THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as thereinafter mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: And whereas the counter-petition delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary has not been signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within the said locality: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and

named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.—Commencing at a point on the north side of the land occupied by the Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River Railway, where it is intersected by the Moonee Ponds; thence by the Moonee Ponds in a northerly direction to a point where it intersects the north side of Woodland street, Essendon; thence by the north side of Woodland street west until it intersects the north-east side of the main line of road from Melbourne to Broadmeadows; thence by a line westerly to a point where it intersects the north side of the Mount Alexander road, due north of the north-west angle of allotment A, section 13, parish of Douita Galla; thence south by the west boundaries of allotments A of section 13, and 1 of section 7, to the south-west angle of section 7, allotment 1, on the north bank of the Saltwater River; thence by the Saltwater River (the northern and eastern banks thereof) easterly and southerly to a point where said river intersects the north side of the Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River Railway; thence by the north side of the railway easterly to the point of commencement; excluding from the area above described the pieces or parcels of land described in the second and third schedules to the Act 21 Victoria No. 11, and the roadway which separates the said pieces or parcels.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Essendon and Flemington."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the premises hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Smythesdale: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Smythesdale the following premises, situated and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Mechanics' Institute.

THE METROPOLITAN CRICKET GROUND.

MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 29.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Carisbrook, that a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within this municipal district, one moiety to be collected on and after twenty days from the issue of the notices, and the other on and after the 8th of March, 1862.—(U.9689.)

BYE-LAW No. 30.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT, FOR THE YEAR 1861-62.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore enacted, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the municipality of Carisbrook, estimated at £10,507 10s., as approved of by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling in the pound has been assessed, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 8th September, 1861, and ending the 8th September, 1862.—(U.9690.)

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 32.—FOR REGULATING THE DRIVING OF UNBROKEN HORSES AND CATTLE THROUGH THE MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, restraining offensive trades, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas great danger to life and property arises from the practice of driving unbroken horses and cattle, at all hours, into or through the municipal district of East Collingwood, and it is expedient to devise means for the prevention of the same: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of East Collingwood, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to drive into or through the said municipal district any unbroken horses or cattle, excepting between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. from 1st September to 1st April, and 7 p.m. and 9 a.m. from 1st April to 1st September; provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to horses secured by a bridle or halter, or in harness, milch cows, nor to oxen in yoke.

Any person or persons acting in contravention to this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding (£5) Five pounds sterling.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 32, made by the municipal council of East Collingwood, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

BYE-LAW No. 23.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF THE ANNUAL VALUE OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH SEPTEMBER, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that the council of any municipal district shall make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such district, according to its fair annual value: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Maldon, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the said municipal district of Maldon, as prepared by Richard Bradton, the assessor appointed by this council for the purpose of making such assessment, amounting, after all appeals have been heard, to the sum of Twenty-one thousand one hundred and twenty-five pounds (£21,125) sterling, and contained in forty-one (41) pages or sheets of paper, and signed by the chairman at this meeting, shall be the assessment or value upon which a rate for the current year shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing on the 10th day of September last, and ending on the 10th day of September, 1862.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH SEPTEMBER, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 18 Victoria No. 16, intitled, *An Act to amend an Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is hereby enacted that no toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district save by bye-law, subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Maldon, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the municipal district of Maldon aforesaid, for the current year ending the 10th day of September, 1862, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the said municipal council, as required by the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No 15, sec. 33.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 23 and 24, made by the municipal council of Maldon, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran also to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will, however, in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringing or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. 6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board to be considered final.

9.
