SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS.

THE following Proclamation, originally inserted in the Government Gazette of the 16th February, 1853, is republished for general information.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Licutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria.

Whereas by an Act of the Licutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, initialed, "An Act to make provision for the Sale of Fermented and Spiviluous Liquors, and of Refreshments in certain Districts," it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Licutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the Government Gazetle, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of that Act, to be called "A Special Licensing District," and to define the boundaries of such district. Now I, the Licutenant Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby proclaim the following parts and portions of the said colony to be Special Licensing Districts under the provisions of the said Act; and do hereby define the boundaries of the same to be as follows, that is to say:—That part of the said colony known as the Northern Circuit District, the boundaries whereof are the Great Dividing Range, being the southern boundary of the County of Talbot, commencing at the source of the River Avoca; thence along the Dividing Range aforesaid to the source of the River Campaspe; thence by the Rivers Campaspe and Murray to a point north of the north-western boundary of the township of Castle Donnington; thence by a line southward to Lake Bael Bael: and thence by the River Avoca to its source in the Dividing Range aforesaid: And also that portion of the said colony known as the district of the County of Grunt, commening at the source of the River Morabol; thence along the Dividing Range aforesaid: And also that portion of the read colony known as the River County of Grunt, commening at the source of the River Morabol; thence along the Dividing Range aforesaid to the boundary of the County of Ripon;

thence westerly along that boundary to Lake Burrambeet; thence by the northern boundary line of the County of Grenville to the township of Carngham; thence by a straight line south-easterly to the junction of the River Yarrowee with Williamson's Creek; thence a straight line easterly to the junction of Lal Lal Rivulet with the River Moorabool aforesaid; and thence by that river to its source in the Diviting Range aforesaid: And also all that portion of the said colony known as the Pastoral District of the Murray, the boundaries whereof are those set forth in the Schedule annexed to The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851, marked A: And also all that portion of the said colony which lies within one mile on either side of the main line of road leading from the city of Melbourne by Keilor, and also that by the Deep Creek to Gisborne; and thence by Kyneton, to and including the township of Malmsbury on the River Coliban: And also all that portion of the said colony which lies within one mile of the main lines of road leading from the the city of Melbourne by Bacchus Marsh and Ballan to Buninyong, and from the town of Geelong by the River Leigh, and also by Sutherland's to Buninyong aforesaid: And also all that portion of the said colony which lies within one mile of the main line of road leading from the city of Melbourne aforesaid to the said Pastoral District of the Murray by the towns of Kilmore and Seymour in the said colony: And I do declare that no part of the said colony within one mile of the corporate boundaries of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong shall be deemed a Special Licensing District within the meaning of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING DELEGATION OF POWERS TO SUPERINTENDENTS UNDER "DISEASED CATTLE ACT, 1861." At the Government House at Auckland, the first day of October, 1861.

PRESENT: His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Whereas by Warrants under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the Governor has, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of Auckland, Taranaki, Wellington, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Marlborough, Canterbury, Otago, and Southland, certain powers conferred on him by the Diseased Cattle Act, 1861, subject to certain regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, under the recited Act. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, by virtue of the authority given to him by the 14th section of the above-recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following regulations:—

1. The delegation of powers under the said warrants shall continue to be in force for the period of one year from this date, subject to be rescinded according to the provisions of the above-recited Act.

In the exercise of powers delegated under the 9th section of the said Act, the Superintendent of any province may, either in the first instance or afterwards, from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the province, except out of any district proclaimed as infected under the said Act any port or place within the limits of such district, and every such excepted port and place shall be deemed not to be within the proclaimed district; and the Superintendent may also from time to time by Proclamation as aforesaid rescind any Proclamation of an infected district wholly or as to any part thereof, and also the Proclamation of any such exception as aforesaid.

5. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 10th section of the Act, the Superintendent of any province may prohibit the importation, either by land or by sea, of cattle into such province from any other province, or any particular port or place in any other province, or across the borders of a province, or any particular part thereof.

6. In all such last-mentioned cases, such Superintendent shall cause notice as speedily as possible of such prohibition to be given to the Superintendent of the province from which importation shall be prohibited, and also to the Governor.

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the nineteenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say, that—

XXVI. Interpretation.—The words, when a claim is fairly opened and in working order, shall mean, in ordinary or frontage claims, when the lead or payable ground has been discovered; in creek and other shieing claims, when the occupiers are in a position to commence washing; except in cases where an extensive tail race is to be cut, or in quartz claims, the words shall then mean when the occupiers have been at work on or in connection therewith for a period not less than two months.

XXVII. Duties imposed on claimfolders.—Bye-law numbered

XXVII. Duties imposed on claimholders.—Bye-law numbered six (VI.), from clause 1 to clause 8, of the Beechworth mining board, in the words following, "It shall be imperative on any person occupying any claim," &c., &c., be and the same is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in licu

1. It shall be imperative on any person occupying any claim other than an ordinary claim, to register such occupation, together with the number of men intended to be employed on the claim, with the registern within forty-eight hours after such occupation; and the person in whose name the claim is thus registered, or the holder of any ordinary claim, shall be responsible for the due observance of such of the following duties as are applicable to his claim.

He shall keep constantly employed on or in connection with his claim, if a dry bank claim, at least one man for every twenty yards comprised in the width of the claim, unless the claim is in the Omeo division, in which case he shall employ at least one man for every one hundred feet comprised in the width of the claim; if a wet bank claim, at least one man to every twenty-five yards comprised in the width of the claim; if a wet bank claim, at least one man to a frontage claim, or an alluvial prospecting claim not in the bed of a creek or river, at least four men for an entire claim, and a proportionate number for one of a less size; if a creek claim, at least one man for every fifty feet comprised in the length of the claim, unless the claim is situate in the Buckland division, in which case he shall keep constantly employed thereon at least one man for every twenty-five yards comprised in the length of the claim, or in the Omeo division, in which case he shall keep employed at least one man for every fifty yards comprised in the length of the claim, or on that portion of the Woolshed Creek situated between the upper boundary of Kneebone's claim and the junction of the said creek with the Ovens River, in which case he shall keep employed at least one man for every fifty yards comprised in the length of the claim, is being sunk, during which time he shall keep at least ten men on the claim; if a quartz claim, at least one man for every thirteen and one-third yards comprised in the length of the claim, unless while the claim is being prospected, during which time the employment of two men will be deemed sufficient to hold the entire claim.

If the claim is an alluvial prospecting claim not in the bed of a creek or river, and gold in payable quantities is found therein at a depth exceeding forty feet, he shall, within forty-eight hours after such discovery, give notice thereof, in writing, to the surveyor, together with such information as will enable the surveyor to find the claim on which the discovery has been made.

6. If he holds a creek claim he shall make and maintain an efficient flood race through or past such claim.

7. He shall at all times allow the surveyor, or any person or persons appointed by him, to enter upon his workings either to take measurements or to ascertain whether payable ground has been discovered.

8. If any occupied tail race is included in the claim, he shall not be deemed to be in possession of any ground within a distance from the sides of the race equal to the depth thereof, nor of any ground within a distance of ten feet from the sides of the race, whatever may be the depth thereof.

Aspinall, who has been so good as to assure the council his predecessor's promise should be carried into effect.

The council consider it their duty to here record their sense of obligation to J. M. Grant, Esq., M.L.A., and B. G. Davies, Esq., M.L.A., for their ready and most valuable assistance in all matters in which their aid has been solicited.

The council much regret that in consequence of their feeling called upon to erect the town hall, they have been unable to undertake any other public works of importance during the last half-year.
