THE following Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the members of the Castlemaine Light Dragoons, having received the approval of His Excellency the Governor, are now published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CASTLEMAINE LIGHT DRAGOONS.

1. The regiment shall be open to all respectable persons. Each candidate for admission shall be recommended in writing, addressed to the adjutant by two members, who shall in such recommendation give the full name, place of abode, and profession or occupation of the candidate, and the adjutant shall immediately communicate the application to the commanding officer.

2. A general meeting of the members shall be held annually during the month of June, for the purpose of electing a council, of which at least fourteen (14) clear days' notice shall be given by advertisement and circular.

3. The affairs of the regiment shall be under the control of a council consisting of twelve (12) members, to be elected annually by ballot at the general meeting in June, or any adjournment thereof; five (5) to form a quorum. The commanding officer, adjutant, and treasurer, to be members *ex officio*.

4. The council shall annually appoint a secretary, and a treasurer shall be elected annually by ballot by the members generally out of the whole corps.

5. The council shall meet on the first Monday in each month, and shall keep minutes of its proceedings, which shall be open to perusal of all members of the regiment at reasonable times. The council shall have power to elect new members *ad interim* to fill up any vacancy occurring in the council during the course of the year, and also to make bye-laws for the regulation of all matters connected with the regiment. The whole council shall go out of office on the day of the general meeting in June, but all or any of the council shall be eligible for re-election.

6. That each member shall pay an entrance fee of Two pounds ten shillings, and a half-yearly subscription of Two pounds ten shillings, which shall fall due and be payable on the 30th days of June and December.

7. That a list of all members whose annual subscription shall be in arrear for upwards of thirty days shall be placed in the orderly room, and every defaulter shall have a written notice sent to him, according to his last known address, by the treasurer; and if after the lapse of fourteen days from the date of such notice the said subscription shall be still in arrear, such defaulter shall be subjected to a fine of One pound, which fine, as well as his subscription, if not paid within fourteen days from the date on which the same is entered in the fine book, the defaulter shall be prosecuted for the same, and shall forthwith be struck off the roll of members.

8. Any member wishing to resign must obtain the consent of the commanding officer in writing before sending in his resignation.

9. Any member not attending at least one adjutant's drill in the month shall be fined Five shillings.

10. Any commissioned officer absent from the commanding officer's inspection shall be liable to a fine of One pound; if a non-commissioned officer, to a fine of (15) Fifteen shillings; all other members to a fine of (10) Ten shillings.

11. If any member shall be absent from drill for the space of three months, the council shall have the power of striking the name off the roll, unless leave of absence be granted by the commanding officer in writing, or some other sufficient cause be shown for the non-attendance.

12. Due notice shall be given by the adjutant or sergeant-major of all field days, drills, or parades, by notice posted in the orderly room, or otherwise.

13. That in the event of the commanding officer or the council inflicting any fine or fines, and the same shall remain unpaid for twenty-one days after demand made for payment thereof, the member so fined, and refusing or neglecting to pay, shall be prosecuted for recovery of the amount due, and his name struck off the roll of members.

14. A book shall be kept, called the "Fine Book," in which shall be entered all fines inflicted by the commanding officer or council, and the reason for which such fine has been inflicted, and the name of the offender, and each entry or fine signed by the commanding officer or chairman of the council, as the case may require.

15. No member will be allowed to enter the ranks of the regiment mounted on a horse or mare under fifteen hands high, or which shall not in all respects meet with the approval of the commanding officer.

16. That it shall be in the power of the commanding officer at any time to call a special general meeting of the members.

17. That it shall be competent for any five members of the regiment by writing to require the commanding officer to convene a special general meeting of the members, which meeting must be forthwith called by him, giving not less than five days' notice, by advertisement or circular, of the day, hour, and place of meeting: Provided, however, that every such requisition shall state distinctly the subject matter to be considered, and that at every such meeting (at which fifteen members at least shall be present), no business shall be transacted which shall not have been specified in the requisition upon which it shall have been called.

18. That at every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. That no person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover, who will be entitled to reply. That all motions shall be delivered to the chairman in writing, and be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or

more members. That no protest shall be allowed or received. That no meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a question for that purpose.

19. At any meeting of the council or general meeting the chairman for the time being shall not be entitled to vote, except on the occasion of an equality of votes, when he shall have a casting vote.

20. At the annual general meeting two auditors shall be elected for the year.

21. The accounts of the regiment shall be made up to the 30th of June in each year, duly audited and laid before the next annual general meeting.

22. The property of the regiment shall be vested in the commanding officer for the time being.

23. Any member guilty of insubordination whilst on duty may be ordered under arrest by the senior officer present, whereupon such member, if an officer, shall then deliver up his sword to the adjutant; and if a non-commissioned officer or private, to the regimental sergeant-major; and any member who, after being placed under arrest, shall appear in public in the uniform of the corps, before he shall have been duly released from such arrest, shall forfeit and pay the sum of Five pounds sterling.

24. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

That a court martial have power to censure, fine, or expel, and to order such publication of any decision as the court shall think fit.

Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.

That all courts martial shall consist of one non-commissioned officer and six privates, all to be elected by ballot out of the regiment.

That a list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who, on showing sufficient cause, may object to any of the members of the court; and if the objection be allowed by the commanding officer, a fresh ballot shall take place for another or other members in room of the member or members objected to.

That the proceedings and order to be observed on courts martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those of Her Majesty's army.

That the decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, shall be final.

25. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice thereof in writing to the adjutant within eight days, under a penalty of Five shillings.

26. All members shall be liable to be sent to instruction drill by the commanding officer when considered by him to be necessary.

27. All communications from members, of whatever rank, must be couched officially, and addressed to the care of the adjutant.

28. Any member appearing on parade not having his horse, arms, accoutrements (or ammunition if served out), in good and serviceable condition, or not being dressed or equipped in accordance with the established regulations, shall be liable, in the discretion of the commanding officer, to pay a fine not exceeding One pound.

29. Talking in the ranks, or inattention to instruction at drill, shall subject the offender to a fine not exceeding Ten shillings.

30. Any member breaking any of the laws or bye-laws of the regiment, or otherwise misconducting himself when in uniform, shall be dealt with according to the discretion of the council, with right, however, of appeal against the sentence or decision of the council to a general meeting.

31. Members will be responsible for the good and serviceable order and condition of their arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by the member causing the same.

32. No changes whatever shall be made in the dress of the regiment unless published in regimental orders.

33. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding, or adding any rule or regulation of the regiment, must give fourteen days' notice of the same in writing to the adjutant, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition, to be hung up in the orderly room.

34. It shall not be competent to recommend to His Excellency the Governor any alteration or rescission of or addition to the existing rules of the regiment, unless such shall have been agreed to by an absolute majority of the whole regiment.

35. Any member who shall become a candidate for the rank of commissioned officer shall undergo an examination as to his fitness for such promotion before a board of examiners, to be appointed by the commanding officer (and which examination shall be irrespective of and without prejudice to any examination which such candidate shall be required to undergo under any Act or Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, now in force or to be in force hereafter regarding the qualification and appointment of officers to volunteer corps); and no member shall be recommended by the commanding officer for promotion unless such member shall have satisfactorily passed such examination, and received a written certificate from the board of examiners to that effect.

ARMS AND ACCOUTREMENTS.

Each member of the regiment to have a sword and revolver, revolver pouch, white buff leather sword-belt and slings, white buff leather shoulder belt, and black patent leather cartouche box, and white leather gloves; all buckles or rings to be brass or gilt, with regulation steel spurs, all subject to the inspection and approval of the commanding officer.

HORSE EQUIPMENT.

Every member must provide himself with a good saddle, a saddle cloth according to pattern, a military bit and bridle, leather head-stall, breast-plate, regulation stirrup leathers and leathers, all according to pattern, and subject to the approval of the commanding officer.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DAYLESFORD VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE following Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the members of the Daylesford Volunteer Rifle Corps, having received the approval of His Excellency the Governor, are now published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DAYLESFORD VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

1. That the corps shall be styled "The Daylesford Volunteer Rifle Corps," and every member shall be subject to the following rules and regulations.

2. Every member for admission to the corps shall make a personal or written application to the captain commanding, stating name, place of abode, and occupation. The names of all applicants to be read to the corps after next parade.

3. Every member, on joining, shall attend instruction drill at least twice a week, and shall not appear in uniform until he shall have been dismissed drill.

4. On all occasions of promotion to the rank of non-commissioned officer, three candidates shall be chosen by ballot at a general meeting of the corps; each member to name three, or his vote shall be null and void. A selection from these three shall be made by the commanding officer.

5. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he shall have been dismissed from instruction drill.

6. All members changing their permanent address must within thirty days give notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Five shillings (5s.).

7. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days, must give notice of such intention in writing to the commanding officer, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in a place to be appointed by the commanding officer, under a penalty of Ten shillings (10s.).

8. Any member desiring to retire from the corps shall be required to give fourteen days notice to the officer commanding the corps, when, if approved of, his rifle and accoutrements must be returned to such officer immediately on receipt of advice that his resignation has been accepted; but should the corps have been (previous to the receipt of such resignation), called into active service by competent authority, then the officer commanding volunteers in the colony will decide whether such resignation be accepted or not.

9. There shall be four parades of the corps in each month, one of which shall be the commanding officer's parade. The undermentioned fines shall be imposed on any member absenting himself from commanding officer's parade, viz.:-

and the same fines will be inflicted on any member neglecting to attend any of the other parades during the month, unless good and sufficient reason be given to the officer commanding, in writing, on or before the last day of the month.

10. At every parade, on the roll being called, any member not answering to his name shall be deemed absent, unless a sufficient reason has been previously forwarded to the commanding officer within seven days of the absence. Any member coming late, and assigning a reason for so doing which is deemed sufficient by the commanding officer, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

11. Any member who, after having been provided with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each offence.

12. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularity on parade, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

13. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms and accoutrements, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

14. The officer commanding the corps may at any time convene a general meeting, at which no rule or bye-law shall be passed unless due notice, by advertisement or circular, shall have been given. At every meeting the senior officer present shall preside.

15. That a committee shall be appointed to take the management of the general business of the corps, and also, to decide upon all matters left by the rules for their decision; such committee to consist of five members, to be balloted for by the corps, the officer commanding, and three senior officers; three (3) to form a quorum; the committee to be elected for six (6) months; retiring members to be eligible for re-election.

16. The officer commanding shall fix the time and place for drill, parade, and practice, and other meetings not provided for in these rules.

17. A book shall be kept called the Fine Book, in which all fines shall be entered and signed by the commanding officer; a separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the receiving officer; this book shall be kept by the commanding officer, and shall be produced when required.

18. All fines collected shall be appropriated to such uses as the committee appointed under these rules shall decide, and at every general meeting of the members, which general meeting shall be held half-yearly, the secretary shall submit a statement of such fines and of their appropriation for the information of the corps.

19. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer, or others duly appointed by the commanding officer to receive the same, within fourteen days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment will be proceeded against according to law.

20. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

21. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.

22. A court martial shall have the power to censure, fine to the extent of Five pounds (£5), or expel.

23. All courts martial shall consist of seven members, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, including the president, of whom one at least shall be a commissioned or non-commissioned officer. The president shall be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members shall be taken from a roster.

24. The forms to be observed on courts martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's army.

25. A list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who may object to any of the members, such objections to be limited to ten (10) in number.

26. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

27. Members of the corps are liable to be placed under arrest under the following circumstances, viz.:-

1st. By order of the commanding officer of the corps, pending investigation of any charge.

2nd. By the senior officer or non-commissioned officer present, for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without any remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress, (the same to be reported to commanding officer as soon as possible). No person placed in arrest may at any time wear his uniform until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

28. That it shall be compulsory on every member to attend two (2) drills in the week, without reference to any particular day, until dismissed drill, or be fined. That the subscription be Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per month, to be paid monthly in advance.

29. Bye-laws not inconsistent with these regulations, or with the provisions of the Acts of the Legislative Council, 18th Victoria No. 7 and 19th Victoria No. 8, may be made by any members of the corps, and if approved of by the commanding officer, shall be by him submitted for confirmation or rejection at a general meeting of the corps called for the purpose; and every such bye-law, if confirmed at such general meeting, shall be binding on all members of the corps; and non-compliance with any such bye-law will render the offender liable to a fine not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.).

30. Every member, on joining, shall be supplied with a copy of these rules and regulations.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

ST. ARNAUD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-eight householders and landowners resident at and near St. Arnaud, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that the town of St. Arnaud is situated in the centre of the large mining division of the same name, and has been surveyed and sold in part about three years; that it contains a settled mining and trading population, that large sums are being invested in permanent buildings owing to the stability and progress of its mining companies, and that its population is steadily increasing.

They further state that four sales of land have taken place at St. Arnaud, whereat town lands realized £800 per acre, and suburban lands (most of which are under cultivation) from 50s. to £5 10s. per acre, and that notwithstanding the large sums paid to Government for lands, no provision has been made for roads, bridges, or approaches to the town, or within a distance of forty miles thereof, and that the heavy traffic through the town frequently renders the thoroughfares impassable.

The petitioners accordingly are of opinion that the erection of their locality into a municipality will greatly advance its interests and prosperity, and conduce to its permanent improvement and good government; and they suggest the following boundaries, viz.:-

Commencing at a point forty chains south of the south-east angle of the St. Arnaud town boundary; thence west one hundred and sixty chains; thence north forty chains; thence west forty chains; thence north two hundred chains; thence east two hundred chains; thence south one hundred and twenty chains; thence east eighty chains; thence south twenty chains; thence by a line bearing north 71° 15' east one hundred and twenty chains; thence south sixty chains; thence south 71° 15' west two hundred and eight chains to the point of commencement.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

"We, the undersigned householders and landowners resident within the area (above) set forth most respectfully pray your Excellency will cause the said area to be proclaimed a Municipal District in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, under the style and title of 'The Municipality of Saint Arnaud.'"

COUNTER-PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF MALMSBURY.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the following counter-petition (signed by the chairman of a public meeting of the ratepayers of the Lauriston and Edgecombe Road District, held in the Mechanics' Institute, Kyneton, on Saturday, the 20th day of July last, on behalf of the said meeting), in opposition to a petition for the creation of a municipal district at Malmbsbury, published on the 28th of June last (p. 1243 *ante*).

"That a petition has been recently presented to your Excellency, praying that the township of Malmbsbury and a portion of the adjacent country might be proclaimed a municipal district, under the title of the Malmbsbury Municipal District; that the proposed boundaries of the said municipal district would, if proclaimed, include a large portion of purely agricultural land, as shewn by the accompanying map, the owners and tenants of which would in no way be benefited by the proposed municipality; that the rates of the Lauriston and Edgecombe Road District would be seriously diminished, and thereby the whole of the district would suffer, as the rates which would hereafter be paid to the proposed municipality would be only expended in improving the roads and streets of the said municipality, whereas at present the rates are expended in constructing, repairing, and improving the roads, bridges, culverts, and other works throughout the whole of the Lauriston and Edgecombe Road District.

"The memorial further sheweth that the said petition above named was signed by several persons who are not residents or owners of property within the said proposed boundaries, as well as by persons who were not aware of the extent of the same, and who would not have signed had they been in possession of that information, and who hereby request that their names may be erased from the said petition.

"Your memorialist therefore prays your Excellency not to grant the prayer of the said petition, and to allow the boundaries of the said road district to remain undisturbed as heretofore defined and proclaimed.

"And your memorialist, on behalf of the said ratepayers, will ever pray, &c., &c., &c.

STEIGLITZ PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Steiglitz Public Cemetery, under 17 Victoria No. 12.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.
2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, are entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such persons and their representatives for ever.
3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate in the form set out in schedule B will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in schedule A.
4. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.
8. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed, without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
11. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.
12. Any person or persons who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause any damage to be done to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the abovementioned Act of Council, and is liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds, or, at the discretion of the jus-

tice, to three months imprisonment, and to the payment of all damages therefor.

13. No interment allowed in common graves at a less depth from the surface than four feet, and in vaults at less than three feet from the top of the coffin.

14. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.
