CERTAIN DIVISIONS OF THE ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF MANDURANG AND OF THE NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE, ALTERED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of December, 1860.

WHEREAS by two several Orders of the Governor in Council, bearing date the thirtieth day of July now last past, the electoral districts and provinces were divided, and the limits and boundaries of the divisions thereof were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter certain of the divisions of the electoral district of Mandurang and of the North-Western province: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, alter the Mandurang, White Hills, and Elysian Flat divisions of the electoral district of Mandurang and of the North-Western province, and doth hereby appoint that the limits and boundaries of such divisions respectively shall be the limits and boundaries mentioned in the fourth column of the schedule hereunto annexed opposite to the name of each of such divisions, that is to say:—

North-Western	Mandurang	Mandurang	Commencing on the Campaspe River, at the south-east angle of the parish of Axedale; thence west by the southern boundary of the parish of Axedale and by a road running west through the parish of Strathfieldsaye to the eastern boundary of the borough of Sandhurst, being the southern boundary of the electoral division of White Hills; thence southerly along part of the eastern boundary of the Sandhurst borough to its south-east corner; thence west along its southern boundary and a line bearing due west to Myer's Creek; thence south-westerly by a right line to the north-west angle of the electoral borough of Lockwood; thence by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of said borough and a line due south to the south-east angle of the electoral division of Marong, being a point due east of the junction of the River Loddon and Bet-bet Creek; thence due east to a point in the Mount Alexander range, in the eastern boundary of the county of Talbot; thence southerly along the said range to Myrtle Creek; thence northerly and easterly along the said creek to its junction with the Coliban River; thence northerly along the said river to its junction with the River Campaspe; thence northerly along the Campaspe River to the commencing point.
		White Hills	Commencing on the River Campaspe, at the north-east corner of allotment 4, section 8, parish of Elmore; thence along the north and west boundaries of the parishes of Elmore, Goornong, Bagshot, and Huntley, to the south-west corner of allotment 12, section 20, parish of Huntley; thence east to the Bendigo Creek; thence along the Bendigo Creek to the boundary of the borough of Sandhurst; thence along the north and east boundaries of said borough until the same is intersected by a road running east through the parish of Strathfieldsaye, and forming the southern boundary of the parish of Axedale; thence along this road to the Campaspe River; and thence along this river to the starting point.
		Elysian Flat	Commencing at a point in the western boundary of the electoral division of White Hills, due west of the north-east corner of allotment 4, section 8, parish of Elmore; thence due west to the common point of intersection of the boundaries of the electoral divisions of Mount Hope, Pyramid Creek, and Marong, being a point due east of the junction of the Serpentine Creek and River Loddon; thence due south to Myer's Creek; thence along the same creek to a point due west of the south-west angle of the electoral borough of Sandhurst; thence due east to the said point; thence along the western and northern boundaries of the said electoral borough of Sandhurst to the Bendigo Creek; thence northerly along the said creek to the south-east angle of allotment 12, section 20, parish of Huntley; thence west to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence along the western and northern boundary of the electoral division of White Hills to the commencing point.

THE INTERVALS AT WHICH COURTS OF MINES ARE TO BE HELD AT BUNINYONG, SMYTHESDALE, BLACKWOOD, AND STEIGLITZ, ALTERED.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 21st year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that within and for every mining district there referred to there shall be a court, to be called the Court of Mines; and such court shall be holden at such intervals and at such places within such district as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the 7th day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the court of mines within and for the district of Ballarat was ordered to be holden at Smythesdale and Buninyong once at least in every two calendar months, at Blackwood once at least in every three calendar months, and at Steiglitz once at least in every four calendar months: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said intervals at the said places respectively: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the said Court of Mines shall be holden within and for the mining district of Ballarat, at Buninyong and Smythesdale respectively, once at least in every three calendar months, instead of once at least in every two calendar months; at Blackwood, once at least in every three calendar months; and at Steiglitz, once at least in every six calendar months, instead of once at least in every four calendar months.

And the Honorable Richard Davies Ireland, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROPOSED ROAD.

COUNTY OF MORNINGTON.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the parishes of Moorooduc and Kangerong, in the county of Mornington (being portion of the road between Snapper Point and Dromana), proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND REQUIRED.—Portion of section No. 31, in the parish of Moorooduc, in the county of Mornington, and is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the south boundary of the said section distant forty chains fifty links from the south-east corner thereof, and running thence west one chain two links; thence it is bounded by two lines running parallel and at the respective distances of fifty links on each side of a line commencing at a point on the before-named south boundary distant forty-one chains one link west from the aforesaid south-east corner, and running thence north 4 degrees east five chains; thence north-westerly by a curve of sixteen chains radius, eight chains; thence north 24 degrees west four chains seventy links; thence by a curve of fifteen chains fifty links radius north-westerly five chains to a point on the north-west boundary of the section at the re-entering angle thereof; and thence by lines running along the said boundary respectively fifty-one links east 36 degrees 40 minutes north and five chains south 11 degrees 30 minutes west to the last described point. It contains two acres one rood three perches, is valued at the sum of Six pounds sixteen shilling and three halfpence, at the rate of £3 per acre, and is the property of the representatives of the late James Hearn, and occupied by the same.

Measles and scarlatina are reported as on the decline in all the suburban districts. The mortality among children is nevertheless very high: the main causes of death being dysentery, diarrhoea, and convulsions. At Collingwood out of 28 deaths twenty-one were of children under three years of age. In Melbourne out of 50 deaths thirty-three were at the same tender age. In Prahran seven deaths out of nine were of infants, and the causes of death assigned were croup, cholera, convulsions, hooping-cough, scarlatina, and measles. Over the whole of the metropolitan district more deaths than births have been registered.
