LAND SET APART AT BALLAARAT WEST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Ballarat West, as a site for a Telegraph Office.

A plan, showing the metes and bounds of the land so set apart, is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND SET APART.—Twenty perches, county of Grenville, parish of Ballarat: Commencing at a point on the east side of Lydiard street, said point bearing north two chains sixty-five links from the intersection of the east side of Lydiard street with the north side of Sturt street; bounded on the west by the east side of Lydiard street, bearing north one chain; on the north by a line bearing east one chain twenty-five links; on the east by a line bearing south one chain; and on the south by a line bearing west one chain twenty-five links to the point of commencement.

LAND SET APART AT BALLAN.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, as a site for a Race-course, and for other purposes of public recreation, at Ballan, in lieu of the site previously set apart for the same purposes.

A plan, showing the metes and bounds of the land so set apart, is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND SET APART.—Two hundred acres, county of Grant, parish unnamed, situate at the intersection of the Moorabool River and the main line of road from Ballarat to Ballan: Commencing at the south-east corner, being a point bearing north 87 degrees 34 minutes west nineteen chains forty-four links from the south-west angle of allotment 24 of section 1, parish of Gorong, bounded on the east by the west side of a road one chain fifty links wide, bearing north sixty-two chains ninety-three links; thence on the north by a line bearing west fifty-three chains thirteen links to the left bank of the Moorabool River; thence by the left bank of the Moorabool, bearing south-easterly to a point on the left bank bearing north 87 degrees 34 minutes west from the commencing point; bounded on the south by the north side of the main line of road from Ballarat to Ballan, bearing south 87 degrees 34 minutes east, and following said north side of road to the commencing point.

A plan, showing the metes and bounds of the land so set apart, is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND SET APART.—Two acres, county of Bourke, parish of Cut-paw-paw, part of allotment G, of section 14: Commencing at a point on the north side of the boundary of the Melbourne and Sandhurst railway, said point bearing west one chain eighty links from the intersection of the north-west side of the main line of road from Melbourne to Geelong with the north side of the railway boundary aforesaid; bounded on the east by a line bearing north two chains; on the north-east by a line bearing north 51 degrees 20 minutes west six chains forty links; on the west by a line bearing south six chains; and on the south by the north side of the Melbourne and Sandhurst railway, bearing east five chains to the point of commencement.
