THE TOWN OF WINCHELSEA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act, and to rescind such Proclamations, and to issue other Proclamations in lieu thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the present year, one of the areas therein described was proclaimed a Town under the name of Winchelsea: And whereas it is expedient to alter the limits of the said Town: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby rescind so much of the said Proclamation as defines the said Town; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby order and declare that the area hereinafter defined shall be considered to be the TOWN OF WINCHELSEA, within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF WINCHELSEA, COUNTY OF GRANT, PARISHES OF LAKE LAKE WOLLARD AND MIRNEE.—Commencing at a point on the west bank of the Barwon River, being a point due west of the north-west angle of suburban allotment 22, township of Winchelsea, parish of Lake Lake Wollard; thence south to a point due west of the south-west angle of allotment 1, section 2, parish of Lake Lake Wollard; thence by a line east to the south-west angle of allotment 1, section 2, parish of Lake Lake Wollard; thence by a line north to the intersection of the south side of the main line of road from Geelong to Colac; thence south-westerly by the south side of said main road to a point intersected by a prolongation of the south boundary of Austin's pre-emptive section; thence west to the point of commencement.—(O.61.439.)

SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, IN THE TOWNS OF BAIRNSDALE AND STRATFORD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to

declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February, in the present year, the boundaries of the towns of Bairnsdale and Stratford were, amongst other towns, respectively described. And whereas it is expedient to declare the said towns to be towns for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the towns hereinafter named shall be towns wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:—

The Town of Bairnsdale,
The Town of Stratford,

according to the boundaries of the said towns as respectively described in the above-mentioned or any future Proclamation.

AMHERST FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common," provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under

and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as are or may be prescribed, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT AMHERST.—Commencing at the intersection of the road from Amherst to Carisbrook with the Mount Greenock Creek road from Ballaarat to Carisbrook; thence southerly by the last-mentioned road about five miles seventy chains to a point ten chains north of the south-east angle of allotment 16 in the parish of Eglintou; thence west about one mile ten chains to the parish boundary of Amherst; thence by that boundary north about two miles forty chains to the north-east angle of Amherst Town Common; thence west by that common about one mile nineteen chains; thence northerly by a road about one mile five chains to the said road from Amherst to Carisbrook; and thence by that road north-easterly about four miles twenty chains to the point of commencement. Area, about three thousand acres, exclusive of sold and appropriated Crown lands.

THE INTERVAL FOR HOLDING THE COUNTY COURT AT HAMILTON ABRIDGED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the fourth day of November, 1861.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in each case direct: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it was amongst other things ordered that a county court should be holden at Hamilton once at least in every six calendar months: And whereas it is deemed expedient to abridge the interval for holding the said court: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct, that the county court for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act shall, from and after the commencement of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, be holden at the said place within the interval following, that is to say:—

At Hamilton once at least in every four calendar months.

And the Honorable Butler Cole Aspinall, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-nine householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, in the parish of Douita Galla, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are all householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, within the meaning of the Municipal Institutions Act, 18 Victoria No. 15; that they are more than one hundred and fifty in number; and that the area within which they reside contains a population of more than three hundred householders, and does not exceed nine square miles, wherein no one point is six miles distant from any other point.

They further state that they are desirous that their locality should be erected into a municipal district to be governed by a council as provided by the said Act, and suggest the following boundaries for such district (as described on a plan which accompanied the petition), viz.:

"Commencing at a point on the northern boundary fence of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander railway at its intersection with the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence along the northern fence of the railway for a distance of eighty-seven chains, more or less, by a curved line having an average bearing of west by 8° 30' north to its intersection with the eastern side of the Saltwater River; thence for a distance of three hundred and four chains, more or less, along the eastern side of the Saltwater River, being an irregular line having a general bearing of north by 38° 30' west to the intersection of the western boundary of No. 1 allotment of portion 7, in the parish of Jika-Jika, with the northern side of the Saltwater River; thence by a line for a distance of one hundred and thirty chains, more or less, bearing due north to its intersection with the northern side of the one-chain Mount Macedon road; thence by a line for a distance of seventy-two chains, more or less, bearing east by 8° south to the intersection of the eastern side of the Main Melbourne road with the northern side of Woodland street; thence due east for a distance of one hundred and fourteen chains, more or less, along the northern side of Woodland street to its intersection with the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence for a distance of five hundred and twenty-six chains, more or less, along the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek, being an irregular line having a general bearing of south by 10° east to the point of commencement, all the above being situate in the parish of Douita Galla, county of Bourke."

The petitioners state, lastly, that they are desirous that the district above described be proclaimed as the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington, and pray as follows, viz.:

"Your petitioners therefore pray your Excellency that the before described boundaries may be constituted the limits of the municipal district; that your Excellency will be pleased to constitute the same under the name of 'The Municipal District of Essendon and Flemington;' and that your Excellency will also be pleased to issue the necessary Proclamation for declaring it a municipality, and defining the limits accordingly."

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 34 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF ST. KILDA, FOR THE REGULATION OF THE PUBLIC ABATTOIRS OF ST. KILDA, AND FOR FIXING THE RATES AND DUES FOR SLAUGHTERING TO BE CHARGED THEREIN.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of every municipal district to make bye-laws for the killing and sale of butchers' meat and the establishment of slaughter-houses: And whereas public abattoirs having been established within the municipal district of St. Kilda, it is expedient and necessary that regulations should be made for the use of the same, and that the rates for slaughtering, fees, and dues to be taken for the use of such abattoirs and appurtenances by parties slaughtering, or causing to be slaughtered, live stock therein, should be fixed: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of St. Kilda, that from and after the expiration of twenty days from the date of the *Government Gazette* in which it shall be notified that the said public abattoirs are completed, and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the following rules and regulations shall be observed by, and shall be binding upon, all persons using the public abattoirs of the municipality of St. Kilda, or resorting thereto; and that the charges hereinafter mentioned shall be the dues to be paid for slaughtering at the said abattoirs, viz.:

1. *Time when slaughtering shall be permitted.*—The abattoirs shall be open and slaughtering shall be permitted at all hours of the day and night, except on Sundays for its entire duration, when the whole establishment shall be closed, and no slaughtering or other work shall be carried on therein.

2. *Time allowed for slaughtering certain animals.*—Every person who shall pay to the superintendent of the abattoirs the dues for slaughtering according to the rates hereinafter fixed, shall be entitled to the use of that portion of the abattoirs, and of the appurtenances of the same, which shall be appointed to him by the superintendent of the abattoirs for the purpose of slaughtering any of the animals which may be lawfully

slaughtered therein, for a reasonable time, not exceeding the time hereinafter mentioned, viz. —

For the killing and dressing of a calf or pig, thirty minutes; and of a sheep, lamb, or goat, twenty minutes.

3. *Persons using the abattoirs to cleanse the same.*—Every person who shall use the abattoirs, or any portion thereof, shall immediately thereafter remove all offal, filth, and refuse of every description whatsoever which shall remain or result from such use of the abattoirs by him, from the abattoir premises to the pits or places appointed for the reception of such offal, filth, or refuse, and shall cleanse thoroughly, to the satisfaction of the superintendent of the abattoirs, all the portion of the said abattoirs which he shall so use.

4. *Damages to be made good.*—Every person using the abattoirs or any part of the same, and who shall break, injure, or damage the same or any part thereof, shall make good the destruction, damage, or injury done by him.

5. *Persons bringing live stock to the abattoirs responsible for the safety thereof.*—Every person who shall bring, convey, or conduct any live stock to the abattoirs, for the purpose of slaughter, shall inform the superintendent of the abattoirs of the description and number of the live stock, and the superintendent shall enter the information so tendered to him in a book to be kept by him for that purpose; the succession of entries in such book shall, in case of any question arising, decide the order of priority in which the several persons shall be entitled to the use of the yards, pens, killing houses, or appurtenances of the abattoirs, and if no place shall have been previously appointed for the reception of the live stock of the person so bringing the same, such person shall place such live stock in such portion of the yards, pens, or premises of the said abattoirs as the said superintendent shall direct, and the person so bringing such live stock shall himself be responsible for the safety thereof.

6. *Rates of dues for slaughtering at the abattoirs.*—The slaughtering dues which shall be demanded, received, and taken at the abattoirs by the superintendent of the abattoirs, or other officer or person for that purpose appointed by the municipal council of St. Kilda, shall be as follows, viz. —
For every calf or swine, One shilling.
For every sheep, lamb, or goat, Threepence.

7. *Persons entitled to use certain portions of the abattoirs shall cleanse the same when required.*—If any person shall desire to kill live stock in one particular portion of the abattoirs under such conditions as to time and otherwise as the said council shall think necessary and prescribe, the superintendent shall, on application from such person, submit to the council the particulars of any such proposal, and if the council shall approve of such appropriation, such person shall at all times while he shall use such portion of the said abattoirs keep the same clean and free from offence, whether by accumulation of blood, filth, or otherwise; and shall further, whenever so required by the superintendent of the abattoirs, cleanse, scrape, linewash, or otherwise purify in such manner as shall be necessary, and as the said superintendent shall direct, the wall, doors, floors, or other parts of the portion of the said abattoirs which he shall so use, and be entitled to use; and he shall in all respects comply with the regulations of the municipal council of St. Kilda for the government of the abattoirs in force for the time being.

8. *Live stock to be supplied with sufficient food and water.*—Every person who shall bring livestock for slaughter to the said abattoirs, and shall permit the same to remain in the yards or pens of the said abattoirs for a longer period than one day, shall provide such live stock with sufficient food and water.

9. *Penalty for offences against any of the provisions of this bye-law.*—For every neglect or breach of any of the provisions hereof, the offender shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 34, made by the municipal council of St. Kilda, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable SIR JOHN YOUNG, Baronet, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, intitled, *An Act to regulate the importation of Cattle for the purpose of preventing the introduction of Contagious or Infectious Disorders, and to prevent the propagation thereof in the colony*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to prohibit the importation or introduction into the colony, or into any port thereof, from any specified place, and for any specified time, of any horned cattle, and to authorise

the destruction of any such cattle as may be introduced contrary to such prohibition: And whereas the disease known or described as pleuro-pneumonia has appeared amongst horned cattle in certain parts of the neighboring colony of Victoria, and it is necessary to take measures to prevent the introduction into this colony of the said disease: Now therefore I, Sir John Young, Baronet, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the importation or introduction into this colony, or into any port thereof, of any horned cattle whatsoever from the colony of Victoria, or from any part thereof, for and during the full term of six calendar months, to be computed from the date of this Proclamation: And I do further notify and proclaim that, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, all horned cattle imported into the colony contrary to this Proclamation, may be seized, and shall be forfeited in like manner as any contraband goods liable to be seized and forfeited under any law relating to the customs; and any person concerned in importing or introducing, or in attempting to import or introduce, any cattle in violation of this Proclamation, will, for every such offence, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds and not less than Ten pounds, to be recovered as in the said Act is provided.
