THE CRANBOURNE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Mornington, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Bounded on the north between the Cardinia Creek and the Carrum Swamp, by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Cranbourne and Lyndhurst, bearing east and west; on the east by the Cardinia Creek and the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Cranbourne and Lyndhurst, southwards to the shores of Western Port (skirting the east boundary of Michle's pre-emptive right and the western bank of Sawtell's Creek); thence on the south by the shores of Western Port, bearing westerly to the south angle of the parish of Langwarrin; thence by the south boundary of the last named parish to the south-west angle of section 70 of the said parish; and thence northerly, westerly, and northerly again by the western boundaries of the parishes of Langwarrin and Lyndhurst home to the north-west angle of the parish of Lyndhurst, being the west end of the first described northern boundary line. The said road district of Cranbourne including the whole of the parishes of Lyndhurst, Cranbourne, Langwarrin, and Sherwood. And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Cranbourne Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

LAND SET APART AT PARKSIDE, NORTH MELBOURNE.
THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, set apart the land hereinafter described, comprising about seven acres and three quarters, situate at Parkside, North Melbourne, for permissive occupancy by the Port Phillip Farmers' Association, on condition that for the present the manure depot and access to it be not interfered with.

MUNICIPALITY OF AVOCA.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF FIRST MOIETY OF GRANT-IN-AID FOR 1890.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled: *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the execution of public works within the boundaries of such municipal district, by funds obtained in aid from the Government or otherwise: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Avoca, that the sum of Four hundred and eighty pounds, first moiety of Government grant-in-aid for 1890, be appropriated more or less in the construction of municipal baths at Avoca.

MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—FOR REGULATING BUILDING OPERATIONS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BRUNSWICK.

WHEREAS under the 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that every municipal council shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, &c., and shall and may make bye-laws for carrying out these objects: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Brunswick, that from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, no builder or other person shall commence erecting or pulling down any building, or placing any materials for or from the same, in or abutting on any public street, lane, court or alley, to which the public may have access within the municipality, without first obtaining a license in form set forth in Schedule A., hereto annexed, from the said council to authorise him to deposit such building materials. Before any such deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient boarding shall be erected, to be placed round such materials, to the satisfaction of the council, their surveyor or other officer, and a light, or so many lights as the case may require, shall be kept in a conspicuous place thereon, burning from sunset to sunrise. No such material shall encroach more than one-third of the width of the roadway so as to render any road impassable to vehicles, and the footways and gutters or drains shall in all cases be kept free.

The license shall remain in force for twenty-one days from the date thereof, and no longer, but may be renewed on application to the council, town clerk, or other officer.

Any builder or other person refusing to show his license when required to do so by the surveyor or other authorised officer of the council, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person, and any person producing such license which has been in any way altered shall be deemed an unlicensed person.

Any person depositing building materials without being licensed so to do, or exceeding the powers by such license, or in any other way failing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and any person failing to remove any scaffolding, boarding, &c., as aforesaid, on being called on to do so by the proper authority, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding One pound per day for every day that it may continue and not be removed: Provided always that such cumulative penalty shall not exceed on the whole the sum of Twenty pounds.

The council or their surveyor may, however, call as frequently as he or they may deem necessary or proper, on any person contravening this regulation, to remove forthwith the cause of offence, and the refusal or delay to obey any and every such call be and be deemed to be a separate and distinct offence under this bye-law, and shall subject the offender to the penalty hereinbefore set forth.

Builder's License.

These are to certify that _____ of street, Brunswick, is hereby authorised to erect scaffolding, fence-site, and deposit building materials in within the municipality of Brunswick, for the space of twenty-one days from the date hereof, such materials to be deposited in accordance with the provisions of section 7 of the Town and Country Police Act, 18 Victoria No. 14.

Conditions.

No builder shall commence erecting or pulling down any building, or placing materials for or from the same, on or abutting on any public thoroughfare or street, lane, court, alley, &c., to which the public may have access within the municipality of Brunswick, without first obtaining a license from the municipal council to authorise such deposit of building materials.

The amount chargeable for such license shall be 5s., and the said license shall continue and be in force for twenty-one days from the date hereof, and no longer.

Any person producing such license as then in force which has been in any manner altered, shall be deemed an unlicensed person.

Any person refusing to show his license when so required by any authorised officer, shall be deemed and dealt with as an unlicensed person.

Before any deposit shall be made, a good and sufficient boarding shall be placed round such materials to the satisfaction of the council or their authorised officer; and a light in a conspicuous position shall be kept burning from sunset to sunrise.

No such materials shall encroach more than one-third of the width of any roadway, so as to render any road impassable for vehicles. The footways and gutters must in all cases be kept free.

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 29.—TO EMPOWER THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EAST COLLINGWOOD TO MAINTAIN AND MANAGE A FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY, ON THE MUNICIPAL SITE, JOHNSTON STREET, EAST COLLINGWOOD, TO BE OPEN DAILY TO EVERY RESIDENT THEREIN, WITHOUT PAYMENT.

(Under the 18 Victoria No. 15.)

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, &c., &c., and for the general good rule and government of such municipal district, and every such municipal council may also make such bye-laws as may be necessary for the establishment of public libraries, museums, botanical gardens, or other public places of recreation, and the maintenance and management thereof: And whereas it is expedient and highly desirable to promote the mental and moral improvement of the youths and adults in the municipal district of East Collingwood, who may desire to avail themselves of opportunity for their mental culture: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after the date of a building being erected on the municipal site for a free public library, for reference and also for circulation, when the latter may be so determined by the council; that the same shall be efficiently managed by the municipal council of East Collingwood, in such manner as may best conduce to the public usefulness of the said free public library; the current expenses incurred in the management and in the maintenance of the building for such purpose in efficient repair, shall be paid from municipal funds, together with a special grant of not less than One hundred pounds (£100) annually towards the purchase of books and other literary and scientific publications suitable for such free public library.

That any person entering the public library in a state of intoxication, or using therein unbecoming language, or disturbing readers or other persons therein by noises of any offensive kind, or that any person whilst using the said library, or whilst being therein, who may deface, mutilate, or otherwise injure books, maps, plates, or other publications deposited in such library, shall be subject to a penalty, upon conviction of any of the said offences, of a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRE AND THE DANGERS TO LIFE AND PROPERTY ARISING THEREFROM.

WHEREAS by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule, &c., &c.: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Daylesford:—

1. That it shall not be lawful for any roof or other exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, or bark to be placed upon or on the outside of any building to be erected within the boundaries of the township of Daylesford, unless situated twenty feet from any other building, nor shall it be lawful for any such now in use to be repaired or renewed with like material unless situated twenty feet from any building as aforesaid.

2. That it shall not be lawful to keep any stack or stacks of hay, corn, or straw of any description on premises within the aforesaid boundaries, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building of which no exterior part or covering shall be of canvas, calico, or any other like textile fabric whatever.

3. That it shall not be lawful to erect any brush or bush fence, either as side or party fence, for any purpose, and that all brush or brush fences must be removed.

4. That in case where it shall be made to appear before any two or more justices of the peace that the chimney or flue of any house or building has taken fire from the occupier of any such building having omitted to cause such chimney to be regularly swept or cleaned, or from any other neglect of such occupier or of his or her servant or servants, such occupier shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. That it shall not be lawful to alter, or repair, or erect any chimney, vent, or flue of any dangerous or inflammable material, or of any other than brick, stone, iron, or earthwork of sufficient solidity and proper construction, or to light or have any fire burning in any street, lane, road or public place, or within or upon any yard or premises, except at a distance from any building or enclosure, or party wall, of not less than twenty feet.

That in case it shall be made to appear before any two or more justices of the peace that any chimney, vent, or flue of any house or building is constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney, vent, or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials, or that any such chimney, vent, or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke, so that it becomes a nuisance or is dangerous to the neighbors, it shall be lawful for such justices to order the owner or occupier of such premises to alter such chimney, vent, or flue so as to abate or remedy any such danger or nuisance; and upon the neglect or refusal of such owner or occupier to comply with such order, or on the infringement by any owner or occupier of any of the provisions of this bye-law or neglecting or refusing to comply with the same, he or she shall be liable, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

And be it further enacted, that this bye-law, and all the provisions thereof aforesaid, shall henceforth extend and take effect within the boundaries of the township of Daylesford.

MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR COMPELLING THE FENCING OF CERTAIN LANDS ABUTTING UPON THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that the council of every municipal district shall, amongst other things, have the care and management of the roads, public streets, and paths within such municipal district: And whereas it is necessary for the due preservation of the paths and water-tables in this municipal district that all lands alienated from the Crown abutting upon such paths and water-tables be fenced on the side or sides abutting upon such paths and water-tables: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Kyneton, that after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, every person or persons being the owner, occupier, or trustee, owners, occupiers, or trustees, of any land abutting upon any path which now is, or which may hereafter be, made within the said municipal district, shall, on receiving a notice to that effect from the council, or their officer appointed for that purpose, fence in or cause to be fenced in with a good and substantial fence the frontage of such land abutting upon such path, so as to prevent horses, cattle, carts, drays, waggons, or other animals or vehicles from crossing over the same; and in case such owner, occupier, or trustee, owners, occupiers, or trustees, shall not within twenty-one days after the receipt of such notice fence in or cause to be fenced in the frontage of such land as aforesaid, such owner, occupier, or trustee, owners, occupiers, or trustees, shall, on conviction thereof before any two of Her Majesty's justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence, refusal, or neglect, a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

On the 15th February councillors Edward Cox and Andrew Gilmour resigned their seats in the council, and on the 20th March Charles Callaway and Henry Robinson were elected to serve in their places.

On the 12th April Isaiah Andrews was elected a member of council, in the place of Henry Hayton Radcliffe, who had been rendered ineligible by non-attendance.

BYE-LAWS.

Bye-law No. 7, for levying a rate of One shilling and three-pence in the pound on all rateable property within the municipality, has been made by the council, and received the assent of His Excellency the Governor.

ASSESSMENT.

By the annual valuation returns property to the amount of £15,380 has been assessed, and a rate of One shilling and three-pence in the pound levied thereon, giving an annual revenue of £961 5s., in the collection of which the council regret to say that they have received much opposition from the ratepayers in the Back Creek portion of the municipality, and would draw the attention of the ratepayers generally to the fact that the Government grant-in-aid to municipalities for 1860 will, in the case of Amherst, only be paid on rates collected previous to the

30th June next, and would express the hope that, as the Back Creek portion of the municipality will require much expenditure of money before the streets and thoroughfares are in anything like good repair, the ratepayers there will see the necessity of heartily co-operating with the council in the matter, as should they continue to refuse payment of the rate, money which would have been expended in improving the streets and thoroughfares will have to be spent in legally enforcing payment thereof.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The council, in the course of the past six months, have made several applications to Government, and generally with little success, viz.:-

For the appointment of a police magistrate for the Amherst district. Reply--That provision had been made on the Estimates for two police magistrates, acting also as wardens for the Amherst district. As yet there is but one, viz., the warden, Mr. Crespiigny.

For the retiring chairman of the municipality to be made a territorial magistrate. This application was made on the 19th February last, but the Government have not yet vouchsafed a reply.

For clearing and making the road from Amherst to the Amphitheatre, *via* Lamplough. Reply---That no money could be set apart for such a purpose, and that other districts were complaining that too much had been set down on the Estimates for the Ballarat district.

For a set of standard weights and measures. Reply---That measures were in contemplation for legalizing the weights and measures in the possession of the Government previous to distributing them to the localities where they were required.

For court accommodation at Amherst.---No explicit reply.

For blinding the new metal in High street.---Referred to the road engineer. In reference to this application, the council would remark that they were twice informed by the road engineer that provision would be made in the maintenance contract for the present year for blinding the new metal in High street, yet they have since been informed such is not the case.

For a grant in aid of a sum of money collected at Back Creek for the repair of the streets, &c.---To receive consideration.

For making that portion of the Amherst and Ballarat road between Amherst and Back Creek.---Promised but not yet executed.
