THE BALLAARAT VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE following Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the members of the Ballaarat Corps of Volunteer Rifle Rangers, having been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are now published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BALLAARAT VOLUNTEER RIFLE RANGERS.

1. The regiment shall be styled "The Ballaarat Volunteer Rifle Rangers," and every member of the corps be subject to the following rules and regulations:—
2. The regiment shall be open to all persons over the age of seventeen (17), subject to the approval of the managing committee, appointed as hereinafter provided. Candidates for admission shall be proposed and seconded, in writing by members of the corps, and each candidate's name shall be read at the next weekly parade of the corps to give an opportunity to any member to object to his entrance; such objection to be laid before the managing committee.
3. No person shall be considered a member of the corps until he shall have taken the oath of allegiance to the Crown, under 18 Victoria 7, 5, and signed the enrollment list of the corps.
4. An entrance fee of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be paid by each member, and also a monthly subscription of two shillings (2s.); such subscription to be paid after the first parade of each month.
5. No commissioned or non-commissioned officer shall be appointed for two months after the first drill.
6. That each member shall attend eight (8) drills during each month, or until pronounced by the officer in command for the time being sufficiently advanced not to require such close attention.
7. That the last Wednesday of each month shall be considered commanding officer's parade day, and in case of absence of any member without sufficient excuse, a fine of 2s. 6d. will be enforced.
8. That all parades shall be under the command of the senior officer on parade.
9. That within two minutes after the time appointed for drill or parade, the muster roll of members shall be called over, and every member not answering to his name shall be deemed not to be in attendance, and shall be liable to a penalty provided in these rules for each such non-attendance, except sufficient ex-

THE ELTHAM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Eltham Public Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
 2. By the eighth section of the Act, "any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever."
 3. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.
 4. All charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
 5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or graves will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
 6. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
 7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, iron, or good red gum planking.
 8. The plans of all monuments and fences to be submitted to the trustees, and any tomb, monument, or epitaph objected to will not be permitted to be erected.
 9. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule A.
 10. Any person wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.
- The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.

Repairing and maintaining in repair 244 chains of streets and roads within the municipality.

Sinking shaft and fixing dog trap at rear of new Police Barrack, Prince's street.

Repairing and maintaining 177 chains of planked and kerbed footpaths.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Grant-in-aid.

The amount received for the past year 1859-60, has not exceeded 27s. in the pound on the rates collected to the 30th April last, which shows a very considerable reduction on former years, doubtless occasioned by the large proportion of the general grant absorbed by the municipalities created out of the suburbs of Melbourne, which is severely felt by the inland districts.

Municipal Endowment.

The uncertainty of Government aid, and the comparatively small amount received by the inland municipalities for the year 1859, forced upon the notice of this and other councils the importance of securing a permanent means of endowment. To effect this object a second municipal conference was held in Melbourne, in September last, at which resolutions were carried affirming the necessity of permanent endowment by grants of land (except in special cases), and it was determined on to present a Bill to the Legislature this session, to accomplish, if possible, some settled means of obtaining necessary funds.

Assessment of Mining Plant.

Considering the wear and tear of the streets and thoroughfares caused by the cartage of heavy material in connection with mining operations, the council deemed it equitable to assess the property of mining companies, in order to defray a portion of the expense occasioned to the municipality thereby. Without reference as to what particular portion of the properties should be assessed, it must be conceded that the sum of £300, which is the total of the rate on the whole of the mining

plant in the municipality, is a very moderate sum in comparison to the expense incurred by the council, and the advantages derived by the mining interest in having accessible roads, by which firewood, timber, and other loading can be conveyed with facility; and it is to be regretted that it should have caused any dissatisfaction, or that the objections to it were not so fully brought under the notice of the council prior to the confirmation of the assessment as it was afterwards.

Water Supply.

Doubts having been expressed last summer that Yuille's Swamp would be inadequate during a dry season to supply a sufficient quantity of water for the necessities of the district, it was deemed advisable to cut drains through certain lands in the vicinity to convey the rainwater into the swamp. This work having been carried out, in conjunction with the Western Council, has realised all the benefits anticipated from it; yet, considering this means of supply in the most favorable manner, it is but a limited one for domestic purposes, and great benefits are expected to result to the health and commerce of the district when the scheme now under consideration of the Government for an abundant supply for all purposes is accomplished.

Survey of Streets, Reserves, &c.

The council having during the last three years exhausted all the ordinary means for obtaining the usual and necessary survey of the municipality without success, deemed it advisable to make a strong remonstrance to the Board of Land and Survey, which has resulted in such directions being given as promise to meet the wishes of the council, for which it is much indebted to our representative, the Hon. J. B. Humfray, M.L.A., and the late President of the Board (Dr. Groves, M.L.A.) Should, however any further obstacles arise to the carrying out these instructions, the council will not hesitate to use the utmost means within its power to accomplish this great requisite to the prosperity of the municipality.

Railway Station and Bridges.

After a station for goods and passengers having been determined on for Ballarat East, on Bakery Hill, by a former Government, and set aside by the late Government, much to the surprise of the council, it was compelled to take energetic action to have the accommodation again conceded, in which it was happily successful, together with the assurance that a bridge would be erected over Peel street. It afterwards learned with regret that the bridge was about to be placed one hundred yards eastward of the line of that street, which would entirely block it up; a deputation from the council immediately waited on the Government, and succeeded in inducing them to place it over the present line of the street.

Mining under the Swamp.

Application having been made to both councils (Ballarat East and West) to grant permission to a certain mining company to mine under the Swamp, and it having been ascertained that at the depth of the lead (300 feet) no injury would be likely to accrue to the said Swamp, the councils agreed to permit mining under certain regulations, but refuse to sanction a monopoly to any one or more companies.

Mair street Bridge.

The council regret that any misunderstanding should have arisen in reference to this intended work, which would have been undertaken some two years since, at the time the Market Reserve in Peel street was decided on, but was deferred in consequence of the obstruction offered by certain parties to the opening up of the street at Humfray street, who strenuously urged that a traffic way at that place was not necessary. During the delay occasioned in removing these obstructions, and the legal proceedings in connection therewith, the council had expended its funds in other works, so that when solicited to carry out this work, which is one involving considerable outlay, it was not in a position to do so, although fully appreciating the benefit the communication would be to the municipality.

The debt of £154 12s. 2d. due to the Bank of Victoria at the close of the last half-year has also been repaid with interest. The payment of these accounts has of necessity prevented a large expenditure on public works, but the council being now free from debt, will be enabled to expend a much larger amount during the next half-year.

THE GENERAL SESSIONS FOR THE DISTRICTS OF
SALE AND PALMERSTON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace should be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts should have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts should be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, or vary as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the then Lieutenant Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, it was directed that the Court of General Sessions of the peace for the district of Gipps Land, therein described, should be holden at Alberton: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, it was appointed that the said court should be holden at Palmerston in lieu of Alberton: And whereas it is deemed expedient to subdivide the said district of Gipps Land in manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the two several Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do declare and appoint that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established in and for the respective districts and shall be holden at the places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

A Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden at Sale, having jurisdiction in and for the district of Sale, the boundaries whereof are as follow, viz.: Commencing at the mouth of Merriman's Creek, on the sea coast; thence by that creek to its northernmost source; thence by a line about north eighty degrees west to Hobson's Bridge; thence by the road from the said bridge to the Bunceep-bunceep Creek; thence by the said creek to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the said range easterly and northerly to its junction with the great dividing range bounding Gipps Land on the north; thence by the said range to Forest Hill; thence by a line south-easterly to Cape Howe, being the boundary between New South Wales and Victoria; thence by the sea coast to the commencing point; and such court shall be holden at Sale aforesaid on Monday the twenty-fifth day of March and Monday the eleventh day of November during the present year.

A Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden at Palmerston, having jurisdiction in and for the district of

Palmerston, the boundaries whereof are as follow, viz.: Commencing at the mouth of Merriman's Creek, on the sea coast; thence by that creek to its northernmost source; thence by a line about north eighty degrees west to Hobson's Bridge; thence by the road from the said bridge to the Bunceep-bunceep Creek; thence by that creek southerly to the Koo-we-rup or Great Swamp; thence south across the said swamp; thence south-easterly by a creek to its source; thence by the dividing range formerly the western boundary of Gipps Land to Cape Patterson; thence by the sea coast easterly to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATION RESPECTING THE TEMPORARY
RESERVATION OF CROWN LANDS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to make any rules and regulations for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, make the regulation following, that is to say:—

All temporary reservations of Crown lands from sale for schools, sites for places of public worship or dwelling-houses for the ministers of any religious denomination, mechanics' institutes, libraries, museums, or other institutions for public instruction or amusement, will be subject to revocation at the expiration of twelve calendar months from the date of the Order of the Governor in Council authorising such temporary reservations, unless prior to the termination of the said period of twelve months such lands are occupied or being occupied by permanent or suitable buildings to be used for the sole purposes respectively for which the lands were temporarily reserved.

THE REMOVAL OF TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things provided, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by proclamation, to declare that it shall not be lawful for any person to remove live or dead timber from such portions of Crown lands as may be named in such Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of November, in the year 1860, it was declared that it should not be lawful for the holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses to remove live or

dead timber from the Crown lands therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter the terms of the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that it shall not be lawful for any person, other than such person or persons as shall have been duly authorised by the Board of Land and Works, to cut and remove live timber on and from any unappropriated Crown lands situate within ten miles of the city of Melbourne, or within seven miles of the town of Geelong, or within the boundaries of any proclaimed townships or reserve lands throughout the colony of Victoria.

BALLAARAT EAST STREETS.

A PLAN showing certain streets in the municipal district of Ballaarat East, with the proposed breadth of the carriage and foot ways thereof, having been submitted to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the 12th clause of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 14, His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by an Order made on the 14th day of January, 1861, fixed and declared the breadth of the carriage and foot ways of the said streets, and the distance from the outer edge of such footways within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building or fence, to be as specified in the annexed schedule, subject to the condition that the municipal council of Ballaarat East shall not interfere with any mining operations that may be in progress on the lines of any of the proposed streets.
