## THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SAINT ARNAUD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the

said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders and landowners resident at and near Saint Arnaud, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SAINT ARNAUD.—Commencing at a point bearing south forty chains from the south-east angle of the township of Saint Arnaud; thence west one hundred and sixty chains; thence north forty chains; thence west forty chains; thence north two hundred chains; thence east two hundred chains; thence south one hundred and twenty chains; thence east eighty chains; thence south twenty chains; thence N. 71° 15' E. one hundred and twenty chains; thence south seventy-two chains, more or less, to a point bearing N. 71° 15' E. from the commencing; thence S. 71° 15' W. two hundred and eight chains, more or less, to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Saint Arnaud."

## THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO CERTAIN MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (number 13), intitled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct; and it was also enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the corporations of the city of Melbourne and of the town of Geelong, and the council of any municipal district then or thereafter to be created, should be the local boards of health within their respective limits and jurisdictions so soon as the said Act or any portion of it should be extended to such city, town, or district: And whereas the said Act has been extended to divers municipal districts, and it is deemed expedient to make the same also applicable to the districts hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force in the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The municipal district of Smythesdale.  
The municipal district of Taradale.

## STEIGLITZ GOLD FIELDS COMMON ENLARGED.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January in the present year, a certain area, therein described under the designation of Steiglitz, was proclaimed to be a gold fields common: And whereas it is expedient to increase the said common by adding thereto the area hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be an addition to the gold fields common described in the said Proclamation under the designation of Steiglitz, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on the gold field situate at and near Steiglitz aforesaid, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if the said additional area had been

included within the area described in the said Proclamation, that is to say:—

THE ADDITION TO THE GOLD FIELDS COMMON AT STEIGLITZ, Parish of Durdidwarrah, County of Grant.—Extent, about 4270 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of Steiglitz Gold Field Common, proclaimed on the 6th February, 1861; bounded on the north by a line bearing west about one mile; on the west by a line bearing south about four miles; on the south by a line and part of Darriwill Farmers' Common, bearing east together about one mile; and on the east by Steiglitz proclaimed Gold Field Common aforesaid, bearing north about four miles to commencing point.

Also, commencing at the north-east angle of Darriwill Farmers' Common; bounded on the south by Darriwill Farmers' Common, bearing west about one mile and a half; on the west by part of Steiglitz proclaimed Gold Field Common aforesaid, bearing north about 1½ miles; on the north by a line bearing east about one mile and a half to Anakie Farmers' Common; and on the east by Anakie Farmers' Common, bearing south about one mile and three-quarters to the commencing point.

#### MEREDITH TOWN COMMON.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any town shall be a Common for the use of the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town and its vicinity shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture their cattle and horses on such Common, and such Common shall be called a "Town Common;" and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, or, in case such Town Common shall be included within or adjoin the limits of any municipal district, then for the municipal council of such district, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every such inhabitant shall be entitled to depasture on any Town Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands comprised within the area hereinafter described shall be a Town Common within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Meredith, that is to say:—

TOWN COMMON FOR MEREDITH, County of Grant.—Extent, about 380 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 69, parish of Coolebarghurk; bounded on the east by the Coolebarghurk Creek, bearing northerly about one mile and three-quarters to the south boundary of the township of Meredith; on the north by the south boundary aforesaid, bearing west about one mile and a quarter to the Geelong and Ballarat railway; on the west by this railway, bearing southerly about one mile and three-quarters; and on the south by a line and the north boundary of allotment 69 aforesaid, bearing east about one mile thirty chains to commencing point and Coolebarghurk Creek.

#### MOUNT EGERTON GOLD FIELDS COMMON.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any gold field shall be a common for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, and carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field, and every such holder or other resident shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture his horses and cattle on such common, subject to rules and regulations hereafter to be made; and such common shall be called a "Gold Fields Common;" and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the mining board of the mining dis-

trict within which such Gold Fields Common shall be included, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every holder of a miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, or other resident on a gold field, shall be entitled to depasture on any Gold Fields Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands in the vicinity of the gold field hereinafter mentioned, comprised within the area the description whereof is subjoined to the name of such gold field, shall (save and except the lands hereinafter declared to be a gold field) be a GOLD FIELDS COMMON within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field: And I do further proclaim, with the advice aforesaid, that the portions of Crown lands within such area, upon which mining or digging for gold is or shall be actually carried on now or at any time hereafter, shall be Gold Fields within the meaning of the said Act, and in the vicinity of which Gold Fields Commons may be proclaimed:—

MOUNT EGERTON GOLD FIELD COMMON, Parish of Kerit Bareet, County of Grant.—Extent, about 960 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 33, parish of Kerit Bareet; bounded on the north by the road from Ballarat to Ballan, bearing easterly about one mile and a quarter to the west boundary of Ballan Farmers' Common; on the east by this west boundary, bearing south about one mile and three-quarters to the north boundary of Mount Egerton Reserve; on the south by part of this north boundary and a line together bearing west about seventy chains to the east boundary of allotment 39, parish of Kerit Bareet; and on the west by part of allotment 39, allotments 38, 37, 36, 35, 34, and 33, bearing north-westerly to commencing point.

#### FARMERS' COMMONS.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be FARMERS' COMMONS for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as may be prescribed, that is to say:—

AT COOLEBARGHURK, Parish of Durdidwarrah, County of Grant.—Extent, about 4200 acres: Commencing at the south-west angle of Darriwill Farmers' Common; bounded on the east by Darriwill Farmers' Common, bearing north about two miles; on the north by the extension to Steiglitz Gold Field Common, bearing west about fifty chains; on the east by part of the extension aforesaid, bearing north about one mile and a half; on the north by a line bearing west about three miles to Coolebarghurk Creek; and on the west by Coolebarghurk Creek and the Moorarbool River, bearing south-easterly about five miles to commencing point.—(61.D.6144.)

FOR WOODFORD AND YANGERY, County of Villiers.—Extent, about 3500 acres: Being sections 1, 2, and 3 in the parish of Yarrupark, and sections 21, 22, 23, and 27 in the parish of Meerai.—(61.C.2553.)

## MUNICIPALITY OF CHEWTON.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR THE REGULATION OF PUBLIC VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CHEWTON.

WHEREAS by Act of Council No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the council of any municipal district may make bye-laws for the regulation of public vehicles: Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of Chewton, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of Victoria:—

1. That such places as the municipal council shall from time to time appoint shall be stands for public vehicles plying for hire within the municipal district aforesaid: Provided, that the said council may, from time to time, as they may see fit, alter the situation and number of the said stands so appointed, and of the vehicles in each stand, and that six days' clear notice of such appointment or alteration shall be given by such council, by two advertisements in each of the local newspapers.

2. That the owner or driver of any public vehicle shall not permit any part of such vehicle, or of any horse drawing the same, to stand within ten feet of the corner of any street, whether for hire or otherwise.

3. That public vehicles shall take their places on the stand in the order of their arrival, and when any vehicle shall be called or driven off any stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall drive up to the place vacated, and any other vehicle behind in like order.

4. That any driver of any public vehicle shall not suffer the same to stand for hire across any street, or alongside of any other public vehicle, nor obstruct the driver of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent, or endeavor to prevent, the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.

5. That any owner or driver of any public vehicle shall not permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any stand, street, lane or thoroughfare, or other public place, longer than may be necessary for loading or unloading, taking up or putting down any passenger, except while standing for hire in some lawful place appointed for that purpose as provided by this bye-law.

6. That the driver or conductor of every public vehicle shall be constantly attendant on the same when plying on any public stand or otherwise, or engaged for hire within the said municipality.

7. And be it also enacted, that any driver of any public vehicle shall not be permitted to carry more at one time than six persons, exclusive of himself, for any description of conveyance drawn by one horse, and not more than fifteen persons, exclusive of himself and conductor, for any description of conveyance drawn by two horses; and that he shall not drive at a greater speed than eight miles per hour along the streets, thoroughfares, or other public places of the said municipal district of Chewton.

8. That every public vehicle plying for hire, or engaged after sunset or before sunrise within the municipality, shall be provided with proper carriage-lights, and the driver shall keep the same lighted while so plying or engaged for hire.

9. Any vehicle having procured one-half its complement of passengers, must start if required by the passengers.

10. No driver or conductor shall carry, or knowingly permit to be carried, in any licensed carriage (except to some police office or watch-house) any person or persons so noisily or violently conducting themselves, or otherwise so misbehaving themselves as to occasion any public annoyance, or disturb the public peace.

11. No owner, driver, or conductor shall, while having the care of, or being attendant upon any licensed carriage, be drunk, or use any obscene or blasphemous language, or any threatening, abusive, or insulting words or gestures.

12. That no vehicle of any description whatsoever, excepting stage coaches running long distances, shall carry passengers for hire within the municipal boundary, unless the same be duly licensed, and the vehicle, harness, and horses used in drawing the same be, in the opinion of the council, or of their inspector, in a fit condition for public use, with the number of the license, and the number of passengers that the same is allowed to carry, conspicuously and legibly painted thereon; and the driver a sober and competent man.

13. That the owner or owners of all public vehicles carrying passengers for hire shall register their names and addresses at the municipal office, and shall submit the vehicle required to be licensed to the inspection of the council or their inspector.

14. That for every offence against any provision of this bye-law, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10).

15. The words "vehicle" and "vehicles," "public vehicle" and "public vehicles," where used in this bye-law, shall be understood to mean all coaches, omnibuses, cars, cabs, and other carriages plying for hire or carrying passengers within the municipal district of Chewton.

## CAB STANDS.

16. That all cabs be allowed to stand in front of all public-houses within the municipal district of Chewton, but that not more than four public vehicles plying for hire shall be allowed to stand on any one public cab-stand as aforesaid.

17. And further, be it enacted, that such vehicles shall not stand within ten feet of the entrance to any public-house, or otherwise obstruct any person passing to and fro.

## MUNICIPALITY OF DUNOLLY.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SLAUGHTERING OF SMALL CATTLE WITHIN THE TOWN OF DUNOLLY.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the preservation of public health, the suppression of nuisances, and the regulation of slaughter-houses: And whereas it is necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public health of the town of Dunolly, to prevent the nuisances arising from improperly conducted slaughter-houses and butchers' yards: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Dunolly, from and after the date when this bye-law shall have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council:—

That all butchers or other persons whose premises shall have been suitably prepared and properly paved for the purposes of slaughtering, so that in the judgment of the council, after the report of the inspector or other officer, the said premises are found to be in a fit and proper state, shall be granted a license, and permitted to kill sheep, lambs, or swine: Provided, that all such persons shall receive, or cause to be received, the blood into

tubs, together with all offal or other offensive matter, and remove the same, or cause it to be removed, from such premises, at least once in every twenty-four hours.

That all such premises shall be registered at the office of the town clerk, and the same premises shall at all times be open to the inspection of the municipal council, or their inspector or other officer. That no butcher or other person as aforesaid shall kill any sheep, lamb, or swine, except upon premises registered as aforesaid, and without being duly licensed, except such butcher or other person be the *bona fide* servant of a duly licensed person.

That it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other person to kill, or cause to be killed, any sheep, lamb, or swine, on premises situate distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered, and a license be taken out to slaughter on each of such premises, as though they belonged to different owners and persons.

That written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given to the town clerk at least eight days before the same be granted, made, and entered, and be exhibited at his office; and that the said licenses and registrations shall issue and be made on the first Friday of any month, or upon such other day as the council may appoint.

That any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20.)

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GISBORNE.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS OVER PUBLIC FOOTPATHS; ALSO THE PREVENTION OF DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised to make bye-laws for the protection of the public roads and footpaths: Be it therefore ordered and directed, that from and after this bye-law receiving the sanction of the Governor in Council, any person who shall ride or drive any horse, cattle, sheep, or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any carriage, dray, cart, or vehicle, upon or across any public footpath within the municipality of Gisborne, or who shall in any way cause damage, by permanent obstruction or otherwise, to any of the public footpaths or waterchannels within the said district, shall upon conviction before any two justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling (£20.)

Nevertheless it shall be lawful for every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, lane, or building, to which access can alone be obtained by riding, driving, &c., across the aforementioned footpaths and watercourses, who shall make and keep in repair such crossing or bridge over the said watercourse or footpath as may be necessary for approach or access to any such gateway, right-of-way, yard, or back premises, at his own expense, and under the superintendence of the officer appointed by the council for that purpose, to use such crossing without being liable to penalty.

The owner or occupier of any building, premises, or land, who shall permit any drainage water or offensive matter to flow over from his premises any public footpath or highway, after receiving seven days' notice from the officer authorised and appointed by the council for that purpose, shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling (£20.)

Nevertheless should any owner or occupier of land or premises make and maintain, at his own expense, and to the satisfaction and in accordance with the instructions of the officer appointed by the municipal council for that purpose, such drains as may by him, the said officer, be considered sufficient to discharge the water, &c., from such premises into the public water tables, channels, or gutters, he, the said owner or occupier, shall not be liable to the abovementioned or any penalty.

be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the municipal district of Williamstown, for the current year ending the 7th April, 1862, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the council of the municipal district of Williamstown, as required by the provisions of the 18 Victoria No. 15, section 33.

Earthwork formations and roadways in Lower Bridge lane, Lucan street, Wattle street, Buckle street, part of Mackenzie street, High street from Forest street to Shamrock street, Upper Myrtle street, Havelock street, Wattle square, Panton street, Myers street, Lower Plumridge street, Raglan street, Mitchell street.

Curbing and channelling in Plumridge street, Lyttleton terrace, High street B, High street A, Bridge street.

Flagging footpaths in Pall Mall and High street B.

Gravelling throughout Market square, Mitchell street, Bull street, &c.

Planting streets with trees.

Culverts and drains Forest street, New Chum Gully, Panton street. Formation and planting of Botanic Gardens. Erection of abattoir, office, &c., at cattle yards. Erection of lock-up in the town; with other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works, at a total cost of £4908 17s. 5d.

The expenditure for lighting, sweeping, prevention of fires, &c., has amounted to £1139 6s. for the half-year.

#### BYE-LAWS PASSED.

No. 28. For the regulation of common lodging-houses.

No. 29. For the suppression of nuisances.

No. 30. For the further regulation of public vehicles.

No. 31. For the regulation of Sandhurst cattle market and abattoirs.

NOTE.—No. 28 has not yet received the Governor's assent. The remainder have.

#### FINANCE.

The sum of £1961 10s. 5d. has been received from the Government as an instalment of the grant-in-aid for the current year. The amount received for market tolls and dues for the half-year is £1421.

A new assessment of all rateable property has been prepared by Messrs. Skene and Lane, containing 4011 properties, and amounting to £134,231, on which a rate for the current year is being struck.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

For the prevention of fires, the council have purchased and had fixed in the main of the Bendigo waterworks a number of fire plugs, to which suitable hydrants and hose are fitted.

The cattle market and abattoirs have been completed, and are now in use, with a fair prospect of being remunerative for outlay, besides being a great convenience to the public.

The Camp Reserve, so long desired by the public as a place of recreation, was ceded to the municipal council and formally given into their possession by the Government officers on the 29th May last, but the council regret to say that an attempt made afterwards by the Government to oblige the council to compensate persons whom the Government had allowed to trespass for occupation purposes in the reserve, and to which the council could not agree, has prevented those steps being taken for planting and fencing the ground which otherwise would have been.

The threatened withdrawal of grants from municipalities, and other local grievances, have necessitated deputations being twice sent to Melbourne, and the objects sought have been pretty generally obtained.

The botanic gardens reserve has been laid out, fenced and planted, and it is expected will, in the ensuing spring, be a sufficient source of pleasure and attraction to the community to justify the outlay incurred. The council are also planting some hundreds of trees in the streets.

At the wish of many of the inhabitants in the suburbs to be included in the municipality, steps are being taken for an extension of the boundary.

The council have made many applications to the Government in furtherance of the interests of the district, amongst others for the prevention of the erection of the toll-bar at Kangaroo Flat, in which matter they believe the Government have yielded to the wishes of the inhabitants.

## ELECTIONS.

At the commencement of the year, Councillor Strickland by 630 votes, Councillor Casey by 50 votes, Councillor Macartney by 421 votes, were elected as councillors in the places of Messrs. Abbott, Casey, and Strickland, who retired by rotation.

At the first meeting of the council Councillor Casey was elected chairman for the year.

Mr. A. M. Lloyd has been appointed cattle-market inspector; Mr. J. W. Townsend, collector; and Sergeant Drought, inspector of nuisances, &c., the two latter appointments were rendered necessary in consequence of an alteration in the duties and mode of payment of the collector, and the resolution of the council to employ a sergeant of police as town inspector instead of an officer solely for that duty as before.






