REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS. (Issued under the Amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 86, section 2.)

LN cases where the Commissioner of Trade and Customs is satisfied that a refund of duties is justly due, the necessity for such refunds arising either from overpayment of duty or from any error, the repayment may be granted. This regulation, however, shall not apply to any drawback, refund, or omission authorised by the Customs Act 1857, nor sanction any refund or remission disallowed by the Customs Act 1857.

sanction any return of Termsson unashorter by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may obtain from the Governor a quarterly authority under the 32nd clause of the regulations respecting public accounts, dated 1st May, 1859, instead of a special authority as is now required by the 35th clause of the regulations.

This regulation shall have force from the 1st January, 1861.
