SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY  
POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF  
TARADALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Taradale, in the county of Talbot, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

The boundaries of the township of Taradale: Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the township reserve, said point bearing south 27 degrees 23 minutes east one chain and thirteen links from the south-east angle of suburban allotment No. 31 of section 19, bounded on part of the south by a line (being the south side of a road one chain wide) bearing west sixty-three chains seventy-nine links; thence on the west by a line bearing north (crossing the main line of road from Melbourne to Castlemaine and Sandhurst) one hundred and twenty chains and twenty-eight links, more or less, to the north-west angle of suburban allotment 19 of section 9; thence on part of the north by the north boundaries of suburban allotments 19, 20, 21, 9, 8 and 7, of section 9, and the north boundary of allotment 2, section 8; again on the north by a prolongation of the last named line bearing east sixteen chains seventy-eight links more or less, to the left bank of the Coliban River; thence on the east by the said left bank of the Coliban River bearing southerly and south-easterly to a point on said left bank, bearing due east from the commencing point; thence on the remainder of the south by a line bearing west (again crossing the main road from Melbourne to Castlemaine) and following said line to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of May, in the 23rd year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROPOSED ROAD.  
COUNTY OF BOURKE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Bourke, hereinafter described, proposed to be opened by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the name of the owner and occupier thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED DEVIATION OF THE MELBOURNE AND BALLAARAT ROAD, IN THE PARISH OF GORONG, IN THE COUNTY OF BOURKE.—The centre line of this deviation begins at a point six chains south 80 degrees 11 minutes east of the south-west angle of allotment 2 of section X. of the parish of Gorong, and bears thence north 60 degrees 2 minutes west for eleven chains sixty-two links; thence north 76 degrees 30 minutes west for 7 chains; thence south 72 degrees 50 minutes west for six chains ninety links to a point eighteen chains fifty links north 80 degrees 11 minutes west of the south-west angle of allotment 2 of section VI., of the parish of Gorong, the road being one and a half chains wide.

The name of the owner and occupier of allotment 2 is T. Pyke, and the name of the owner and occupier of allotment 3 is J. Evans.

The quantity of land proposed to be taken from allotment 2 is 1a. 0r. 16p. The quantity of land proposed to be taken from allotment 3 is 5a. 2r. 34p.

The estimated cost of effecting this deviation is £81 7s. 6d., viz., £68 2s. 6d., the compensation for 6a. 3r. 10p. of land at £10 an acre, and £13 5s. for shifting twenty-nine chains of the present fence and supplying three chains of new fence.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, Office of Roads and Bridges, Melbourne, within forty days of the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

#### LAND SET APART AT ALBERTON.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by two Orders made on the 27th of June, 1859, and the 30th of April, 1860, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate in the parish of Alberton, Gipps Land, for a Public Cemetery.

ON the 30th day of September, 1859, His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, K.C.B., Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c., in pursuance of the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, proclaimed the district hereinafter described as a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—The Municipal District of Hotham: Commencing at that point intersected by lines passing through the centre of Victoria street and the centre of Elizabeth street; thence by a line passing through the centre of Victoria street and by a line bearing west to a marked post at the western boundary of the city of Melbourne; thence by a line bearing north to the Flemington road; and thence by a line passing through the centre of the Flemington road and through the centre of Elizabeth street to the commencing point.

#### COURT OF PETTY SESSIONS.

The council had many difficulties to contend with in prevailing upon the Government to grant a local court; deputations were sent, petitions and other means were used, until at length the court was granted, and it is hoped that very soon the beneficial result will be seen by the removal of nuisances and the improved sanitary condition of the district.

The valuation of rateable property within the municipal district, after deducting the reductions made by the court of appeal, is £49,503, yielding a revenue, at one shilling and sixpence in the pound, of £3712 4s. 6d.

#### APPEALS.

With a view to obviate the necessity of persons appealing to the court of petty sessions against the assessment made on their properties, the council informed the ratepayers, on the assessment notice papers, that they would meet on a certain day to hear appeals made to the council; very few of the ratepayers were dissatisfied with the decisions arrived at by the council, and

at the court of appeal recently held, presided over by the Hon. Mr. Vaughan, M.L.C., some of those that appealed from the council's decision were either not reduced from the amount rated by the valuator, or not to the extent the council was willing to reduce, very few being reduced below the amount named by the council.
