PRESCRIBING THE MODE IN WHICH LEGAL PROCEEDINGS SHALL BE TAKEN FOR THE PUNISHMENT OF CERTAIN OFFENCES UNDER THE ACT 24 VICTORIA No. 117.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is, by the eighty-second clause of the said Act, amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by Proclamation to make any rules and regulations for prescribing the mode in which legal proceedings shall be taken under any of the provisions of the said Act, and for imposing any conditions or limitations in the exercise of the right of Common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas it is also further enacted by the eighty-third clause of the said Act, that any person who shall infringe any such rule or regulation, or who shall depasture any cattle or horses on any Common without being entitled so to do, or who shall depasture any cattle or horses in excess of the number which he shall be entitled to depasture, or who shall knowingly and wilfully remove or unnecessarily disturb the horses or cattle of any person or persons entitled to pasturage on such common, shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for every first offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and for every subsequent offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, make the Rule or Regulation hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

On information in writing, for that purpose, preferred by any Commissioner of Crown Lands or member of the police force, or any commoner entitled to depasture stock on any proclaimed Town Common, Gold Fields Common, or Farmers' Common, to any justice, setting forth the particulars of any thing done by any person which shall amount to an offence under the said eighty-third clause of the said Act, such justice shall issue his summons for the appearance before any justice, at a place and a time therein to be specified, of the person against whom any such information shall be preferred; and, at the time and place so to be specified, the last-mentioned or other justice or justices shall proceed to hear and enquire of the truth of the matter and things which may be alleged in any such information, and shall dispose of the said charge in a summary way, according to law.

Commencing at the north-eastern angle of portion 63, in the parish of Ballarat; and thence north to the north-east angle of portion 112, in the parish of Spring Hill; thence west to the north-west angle of the said portion; and thence westerly to a

point in the western boundary of J. Hepburn's pre-emptive right due east of the northern boundary of the parish of Glendaruel; thence north in a direct line to and along the eastern boundaries of sections 14, 13, 12, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1, in the parish of Eglinton, to the south-west angle of portion 2, section 3, in the parish of Rodborough; thence due east along the southern boundary of the said parish and the north boundary of the Campbelltown Town Reserve to a point in the centre of Glengower Creek; thence south-westerly by the centre line of the said creek to its source; thence in a direct line southerly to the sources of the Bullarook Creek; and thence in a direct west line to the commencing point. The municipality of Creswick excepted.

Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon Creek, which is cut by the south boundary of block 6, section XIV., of the parish of Rodborough, county of Talbot; thence northerly by the centre line of the said creek to its junction with the Loddon River; thence north-westerly by the centre line of the said river to its junction with McNeil's Creek; thence south-westerly by the centre line of the said creek to a point due east of the northern boundary of the town reserve, parish of Wareek; thence due west to and along the said boundary to the north-west angle of the town reserve; thence by a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence due south by the western boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of town reserve of the said parish; thence by a direct line bearing east to the western boundary of the parish of Amherst; thence north to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence east by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Amherst and Craigie to the western boundary of the parish of Moolert; thence south by the said western boundary of the parish of Moolert to the southern boundary of the said parish; thence east by the southern boundary of the said parish to the centre of the Deep Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek in a southerly direction to the south-east corner of portion 3, section 7, in the parish of Rodborough; thence east to the north-west angle of portion 2, section 8, in the said parish; thence south by the western boundary of the said block 2, section 8, to the south boundary of the parish of Rodborough; thence east by the said south boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of October, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Amherst and Clunes Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered from a future date: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the eighteenth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of the said Amherst and Clunes Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified (in lieu of the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation) that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the western boundary of J. Hepburn's pre-emptive right, in the parish of Tourello, due east of the north boundary of the parish of Glendarnel; thence due north to and along the eastern boundaries of sections 14, 13, 12, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 1, in the parish of Eglinton, to the south-west angle of block 2; of section 8, in the parish of Rodborough; thence north to the north-west angle of the said block; thence due west in a direct line to the centre of Deep Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek to the southern boundary of the parish of Moolert; thence west to the western boundary of the said parish; thence by the western boundary of the said parish north to the north boundary of the parish of Craigie; thence north to the northern boundaries of the parishes of Craigie and Amherst to the north-west angle of the said parish of Amherst; thence south by the west boundary of said parish to a point due east of the northern boundary of the township reserve, in the parish of Bung Bong; thence by a direct line bearing west to the centre of McNeil's Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek bearing southerly to the north boundary of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right; thence east to the north-east angle of the said pre-emptive right; thence by a direct line to the north-

west angle of portion 111, in the parish of Beckworth; thence south to the south-west angle of portion 67, in the said parish; and thence east by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Beckworth and Clunes and a direct line to the commencing point. The municipality of Amherst excepted.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE accompanying copy of a letter from the Commodore commanding the Australian Station to His Excellency the Governor, is published for general information.

Polorus, at Sea,

Lat. 18° 40' S., Long. 178° 53' E.

SIR,—I have the honor to acquaint your Excellency that at 9.15 a.m. on the 12th instant, while on her passage from New Zealand to the Fijis, Pylstaart Island in sight, bearing N. 23° E. (true) 37 miles, Her Majesty's ship, under my command, passed within 650 yards of a reef not laid down in any chart in our possession.

2. It is about a quarter of a mile in length from east to west; there does not appear to be more than one or two fathoms water on the western end, at the extremity of which breakers were visible. It lays in lat. 22° 55' 15" S., long. 176° 27' 50" W., and being situated directly in the track of vessels bound from New Zealand to the Windward Islands of the Fiji group, is very dangerous to the navigation of these seas.

3. I have further to acquaint you that after dark on the evening of the 12th instant, while steering N.W. under reduced sail, the leadman in the fore chains reported soundings in seven fathoms, followed by two casts in six and a half fathoms and six fathoms respectively. The ship was immediately brought to the wind and tacked, but no soundings having afterwards been obtained, either with the hand lead or the deep-sea line, with sixty-three fathoms out, she was brought to her former course. This bank, if it exists, is situated in lat. 21° 43' S., long. 176° 42' W.

4. On my arrival at Ovalau, I was informed by H.B.M. Consul for the Fijis, that the natives of the Tonga Islands, who maintain much intercourse with the Fiji group, by means of their large canoes, are aware of the existence of many shoals between Tongatabu and the Ono Islands, but are unable to define their position. The only bank of which any reliable information could be procured was one of some extent, having twenty-two fathoms water on it, which was discovered in August, 1860, by three American whalers, cruising in company, and which, by the mean of their observation, lays in 22° 43' S., long. 176° 11' W.

APPLICATION FOR A ROAD DISTRICT.

HEATHCOTE AND WARANGA.

A PETITION has been presented to the Governor, signed by numerous landholders, merchants, tradesmen, and others residing in the districts of Heathcote, Rushworth, Redcastle, Whroo, and on stations and places near to the public roads and highways from the Campaspe River extending to and including Pyalong, setting forth to the following effect, viz.:-

That the petitioners have long felt the want of a Road Board to attend to the making, repairing, altering, and improving the roads and highways in their locality, for the benefit and convenience both of the public generally and of the residents; and they suggest that the area of the proposed board's jurisdiction should be as follows:—Commencing at a point on the Campaspe River near the corner of reserve north of allotment 46, parish of Runnymede; thence by a line bearing east and measuring thirty-four miles fifty chains to the Goulburn River; thence along the western bank of such river to the junction of the Sugarloaf Creek; thence from the aforesaid junction along the aforesaid creek to its junction with Mollison's Creek; thence along Mollison's Creek going west to the Granite Ranges; thence along the Granite Ranges to Piper's Creek at the north-eastern boundary of allotment 3, parish of Enderton; thence along Piper's Creek going northwards to its junction with the Campaspe River; thence along the eastern bank of the Campaspe River to the commencing point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency forthwith to command such district as above set forth to be proclaimed a Road Board district, to be called 'The Heathcote and Waranga Road Board District.'"
