# MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 26.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND UPON ALL HOUSES, LANDS, AND TENEMENTS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 16TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1861.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, whereby it is amongst other things enacted it shall be competent for the municipal council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the collection of rates, provided no such rate shall exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of the district of Ballarat, that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound be levied on the annual value of all houses, tenements, and land within the municipal district of Ballarat for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and be due and payable in equal proportions; the first moiety to be due and payable on the first day of June, the second moiety to become due and payable on the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty; provided nevertheless where the total rate for the whole year does not exceed the sum of Ten shillings, the same shall become due and payable in the full amount on the first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty.

# MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH BARWON.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—FOR ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO THE COLLECTION OF TOLLS AT THE BARWON BRIDGE AND BREAKWATER TOLL-GATES.

WHEREAS by bye-law No. 8 of this municipality, which received the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council, and was gazetted the 15th of October, 1853, the council of South Barwon is empowered to collect tolls at the Barwon Bridge and Breakwater: And whereas it is found necessary to provide for certain omissions in the said bye-law No. 8, that is to say, to charge toll on carriages passing through the gates: Be it therefore enacted, with the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that in addition to the powers contained in the said bye-law No. 8, the municipal council of South Barwon be empowered to charge—

For all carriages drawn by one horse, Sixpence.  
For all carriages drawn by two horses or more, One shilling.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KILMORE.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—FOR THE ASSESSMENT OF ALL RATEABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE KILMORE MUNICIPALITY, FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE EIGHTH DAY OF AUGUST, 1860, UNDER THE 30TH SECTION OF THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that all municipal councils are empowered to cause an annual value to be fixed on all rateable properties within the boundaries of such municipalities: And whereas the council of the Kilmore Municipality have caused such valuation of all rateable properties situate within the said municipality to be made, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Sixteen thousand one hundred pounds: And whereas the sixth day of February, A.D. 1860, had been fixed upon for the hearing of appeals against the said assessment, and such appeals having now been finally determined and recorded in the rate book lodged in the council chambers of the said municipality, and open to public inspection: It is therefore enacted by the council of this municipality that the said amended valuation or assessment, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Sixteen thousand and thirty pounds, for the year ending the eighth day of August, 1860, shall, upon receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, be at once carried into effect, and have full force as contemplated in the said Act.

## MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BYE-LAW No. 30.—FOR REGULATING BATHING ON OR NEAR THE SHORES OF PORT PHILLIP AND HOBSON'S BAYS, IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN, AND FOR THE CONSERVATION OF PUBLIC DECENCY.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary that a place or places should be set apart on or near the shores of Port Phillip and Hobson's Bays, within the municipal district of Williamstown, for the healthful recreation of bathing, and that for the conservation of public decency bathing should be prohibited on or near to the said shores in any other part, and that other provisions and regulations should be made in respect thereto:

Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of the said district of Williamstown, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to the 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33, &c., it shall be lawful for the said council—

1stly. To appoint one or more places on the said shore at which females shall be allowed to bathe, at or within one hundred and fifty yards of which it shall not be lawful for any male person above the age of ten years to bathe.

2ndly. To appoint one or more places on the said shore at which males shall be allowed to bathe, and it shall not be lawful for any person above the age of ten years to bathe on or near to any other part or parts of the said shore within the said district than are set out by the said council for that purpose.

3rdly. That it shall be lawful for the said council to disallow bathing at all or any of the places set out by them for that purpose, on or after the expiration of one month's notice, which shall be published by them in a local newspaper, or if there be no local newspaper in one of the papers published in Melbourne, and to appoint any other place or places as they shall deem meet at which persons shall be allowed to bathe.

4thly. That the said council shall, if they shall think fit, mark by two posts or some other permanent marks the boundaries on the line of the shore between which males may bathe, and in like manner mark the boundaries from the female bathing place or places within which males above ten years old may not bathe.

And be it further ordered and enacted:—

1stly. That if any male person above the age of ten years shall be found bathing within one hundred and fifty yards of any place set apart for females to bathe at, he shall on conviction of such offence, before any two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit a sum or penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

2ndly. That if any male person above the age of ten years shall be found stopping or lingering within one hundred and fifty yards of any place set apart for females to bathe at, during the time any female is bathing, or is undressing, or proceeding to bathe after being undressed, or is leaving the water to dress, or is dressing herself, he shall on conviction of such offence as aforesaid forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Forty shillings.

3rdly. That if any person above the age of ten years shall be found bathing on or near to the said shore at any place other than is set apart and appointed for that purpose, such person shall on conviction of such offence as aforesaid forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Forty shillings.

4thly. That the term "near to the said shore" shall be taken to mean one hundred and fifty yards of the edge of the water on the said shore, at the time any offence shall take place or be committed against the provisions of this bye-law or any of them.

5thly. That the penalty imposed in clause No. 3 is not applicable or intended to affect persons bathing within any enclosure by which they are effectually screened from public view while so engaged, and while undressing and dressing before and after so bathing as aforesaid.

#### RULES and Regulations of the Gisborne Public Cemetery.

1. Before any interment shall take place application for permission shall be made to the secretary a reasonable time previously, when an order in the form or to the effect set out in the annexed schedule B. will be given to the applicant, upon payment of the charges marked A. annexed.

2. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug.

3. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton before sunset of the day previous to the burial.

4. Before receiving the order answers must be given to questions in schedule C. annexed.

5. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., from the 1st of September to the 30th of April; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m., during the other months of the year, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours will be from Two p.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.

6. The procession will be expected to arrive at the cemetery at the hour appointed for the funeral.

7. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other sufficient evidence, that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

8. The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained and kept as private burial places, and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed thereon in accordance with these rules and regulations.

9. Permission to have a private burial place will be granted at the office of the secretary in the form and to the effect set forth in schedule B. annexed, and upon payment of the fees in schedule A. annexed.

10. Brick graves or vaults must be constructed under the direction of the trustees.

11. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

13. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.

14. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, or tablet, and a plan of every monument, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given.

15. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

16. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

17. No servant employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity from others.

18. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

19. A plan of the grounds and a register will be kept by the secretary, which may be examined upon payment of the charges according to schedule A.

20. The sexton shall have orders to turn out or take into custody any person who shall commit any trespass or injury within the cemetery.

21. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

Rough channelling west side of West Melbourne road from the Newtown Hotel to the Great Western road; quarrying and breaking 300 cubic yards of blue stone metal for the general maintenance of the metalled streets; forming and metalling portions of Elizabeth street and a pitched crossing in Retreat road near Cumberland street; forming and metalling portions of the West Melbourne road, and a pitched crossing at Nicholas street; cutting down portions of pathways and raising others in Pakington street, Austin street, Prospect road, and Clark street, and rough channelling the west side of Pakington street from Prospect road to Nicholas street; alterations to council chambers; forming new council room, surveyor's office, town clerk's office, entrance hall, and suite of apartments as a residence for the town clerk; fencing in dangerous excavation in Noble street. Three men with horse and cart have been employed in raising pathways, forming roads, repairing crossings, repairing the metalled roads, clearing water channels, &c., &c.

##### ANNEXATION OF QUARRIES.

On 30th March last a special committee, consisting of councillors Langton, Williams, and Fergie, was appointed to take active measures, in conjunction with the residents in the Quarries district, for securing the rejection by the Legislative Assembly of the Bill to repeal the fourth, fifth, and sixth sections of an Act intitled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*; the effect of which, if passed, would be to prevent the annexation of the Quarries to this municipality. In consequence of an attempt having been made towards the close of last year to embrace the Quarries within the limits of the proposed municipality of Carlton, the residents in that portion of Smith Ward east of Nicholson street, a second time petitioned the Executive Council for annexation to Fitz Roy. This memorial was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st January, 1860, but the consideration of it was postponed until the Legislative Assembly had decided upon the bill above mentioned. The City Council had previously caused a bill to be introduced in that House, purporting to define the limits of the city of Melbourne, which excluded the Quarries district; but on the Government declining to erect Carlton into a separate municipality, that measure was abandoned and another substituted, being the bill which the committee was appointed to oppose, and which, by depriving the Executive of their power to take localities within the corporate limits of Melbourne and annex them to existing municipalities, proposed to retain the Quarries district within the jurisdiction of the city.

##### REVENUE.

The council have received from Government the sum of £611 5s. 10d., being the concluding payment of the grant-in-aid for the last municipal year, which amounted to nearly thirty-one shillings and sixpence on the amount of rates collected to 30th June, 1859.

The valuation of rateable property within the municipal district, after deducting the reductions made by the court of appeal, is £125,341, yielding a revenue, at one shilling and threepence in the pound, of £7883 18s. 3d.

##### HEALTH.

The reports of the health officer, respecting the sanitary condition of the district, are favorable. The council, as local board of health, have issued instructions for the forming, metaling, and channelling of the following rights-of-way, under the provisions of the Health Act:—

1. That between Cecil and Reilly streets.
2. That running from Young to King William street.
3. That between George and Gore streets.
4. That running in the rear of Kyte's buildings, Regent street.
5. That between Palmer and Little Fleet streets.
6. That running from King William to Moor streets, near Nicholson street.

The owners of property abutting on the above rights-of-way are required to contribute two-thirds of the estimated expense, previous to the tenders being invited, the council defraying the remaining portion of the cost. The council have constructed Little Smith street under those arrangements, the owners of property thereon having paid the required amount.

#### MARKET.

Since 4th May, 1859, 5937 drays have been weighed at the bridge. The receipts for that period amount to £208 9s., being a return of over five per cent. on the outlay, exclusive of the market keeper's salary.

#### BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the approval of His Excellency the Governor:—

Bye-law No. 7. "For empowering the municipal council, to grant, refuse, or suspend certificates of registration for public places of amusement."

Bye-law No. 10. "For levying a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound for the current municipal year." This bye-law provided that ninepence of the above rate be collected during the first half of the year, and sixpence during the remaining portion of the year.

The following are under the consideration of Government:—

Bye-law No. 11. "For licensing hawkers of vegetable produce and firewood." Forwarded on 27th January.

Bye-law No. 12. "For the regulation of public carriers, carters, and drivers of public vehicles." Forwarded on 27th February.

#### COURT HOUSE ON MARKET RESERVE.

The council have approved of a plan showing the external design and elevation of a combined court house and municipal chambers proposed to be erected on the eastern frontage of the market reserve, extending along Napier street. This step was taken in consequence of the Government engineers intimating their intention to proceed with the expenditure of the vote of £2000 for a court house. The council took advantage of that opportunity for submitting drawings of the public buildings referred to, showing a unity of design, which were accepted by the Government. The expense of that portion which will be appropriated for municipal business and other public purposes is estimated at £5000. The council, however, have no intention of proceeding with that erection in the meantime, nor will it probably be undertaken until the public thoroughfares are placed in an efficient state of repair. Notwithstanding repeated applications made by the council to the department of Public Works for the expenditure of the vote for the erection of a court house in Fitz Roy, nothing was done in the matter till the close of the last year, when that department required an indemnity from the Fitz Roy council prior to inviting tenders. This difficulty arose from the site indicated by the Fitz Roy council being vested in the city corporation under the provisions of the Fitz Roy Ward Improvement Act; the Government alleged that it was not advisable to erect public buildings on other than Crown land sites without an indemnity being obtained that it would be devoted to the purposes intended by the vote. The Fitz Roy council having furnished a bond for £1000, obtained the permission of the city council, under seal, for the appropriation of a portion of the market reserve as a site for a court house. This document, together with an additional guarantee for £2000 from the Fitz Roy council, was forwarded to Government, and on the 27th of December last a tender was accepted for the works. No steps having been taken towards the erection of the building, the council, in the beginning of February last, instructed the town clerk to enquire of the Commissioner of Public Works whether there was any cause of delay in the erection of the police court the council could assist the Government in removing. This communication was acknowledged, but nothing further was done. As a last resource the council, on the motion of councillor Langton, directed the town clerk, on 21st March last, to write to the Chief Secretary, calling his attention to the delay which has attended the outlay of the vote for the erection of a court house in Fitz Roy, setting forth the steps which have been taken by the council to secure Government in the possession of the land, and asking that the works be at once proceeded with. A reply to that communication was received from the Under Secretary, informing the council that it had been forwarded to the law officers of the Crown, and in this position the matter now stands.

#### FITZ ROY WARD IMPROVEMENT ACT.

A Bill to amend the abovenamed Act, by transferring the powers contained therein to the Fitz Roy council, together with other provisions relating thereto, has been prepared by the municipal solicitor, Mr. Brodribb, and been introduced in the Legislative Assembly by Mr. Embling, M.L.A., when it was referred to a select committee for their report.

#### WATER SUPPLY.

The council having obtained the "additional information" referred to in their last half-yearly report, have since laid the whole of their water scheme and proceedings relative thereto before a public meeting of the ratepayers, when a motion authorising them (the council) to apply to Parliament for the necessary powers to carry out the project was carried all but unanimously, only one hand being held up against it.

The council are, accordingly, proceeding vigorously with their bill, under the management of B. Cowderoy, Esq., J.P., their Melbourne agent.

#### PUBLIC WORKS.

The council, during the half-year ending 9th October, 1859, in order to complete several important works in the most favorable season of the year, anticipated a portion of the revenue for 1860, and until the debt thus contracted was paid off, they resolved to undertake no new works.

They consequently, at the commencement of the half-year just ended, dispensed with the services of the town surveyor, and entrusted to the town clerk the carrying out, by day labor, such repairs as were absolutely required on the roads and streets of the municipality. And as a further means of retrenchment, they reduced the salary of the latter gentleman for the present year by one hundred pounds.

#### APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

For a site for a general public school.—Site reserved at the corner of Ford and Kars streets, adjoining the new gaol.

For a further grant towards laying out public garden reserve.—Promised, but amount not fixed.

For a reserve outside the municipality for the purposes of public commongage.—Declined, present state of the law not permitting it.

For the appointment of a keeper for the powder magazine.—No provision on the Estimates.

For a grant for completing the Town Hall, and adapting it for a police court.—£1000 granted.

Reiterated application for the erection of a time ball.—No funds available at present.

"I informed Mr. Rigg of the result, and he went on digging, as I understand, with your assistance. About July last, I was again at his place; I met you there. Above ten tons of quartz had been raised. I agreed to make a rude machine to test it. About a fortnight afterwards I sent up the machine. I went up, erected the crusher, and worked it for fully three days.



"I pounded very roughly about 11-cwt. of quartz. Two bags were picked of what was supposed to be the richest, two of the poorest, and one of the medium quality. The pounded stuff was simply washed in tin dishes, and the product of the 11 cwt. was about eighteen ounces of crude gold, which was smelted into an ingot, now in your possession, weighing upwards of fourteen ounces.

"You then arranged that all the quartz that had been raised should be sent to town. I was to see to its being crushed. About 17 tons were crushed. Nearly one-half went through the amalgamating process; the other half was washed over shoots covered with blankets. The result from the washing was more favourable than from the amalgamating process. The exact difference I cannot state, but it was considerable, and the quartz submitted to each process was taken indifferently from the lot.

"I have no account of the exact number of ounces of pure gold extracted from the 17 tons of quartz, but the net result was upwards of £490 (Four hundred and eighty pounds) sterling. One day's washing, about 5 ounces' was lost. Adding the value of that amount to the net return, the value realised per ton of quartz would be very close on £30 (Thirty pounds) sterling.

"I may state that twelve months ago, I took up an experienced reefer with me to your diggings. I got him to dig out some of the quartz with his own hands. He predicted that the reef would produce from 8 to 10 ounces of gold to the ton, his prediction has so far proved correct. He tried the washing stuff, and declared it to be very valuable indeed.
