CAPE OF GOOD HOPE LIGHT.

The bearings are true, and the distances nautical miles.

An iron tower has been erected on the Cape of Good Hope, a light from which will be exhibited on the 1st of May, 1860.

The tower is 30 feet above the ground, and is painted white; the light is 816 feet above the sea, and is visible in all directions from N. 34° W., round by the west, south, east, and north, to N. 7° W., save and except on a sector included between N. 54° W. and N. 61° W., where it is obscured by the intervention of a high peak, 880 feet above the sea, and 1800 yards from the light tower.

The light is on the catoptric principle, and of the first class; it is white, revolving, and shows its most brilliant beam once in a minute for the space of twelve seconds of time, and it is visible in clear weather from a deck 16 feet high at the distance of 23 miles.

Latitude of the light ... 31° 21' 12" S.
Longitude ... 18° 29' 30" E.

The light tower stands N. 49° W., 925 yards from the Dias Rock, which is the southern extremity of the Cape Peninsula.

The following bearings and distances are given from the light:—

Anvil Rocks ...	S. 54° E.	18 miles.

Whittle Rock ...	N. 27° 30' E.	7 1/2 "

A current of varied strength sets round the Cape and turns to the N.W. from the Bellows Rock. This rock always breaks; but not so the Anvil, which only breaks at low water and with a heavy swell. Sailing vessels should not pass between these dangers and the Cape, unless with a commanding breeze. The rocky patch, "S.W. Reef," lies south 42° W., one mile only from the S.W. corner of the Cape Peninsula, and there is foul rocky ground between it and the shore.

Ships from the eastward should not bring the light to bear more westerly than W. by N., by which they will clear all dangers off Cape Hanglip. A tongue of low land stretches from this Cape in a S. 23° W. direction for 1 1/2-10ths miles, rendering caution necessary in passing Hanglip in hazy weather, especially if bound into Simon's Bay. If bound for Table Bay from the eastward, vessels, after rounding the Cape of Good Hope and passing Slangkop Point, should not shut in the light with that point until the Green Point light becomes visible (which will be on a N. 41° E. bearing). This course will carry them about two miles to the westward of the Vulcan Rock, which lies off the northern entrance to Hout Bay; a course for Table Bay may then be shaped with safety.

Vessels from the westward bound for Simon's Bay—after rounding the Cape of Good Hope and having brought the southern end of the lofty Zwartkop range (which stands over the northern side of Smith's Winkle Bay) to bear west—should keep the light on Cape Point between S. 2° W. and S. 23° W., until the Roman Rock light bears between N. 30° W. and N. 47° W., when they may haul towards it. These limits leave the rocks off Millar's Point on the one hand and the Whittle Rock on the other, half a mile distant. Should the weather be hazy, and the whitewashed mark and beacon for the Whittle Rock indistinct, there is a dark peak over the southern side of Hout Bay, which being brought on with Elsey Peak on a N. 43° W. bearing, will lead clear (but close) to the westward of the Whittle Rock.

NOTICE TO SHAREHOLDERS IN MINING COMPANIES.

BY the 90th section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 22, it is enacted that no person shall be entitled to institute proceedings in any court of mines, or in any other court, or before any warden, to recover possession of any land occupied by virtue of any Miner's Right, or damages for the occupation of or encroachment upon such land, or to obtain relief as tenant in common or coadventurer in any such land, against his tenant in common or coadventurer, unless such person shall have been the holder of a Miner's Right at the time when his title to recover such possession or obtain such relief first arose or accrued.

The holder of shares in a mining company carrying on operations on Crown lands (not under lease), who has not taken out a Miner's Right, is therefore without any means of obtaining legal redress, either as against strangers or as against his fellow shareholders.

Miner's Rights can be obtained at the several Receipt and Pay Offices in Victoria, upon payment of One pound. They remain in force for one year from the time they are issued.

It is not necessary for a person to take out more than one Miner's Right, although he may be interested in a number of mining companies.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO CERTAIN MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct; and it was also enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the corporations of the city of Melbourne and of the town of Geelong, and the council of any municipal district then or thereafter to be created, should be the local boards of health within their respective limits and jurisdictions so soon as the said Act or any portion of it should be extended to such city, town, or district; And whereas the said Act has been extended to divers municipal districts, and it is deemed expedient to make the same also applicable to the districts hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force in the several municipal districts hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

POSTPONEMENT OF THE GENERAL SESSIONS AT PORTLAND, BELFAST, WARRNAMBOOL, AND SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such Courts should be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding the Courts of General Sessions of and for the districts of Portland, Belfast, Warrnambool, and Sandhurst, respectively, in manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the Courts of General Sessions in and for the districts of Portland, Belfast, Warrnambool, and Sandhurst aforesaid, during the year 1860, in manner following, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions for Portland, from Tuesday, the 10th day of July, to Thursday, the 19th day of July.

The Court of General Sessions for Belfast, from Monday, the 16th day of July, to Monday, the 23rd day of July; and from Wednesday, the 7th day of November, to Friday, the 9th day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for Warrnambool, from Friday, the 20th day of July, to Wednesday, the 25th day of July; and from Friday, the 2nd day of November, to Wednesday, the 7th day of November.

The Court of General Sessions for Sandhurst, from Tuesday, the 23th day of August, to Thursday, the 30th day of August.

LAND SET APART AT PENTRIDGE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by an Order made on the 15th of August, 1859, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate within the town reserve of Pentridge, as a site for a Public Cemetery.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by an Order made on the 30th of November, 1857, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Warrnambool, as a site for a Savings Bank.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—A BYE-LAW TO PROHIBIT THE RINGING OF BELLS, SOUNDING GONGS, OR OTHER INSTRUMENTS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas a custom has obtained within the municipal district of Sandhurst, in the colony of Victoria, of giving notice of sales by auction and performances or exhibitions at public places by ringing of bells or striking of gongs in the streets and passages of Sandhurst, and it is expedient and necessary that such ringing of bells and striking of gongs and other discordant noises should be discontinued: Be it ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst aforesaid, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, that any person who from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, save and except the town crier of the said district of Sandhurst, or any other person authorised by the said town council, and the persons ringing bells for public worship, and in case of fire where public fire-bells are erected by the said council, or cause to be rung or sounded any bell, gong, or other noisy instrument, or make any other discordant noises in any street or passage or in view of any street within the said district, shall be guilty of a nuisance, and upon conviction thereof before any two of the justices of the peace for the said district, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

HAWTHORN.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and ninety-two householders, residents in and around the township of Hawthorn, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the *Municipal Act*, resident in and around the township of Hawthorn, and within the undermentioned district, the area whereof is less than nine square miles, and wherein no point is distant six miles from any other point, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the east bank of the Yarra Yarra River, being the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of portion 28, parish of Boroodara; bounded on the north by the centre of the said road bearing east, the south side of the said road forming the northern boundaries of portions 28, 29, 35, and 69, until it intersects the western boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a prolongation of the centre line of the before-mentioned road passing through portion 70, bearing east fifty-six chains twenty links to the eastern boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a line bearing east fifty links to the centre of a road one chain wide (the west side of the said road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 70, 93, 94, 97, 98, 101, 102, 104 B, 105 B, 106 B, and 108); thence following the centre of the said road south until it intersects the north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek; thence by the said north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River, and by the north and east banks of the Yarra Yarra River to the commencing point, all in the county of Bourke.

They further state that they feel deeply interested in the progress and improvement of the said district, and are of opinion that erecting it into a municipality will prove of undoubted advantage and benefit to the inhabitants, who have at four public meetings unanimously approved of the application now made.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to cause to be published in the manner required by law the substance and prayer of this petition, and in due time to proclaim the aforesaid district to be 'The Municipal District of Hawthorn,' constituted and empowered under the provisions of the *Municipal Act*, 18 Victoria No. 15."

ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS.

THE nominations of candidates to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement by rotation of councillors W. B. Lees, James Brown, and A. E. R. McLeod, and the resignation of councillor John T. Lennon, took place at the council chambers on the 14th December, the chairman of the council presiding.

The nomination of candidates for the vacancies caused by the retiring members was first proceeded with, when Messrs. W. B. Lees, M. McCormick, James Brown, and A. E. R. McLeod, were duly proposed; there being no poll demanded, a show of hands was taken for each candidate, and resulted in Messrs. Lees, Brown, and McLeod, being re-elected.

The nomination of candidates for the vacancy occasioned by councillor Lennon's resignation was then proceeded with, when Messrs. Christian Lange, M. McCulloch, F. N. Martin, and John Rosekilly, were duly proposed. A poll having been demanded was proceeded with on the following day, and resulted as follows:—Mr. Christian Lange, 46 votes; Mr. Francis Nicholas Martin, 26; Mr. McCulloch, 11; and Mr. John Rosekilly, 48. Mr. Rosekilly was therefore declared elected.

CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL.

At the first meeting of the council after the election, councillor Samuel Lewers, J.P., was unanimously re-elected chairman of the council for the current municipal year.

ASSESSMENT.

According to the assessment made by the assessors, 580 house and land holders were duly assessed, the annual value of which property amounted to £14,084 10s., which was reduced on appeal to £14,074 10s.
