21 VICTORIA
No. 29, SEC. 69.

WHEBEAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of
Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the more easy recovery
of certain Debts and Demands, it is enacted that it shall be lawful
for the several persons who for the time being shall be Attorney
General, Solicitor General, and County Court Judges, or any
three of them of whom the said Attorney General or Solicitor
General shall be one, from time to time to frame such general
rules as to them shall seem expedient, in relation to any of the
provisions of the said Act as to which there might arise doubts:
Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions hereinbefore
recited, we do frame the General Rule hereinafter set forth, that
is to say:—
All notices of special defences under section thirts force of the

all notices of special defences under section thirty-five of the said Act shall be given one clear day before the hearing of the complaint, and where such notice is given by the post it shall be posted in such time as that in the ordinary course of the post it could reach its destination one clear day before the day for the hearing of such complaint.

And we do further fix the fifteenth day of December instant as the time for the commencement of the said General Rule.

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD. BYE-LAW No. 3. WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is thereby enacted that no toll, rate, or due, shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district, save by bye-law subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Daylesford; that from after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be and, be taken to be the rate on the assessment of property in houses and land within the limits of the municipal district of Daylesford aforesaid, for the current year, ending the sixteenth day of, October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty. MUNICIPALITY OF HAMILTON. BYE-LAW NO. 3.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAMILTON. WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Fictoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate upon all property and houses and lands within such district according to their fair average value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Hamilton, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor as required by the said recited Act, a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current municipal year 1859-1860, ending 29th. December, 1860, due and payable fourteen days after this bye-law is gazetted, be imposed and levied on the annual value of all rateable property within the limits of this municipal district, as required by the provisions of the said first recited Act.
