LAND SET APART AT BALLAARAT WEST.

LAND SET APART AT BALLAARAT WEST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Ballaarat West, as a site for a Telegraph Office.

A plan, showing the metes and bounds of the land so set apart, is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND SET APART.—Twenty perches, county of Grenville, parish of Ballaarat: Commencing at a point on the east side of Lydiard street, said point bearing north two chains sixty-five links from the intersection of the east side of Lydiard street; bounded on the west by the cast side of Lydiard street, bearing north one chain; on the north by a line bearing east one chain twenty-five links; on the east by a line bearing south one chain; and on the south by a line bearing west one chain twenty-five links to the point of commencement.

A plan, showing the motes and bounds of the land so set apart, is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melhourne.

Description of the Land set apart,—Two landred acres, county of Grant, parish unnamed, situate at the intersection of the Moorarbool River and the main line of road from Ballaarat to Ballan: Commencing at the south-east corner, being a point bearing north 87 degrees 34 minutes west nineteen chains forty-four links from the south-west angle of allotment 24 of section 1, parish of Gorong; bounded on the east by the west side of a road one chain fifty links wide, bearing north sixty-two chains ninety-three links; thence on the north by a line bearing west fifty-three chains thirteen links to the left bank of the Moorarbool River; thence by the left bank of the Moorarbool, bearing south-easterly to a point on the left bank bord and the south by the north side of the main line of road from Ballaarat to Ballan, bearing south 87 degrees 31 minutes west from the commencing point: bounded on the south by the north side of the main line of road from Ballaarat to Ballan, bearing south 87 degrees 31 minutes east, and following said north side of road to the commencing point.
