PORTION OF SECTION V. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE DISTRICT OF LETHBRIDGE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the district of Lethbridge hereinafter defined shall come under the operation of the following provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

No. 28.—MARCH 2, 1860.—1.

V. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction for every such offence, neglect, or omission, pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

16. Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority.

THE DISTRICT OF LETHBRIDGE.—Commencing at a point on the Moorabool River, being the south-eastern angle of suburban allotment 11, in the parish of Wabdallah; thence west to the south-eastern angle of suburban allotment 76, in the said parish; thence north 38 degrees 30 minutes west, to the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 50, in the said parish; thence south to the south-eastern angle of the said allotment; thence west to the north-western angle of suburban allotment 58, in the said parish; thence south to the south-western angle of suburban allotment 37, in the said parish; thence by a line bearing east to a point due north of the north-eastern angle of the Cemetery reserve; thence south 2 degrees 27 minutes west, 80 chains; thence south 87 degrees 33 minutes east, 44 chains and 3 links, to the Muddy Waterholes; thence east to the Moorabool River; and thence by that river to the commencing point aforesaid.

GENERAL RULE UNDER THE ACT 21 VICTORIA No. 29, SEC. 69.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the several persons who for the time being shall be Attorney General, Solicitor General, and County Court Judges, or any three of them of whom the said Attorney General or Solicitor General shall be one, from time to time to frame such general rules as to them shall seem expedient, in relation to any of the provisions of the said Act as to which there might arise doubts: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions hereinbefore recited, we do frame the General Rule hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

All notices of special defences under section thirty-five of the said Act shall be given one clear day before the hearing of the complaint, and where such notice is given by the post it shall be posted in such time as that in the ordinary course of the post it could reach its destination one clear day before the day for the hearing of such complaint.

And we do further fix the fifteenth day of December instant as the time for the commencement of the said General Rule.

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is thereby enacted that no toll, rate, or due, shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district, save by bye-law subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Daylesford: that from after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of property in houses and land within the limits of the municipal district of Daylesford aforesaid, for the current year, ending the sixteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAMILTON.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate upon all property and houses and lands within such district according to their fair average value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Hamilton, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor as required by the said recited Act, a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current municipal year 1859-1860, ending 29th December, 1860, due and payable fourteen days after this bye-law is gazetted, be imposed and levied on the annual value of all rateable property within the limits of this municipal district, as required by the provisions of the said first recited Act.

BYE-LAW ADOPTED.

No. 22. To authorise the expenditure of 1st instalment grant-in-aid for 1859.—Gazetted 30th August.

The limited revenue at the disposal of the municipal council having been mainly expended during the preceding half-year, no public works of importance could be undertaken until the Government make known their intention with regard to municipalities and the amount to be expended at Warrnambool. The contracts entered into at the beginning of the year for forming portions of Timor and Liebeg streets have been completed.

1st August and 29th November.—Applications to Government were renewed for a special grant of £4000 towards making the main approaches into town. £2000 have since been placed on the Estimates.

On the 2nd September, the council remitted to the Honorable Dr. Wilkie, of Melbourne, the amount collected in this district towards a general fund for exploring Central Australia.

November.—The council received a letter from Messrs. Geo. South and Co., Melbourne, proposing to establish a gas company

in this town, but the council, after obtaining by a general canvass the number of lights likely to be required, the cost of plant and working expenses appeared too serious an undertaking for them to entertain, particularly at the present juncture (the Government contemplating a reduction of the grant-in-aid), and it was decided to leave the matter for the present to public or private enterprise.

December.—The council forwarded to the local members a remonstrance against the Government proposal to reduce the annual grant in aid of public works in country districts; and requested those gentlemen to urge upon the Government the injustice of such a measure.

The council have again to thank several gentlemen for their liberal contributions of seeds and shrubs for the Botanical Gardens.



