PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of May, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain premises therein described, then used as a police court, situate in the Main road, Ballarat East, were exempted from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Ballarat East: And whereas it is deemed expedient to terminate such exemption: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 27.—TO AMEND A BYE-LAW OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT, INTITULED, A BYE-LAW No. 16, "TO PREVENT THE NUISANCE ARISING FROM EXPOSING GOODS FOR SALE AND BLOCKING UP THE FOOTPATHS ON THE TOWNSHIP OF BALLAARAT."

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of public health, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law to amend a bye-law of the said municipal council, intituled, Bye-law No. 16, "To prevent the nuisance arising from exposing goods for sale and blocking up the footpaths in the township of Ballaarat." Be it therefore ordered and enacted, that after the assent of His Excellency the Governor to this bye-law, the said bye-law No. 16 of the said municipal council shall be and is hereby repealed, and the following rules and regulations substituted in lieu thereof:—That whenever goods or merchandise are exposed for sale on any of the public footpaths within the municipal district of Ballaarat, it shall not be lawful for any such goods to be exposed beyond the limit of two feet from the building line of any house, warehouse, or shop belonging to or in the occupation of the owner of such goods or merchandise so exposed for sale. That all storekeepers or others exposing goods for sale on the footpaths shall cause all such goods, empty cases, or fixtures to be removed, and leave the entire width of the footpath fronting their premises clear of every obstruction from sunset to sunrise, and during Sundays, excepting on Saturdays, when goods may be exposed for sale up to the hour of Ten o'clock p.m.; provided that the owner of the goods shall on Saturdays after sunset up to the hour of Ten o'clock p.m. keep a good and sufficient light burning to prevent robberies or any injury to passengers. And be it further enacted, that all merchants, storekeepers, and others loading or unloading goods at their stores, shall leave eight clear feet of footpath for passengers during the time of loading or unloading. And any person or persons failing to comply with the regulations of this bye-law shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 23.—TO PREVENT THE NUISANCE ARISING FROM GOATS BEING AT LARGE WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF CARISBROOK.

WHEREAS it is necessary to abate the nuisance occasioned by goats being at large in the streets or public places within the said municipal district: It is therefore ordered by the council of the municipal district of Carisbrook, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, it shall and may be lawful for the inspector of nuisances, or other person to be appointed by the said council for that purpose, to impound such goats; and if not claimed within twenty-four hours after a notice of such impounding shall have been posted up on the Town Hall, it shall be lawful for the council to order such goats to be destroyed.

MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 65.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND MANAGEMENT OF A FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PRAHRAN.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every such municipal council may also make such bye-laws as may be necessary for the establishment of public libraries, museums, botanical gardens, or other places of recreation, and the maintenance and management thereof: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Prahran, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the sum of One hundred and fifty pounds shall be expended in the maintenance of a free public library, and for the purchase of books, and other literary and scientific publications, during the municipal year ending twenty-first February, 1891.

That the library shall be managed by a committee of three councillors, who shall carry out such rules and regulations as shall from time to time be approved of by the municipal council. That any person entering the library in a state of intoxication, or using any unbecoming language, or disturbing the readers or others therein by noises of an offensive kind, defacing, mutilating, injuring, or removing therefrom any books, maps, plates, or other publications or property, shall, upon conviction of any of the said offences before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.
