REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS. (Issued under the Amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 86, section 2.)

IN cases where the Commissioner of Trade and Customs is satisfied that a refund of duties is justly due, the necessity for such refunds arising either from overpayment of duty or from any error, the repayment may be granted.

This regulation, however, shall not apply to any drawback, refund, or omission authorised by the Customs Act 1857, nor sanction any refund or remission disallowed by the Customs Act 1857.

In order to facilitate refunds the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may obtain from the Governor a *quarterly authority* under the 32nd clause of the regulations respecting public accounts, dated 1st May, 1859, instead of a *special authority* as is now required by the 35th clause of the regulations.

This regulation shall have force from the 1st January, 1861.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

SUNKEN WRECK, RIVER YARRA.

MASTERS of vessels and others navigating the River Yarra are hereby informed that a portion of the hull of a vessel has been sunk at the mouth of the Saltwater river, partly in the channel near the junction.

The fore part of the wreck is about two (2) feet above water, the main body and after part has about six (6) feet water over it, it is marked by a beacon painted green, upon which a light will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise until the wreck has been removed.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf by the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, has, by divers Orders made on the 10th and 24th of December, 1860, and on the 21st and 28th of January and the 4th of February, 1861, temporarily reserved from sale the lands hereinafter described, for the several purposes specified in connection with each description.

LANDS SET APART PRIOR TO THE ACT 24 VICTORIA No. 117 COMING INTO OPERATION.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by divers Orders made from time to time, set apart the pieces or portions of land hereinafter described for the several purposes specified in connection with each description.

Description of the lands set apart:—

AT BEECHWORTH, FOR RACECOURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION, with the express understanding that the profits be applied, first to keeping the place in repair, secondly, for purposes of public recreation (set apart by Order dated 23rd February, 1857).—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 6, section B, township of Beechworth; thence south 49 degrees 25 minutes west twenty chains to a road; thence south 40 degrees 35 minutes east thirty-seven chains eighty-five links to intersection with another road; thence along west side of said road north 22 degrees 33 minutes east twenty-two chains fifty-nine links; thence north 40 degrees 35 minutes west twenty-seven chains sixty-five links to commencing point.—(57.B.820.)

BYE-LAW No. VII.—AMENDING PORTION OF BYE-LAW OF THE 26TH NOVEMBER, 1858, REGULATING MINING OPERATIONS IN THE RAGLAN DIVISION OF THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT, AND RELATING TO MACHINERY IN WET SINKINGS.—[30th January, 1861.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 30th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Extent of ground where machinery is erected.*—That any party intending to erect a whim shall be entitled to an additional extent of ground amounting to eighty (80) feet along the course of the lead by fifty (50) feet in width; and any party intending to erect a steam-engine shall be entitled to an additional extent of claim amounting to twenty (20) feet along the course of the lead by a width of fifty (50) feet for each nominal horse power of the engine; provided such additional ground can be obtained without interfering with existing claims. The machinery must be erected within a reasonable time. This bye-law not to apply to old workings.

2. *Sinking in advance of a lead, or discovering a lost lead.*—Any party sinking three hundred (300) yards in advance of an established lead shall be entitled to mark out a double claim, and hold the same; provided that on the discovery of the lead they make it public before gold is struck in any intervening claim, the nearest peg of which is within one hundred and fifty (150) yards of the shaft of such double claim; and any party finding a lead lost for three (3) months or more, above or below where it was lost, shall be entitled to a double claim. The owners of such double claims shall be entitled also to the allowance for machinery provided in the preceding clause. The number of men in any such claim shall not exceed twenty-four (24).

3. *Repeal clause.*—That clauses 12 and 25 of the Raglan bye-law of the 26th November, 1858, be and the same are hereby repealed.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-five householders resident at Smythesdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

R. HEALES.

The petitioners state that the township of Smythesdale is situated in the centre of a very extensive mining district; that the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable expense; and that there are more than 300 householders resident within the boundaries of the township.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

To have the river boundary extended from the banks to the middle.—This has been granted.

Also, that the breakwater may be put in an efficient state before the burden of keeping it in repair is thrown on the council; in this application the town council of Geelong warmly united.—An answer which it is hoped will be favorable is expected shortly.

FINANCE.

The sum of £2703 4s. 6d. has been received from the Government as balance of the grant-in-aid for 1860.

The assessment for the year 1860 numbers 4025 properties, amounting to £141,416, on which a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound has been levied, giving as the total amount of rate for the year £10,606 4s.

The sum of £300 has been received from the Government for improvement of public reserves in consideration of the council expending an equivalent amount for the same purpose.

The amount received for market dues and tolls for the half-year is £1050 8s. 4d., making the total revenue under this head for the entire year £2213 4s. 10d.

MISCELLANEOUS.

For the prevention of fires, besides passing a bye-law to check the erection of inflammable buildings in crowded localities, the council have purchased the fire-engine belonging to the Government, which would otherwise have been removed from the town; have established a small paid brigade in lieu of the No. 2 volunteer brigade dissolved; and have also agreed to give grants-in-aid to No. 1 volunteer fire brigade equal to any amount the brigade can raise from other sources.

The cattle market having been at last proclaimed, the necessary works have been put in progress, and the market will very shortly be opened.

The municipal conference referred to in the last half-yearly report has been held in Melbourne, and attended by Councillor Strickland as the delegate from the council.

The difficulty attending a proper consideration by the Government of the necessity of a bridge for the main road at View Point, induced the council to send Councillors Casey and O'Keefe as a deputation to the Government on this subject, and the result was that £1500 has been placed on the estimates to be expended for the purpose, provided the municipal council furnished the like amount.

Several applications have been made to the Government in furtherance of the public accommodation, but with little success, except the establishment of a direct mail to Inglewood.

In consequence of the reported appearance of scarlatina in the district, the council have had several meetings as local board of health to take such steps as the reports of their health officer rendered advisable, and have also found funds for the purchase of disinfectants, the payment of nurses, and such other disbursements, as any reported cases occurred.
