SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF YEA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Yea shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

FARMERS' COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be FARMERS' COMMONS for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as are or may be prescribed, that is to say:—

AT GLENGLOY, near Eltham.—About 2100 acres, parish of Nillumbik: Being allotments 3, 4, and 5 of section 17; 1, 4, and 5 of section 18; 1, 2, 3, and part of allotment 4 of section 9; section 7; and thence by the east boundaries of said section 7 and allotments 3 and 2 of section 8; thence by the south boundary of allotment 4, and part of allotment 3 of section 2, to the intersection of the road with the south boundary of said allotment 3; thence by that road southerly to the crossing-place at the River Yarra-yarra opposite the village reserve of Warrandyte; and thence westerly along the right bank of the River Yarra-yarra to the south-east angle of said section 7.—(61.D.7201.)

AT ONDIT.—About 5380 acres, parish of Cundare: Commencing on the boundary separating the runs of Messrs. J. Calvert and William Robinson; thence bounded on the east by the western boundary of the parish of Ondit, bearing south about three miles twenty-seven chains; thence on the south by the north boundary of the parish of Warrion, bearing west about four miles twenty-eight chains; thence on the west by the east boundary of the parish of Drest, bearing north about one mile ten chains to a stone wall, being the boundary separating the runs of Messrs. J. Calvert and William Robinson; and thence on the north by that stone wall, bearing north-easterly about five miles ten chains to the point of commencement.—(61.C.7735.)

AT YAMBUK AND BOOTANPOOL, County of Villiers.—Extent, about 9000 acres: Commencing at the intersection of the east bank of the River Shaw with the south boundary of the township of Orford; bounded on the north by a line bearing easterly about seven miles and three-quarters to a point on the west bank of the River Moyne opposite the south-west angle of Phillips' pre-emptive section, Tower Hill; on the east by the Moyne River, bearing southerly about two miles and a half; on the south by surveyed lands in the parishes of Bootanpool and Yambuk to Shaw River; and on the west by the Shaw River, bearing north-westerly about two miles and a half to commencing point; as shown by plan deposited in the office of Lands and Survey.—(61.D.7893.)

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having approved of a toll-gate being erected at the site where the toll-gate formerly stood on the Geelong to Batesford road (portion of the Ballarat Main road): Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the Acts 16 Victoria No. 40, and 17 Victoria No. 29, that the Board of Land and Works have directed tolls to be paid, from and after the expiration of one month from the publication hereof, for all animals or vehicles passing or repassing through such toll-gate, at the rates declared by His Excellency's Proclamation, bearing date the 10th day of August, 1858, and made payable at all toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses, then erected or thereafter to be erected, on main roads, that is to say:—

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

MOONAMBEL.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-four householders resident at Moonambel, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state the township of Moonambel is the centre of an extensive mining district; that it contains upwards of three hundred resident householders, and that the dwellings are of a substantial character and have been erected at considerable expense, but no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets, which are consequently nearly impassable, and heavy merchandise, &c., has to be carried over them at great risk and expense.

They are therefore of opinion that the formation of the township into a Municipal District will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such district, viz.:—From the south-west angle of McKinnon's pre-emptive right to a point bearing south half a mile; thence by a line bearing west three miles; thence by a line bearing north two miles; thence by a line bearing east three miles; and thence by a line bearing south one mile and a half to the starting point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district as above defined may be proclaimed a Municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Moonambel,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

BYE-LAW No. 11.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SEVEN POUNDS NINE SHILLINGS AND TWO PENCE, PAID OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR THE YEAR 1861, AS A FIRST INSTALMENT OF THE GRANT IN AID OF THIS MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid from the Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law: And whereas the legislature of this colony has made a grant in aid of the public works of this municipality of Two hundred and fifty-seven pounds nine shillings and two pence (£257 9s. 2d.), as a first instalment for the year 1861: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Buninyong, that such amount be expended as follows, that is to say:—

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 31.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT EAST, AND FOR IMPOSING AND LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND THEREON FOR THE MUNICIPAL YEAR ENDING THE FIRST DAY OF JUNE, 1862.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to its fair annual value, and to impose and levy a rate thereon: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Ballarat East, that all the several properties within the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year ending the first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll or book, made by the said council on the 26th day of August, 1861, and confirmed (after hearing the appeals against the same), by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, numbering 2982 properties, amounting to the total annual value of £75,656 10s.; and also that the rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year commencing the 1st day of June, 1861, and ending the 1st day of June, 1862, and payable in equal proportions, as follows:—The first moiety thereof to be due and payable on the 30th day of September, 1861; and the second moiety to be due and payable on the 30th day of March, 1862: Provided nevertheless, that where the total rate for the whole year does not exceed the sum of Twenty shillings, then such rate shall be due and payable in full on the 30th day of September, 1861.

COLAC PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Colac Public Cemetery, under 17 Victoria No. 12.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.
2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, are entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such persons and their representatives for ever.
3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate in the form set out in schedule B will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in schedule A.
4. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Two o'clock p.m.

8. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed, without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

11. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.

12. Any person or persons who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause any damage to be done to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the abovementioned Act of Council, and is liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds, or, at the discretion of the justice, to three months' imprisonment, and to the payment of all damages therefor.

13. No interment allowed in common graves at a less depth from the surface than six feet, and in vaults at less than four feet from the top of the coffin.

14. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

On the application of and upon payment of the sum of the trustees of the Colac Public Cemetery, in terms of and as authorised by the Act of Council 17 Victoria No. 12, have agreed to, and do hereby permit the said

to dig or make a grave or vault on the piece or portion of ground feet in length by feet in width, lying within the portion of the said cemetery kept by the said trustees, as delineated and referred to in the said plan and register, with permission to erect or place on the said piece of ground a monument or tombstone, to be approved of by the trustees, and on payment of such charges as may from time to time be established. And it is hereby declared that the said

shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of this permission, and for the sole and separate use of the said and representatives for ever:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this permission is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz:—

1. That the piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said and representatives for ever solely as a burying-ground, and that no other use shall be made thereof.

2. That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be erected on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been submitted to the trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.

3. That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, building, fence, and monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept up by the said and representatives, in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the said trustees.

4. That the said and representatives shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make, and shall, not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[6th August, 1861.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 6th day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

XXI. Races.—That bye-law numbered (xv.) fifteen of the Beechworth Mining Board, from clause No. 1 to No. 5, in the words following:—"Any person intending to cut a race shall register such intention," &c., be, and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. Any person intending to cut a race shall register such in-

tention with the registrar, stating the proposed extremities thereof, and shall mark the proposed course thereof with pegs at intervals not exceeding one hundred yards; he shall then be deemed to be in occupation of such proposed course; but if he shall not, within one calendar month, begin to form such race, or having begun shall not continue the formation thereof, he shall forfeit his title to any portion or portions of the proposed course of the race in or upon which it has not been formed.

2. Any person extending any race or altering the course thereof shall, in such extension or alteration, be subject to the same conditions as if he was forming a new race.

3. The head of any race cut for the purpose of diverting the water from any creek or river shall not be shifted without the written sanction of the warden, nor to the prejudice of any existing right.

4. The registered holder of any race shall keep it in proper repair, and shall, on receipt of a written order from the warden, build an efficient bridge where any road in ordinary use crosses the race.

5. If any race which shall hereafter be formed in the Snake Valley or Spring Creek divisions, shall be cut to a depth exceeding five feet at any place within one hundred yards of any source from which another race is supplied, it shall not be used to convey water to any claim or reservoir without the written sanction of the warden, nor unless the applicant for such permission shall have given fourteen days' notice to the registered owner or owners of any race or races which derive any portion of their supply from a source within one hundred yards of any portion of the new race, which may exceed five feet in depth, of his intention to make such application.

XXII. Protection of roadways, sides of races and dams.—The undermentioned lands shall not be occupied for mining purposes unless with the written sanction of the warden, namely:—All land within a distance of five feet from any race, or the lower side of any dam or reservoir; all land within a distance of thirty feet (30) from the centre of any road proclaimed by any warden.

XXIII. Causing claims to be flooded, prohibited.—No person shall back the water of any creek, race, or watercourse, upon any claim, or otherwise cause any claim to be flooded, either wilfully or by neglect.

XXIV. Interference with races, dams, reservoirs, &c., prohibited.—No person shall, under any pretence whatsoever, damage, destroy, or otherwise interfere with any race, tail-race, dam, reservoir, or any appliances connected therewith, unless with the consent of the registered owners thereof.

XXV.—Interpretation bye-law.—That bye-law numbered (ii.) two of the Beechworth mining board, from clause 1 to clause 10, in the words following:—"In the construction and for the purposes of these bye-laws," &c., be, and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these bye-laws, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

2. The words "warden, surveyor," and "registrar," shall mean respectively the warden, surveyor, and registrar for the time being of the division in which the events in connection with which they are mentioned shall happen.

3. The words "lead" or "frontage lead" shall mean any stratum of auriferous earth at a depth exceeding forty feet.

4. The words "constantly employed" shall mean employment during ordinary working hours, except on an unproclaimed lead, on which constantly employed shall be held to mean occupation for two hours daily, namely, from Ten o'clock a.m. to Twelve o'clock noon.

5. The word "race" shall mean a channel made for the purpose of conveying water.

6. The words "tail-race" shall mean a race cut for the purpose of draining any claim or claims, or for carrying off the water used for sluicing or any other mining purpose.

7. The words "worked and abandoned ground" shall mean any ground the greater portion of which has been mined upon for gold, and which has been declared by the warden to be worked and abandoned.

8. The words "right" or "water-right" shall mean the privilege of diverting and using water from any creek or river.

9. Any words importing the singular number shall include the plural number.

10. Any words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine gender.

11. New alluvial gold workings shall mean workings on any lead or creek on which payable ground has not been previously discovered, or which has been entirely abandoned as unprofitable, or any surface workings not less than five miles from the nearest workings of the same class.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-laws.
