ROYAL VOLUNTEER CAVALRY.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased (under the powers conferred by the Volunteer Act, 18 Victoria No. 7) to discontinue the services of the Royal Victoria Yeomanry Corps, and also those of the Mounted Troop of the Royal Victoria Volunteer Artillery Regiment.

This course (see Proclamation dated 8th January, 1861) has been taken with a view to the amalgamation of the two first-mentioned Corps of Volunteer Cavalry into a single Corps under the name of the "First, or Royal Volunteer Cavalry."

THE TOWNS OF CHEPSTOW AND LINTON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the areas hereinafter defined shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF CHEPSTOW.—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 3, block 2, in the township of Chepstow; thence north crossing the Emu Creek twenty-four chains sixty-eight links; thence east eighty chains; thence south crossing the Emu Creek eighty chains; thence west eighty chains; thence north fifty-five chains thirty-two links to the commencing point.

THE TOWN OF LINTON.—County of Grenville: Commencing at the north-east angle of Linton's pre-emptive section; thence north eighty chains; thence west eighty chains; thence south eighty chains; thence east eighty chains, partly along the north boundary of said pre-emptive section, to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE TOWNS OF MANSFIELD AND MERTON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the areas hereinafter defined shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF MANSFIELD.—County unnamed, parish of Mansfield, situate on Ford's Creek, Devil's River district: Commencing at the south-west angle of portion 34; bounded on part of the north by High street and portions 34, 33, and 36 bearing east forty chains crossing Ford's Creek; on the east by Rowe street bearing south thirty-six chains fifty links, crossing High street and Ford's Creek; on the south by Malcolm street and portions 18, 19, 20, and 21 bearing west forty-three chains to the west side of Hightett street; on the west by that side of Hightett street bearing north thirty-six chains fifty links to the north side of High street; and on the remainder of the north by High street bearing east three chains to the point of commencement.

THE TOWN OF MERTON.—County of Anglesey, parish of Merton, situate on the Hut Creek: Commencing at a point one chain fifty links; bearing north 11 degrees 45 minutes east from the north-west angle of portion 34, parish of Merton; bounded on part of the north by part of the south boundary of portion 29, and the south boundary of portion 26, bearing north 78 degrees 10 minutes west, forty-five chains fifty links more or less, crossing the main line of road from Longwood; thence by part of the east boundary of the Police paddock, bearing south 12 degrees west sixteen chains eleven links to the south side of the main line of road from Tallarook; thence by the south side of said main road to the east boundary of portion 1; thence by that boundary and a line bearing south 12 degrees west fifty-two chains ninety-eight links; thence by the north boundaries of portions 2 and 42, bearing south 78 degrees 15 minutes east seventy chains seventy-eight links, crossing Molesworth road; thence by the west boundaries of portions 40 and 34, bearing north 11 degrees 45 minutes east fifty-eight chains ninety-two links, more or less, crossing a road three chains wide and a road one chain fifty links to the point of commencement.
