#### PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

#### SMYTHESDALE.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-five householders resident at Smythesdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

R. HEALES.

The petitioners state that the township of Smythesdale is situated in the centre of a very extensive mining district; that the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable expense; and that there are more than 300 householders resident within the boundaries of the township.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets of the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense; and that the erection of the township into a municipal district will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest that the boundaries of the township specified in the *Government Gazette* [of 19th April, 1859, page 808] be the boundaries of the municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz. :—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality under the name of 'The Municipal District of Smythesdale,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

#### MOUNT ELIZA DISTRICT ROAD BOARD. RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MOUNT ELIZA DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

**T**HE general board meetings shall be held every alternate Monday, of which public notice shall be given, at the office of the road board, and may be attended by all inhabitants and ratepayers of the district; but no person otherwise than the members of the board shall take any part in the proceedings, and any person interrupting shall be requested to retire.

#### ORDER OF BUSINESS.

- Minutes of last meeting to be read and confirmed, and no discussion on them allowed, except as to their accuracy.
- Correspondence to be read.
- Petitions to be presented.
- Reports of committees to be read for confirmation and adoption.
- No discussion to be allowed on either the correspondence or petitions until all other business and orders of the day are disposed of, and if any should remain unconsidered they shall become the orders of the day for the next meeting.
- Notices of motion for next meeting.
- Secretary to report—
  - 1st. Banker's balance.
  - 2nd. Liabilities actually incurred.
  - 3rd. Balance in hands of collector and treasurer.
  - 4th. Amount of rates collected since last meeting.
- Cheques to be drawn as may be deemed necessary.
- The chairman may then bring under notice of the board such business as he may consider necessary.
- On the bringing up of any committee report, it shall be competent for any member to move its adjournment for consideration at the following meeting of the board, and the secretary shall state in the summonses that such a report is to be considered, the same to have precedence of all other orders of the day.
- No resolution involving an outlay of above Ten pounds shall be considered (except on the report of a committee) unless notice of motion be given, and such notice entered by the secretary in all summonses for the meeting at which the same is to be considered.
- Notices of motion may be handed to the secretary within nine days of any regular day of meeting, and such notices shall be stated in the summonses calling the meeting, and shall take their turn for consideration in regular order of the day. The member giving such notice may authorise any other member of the board to bring forward the subject on his behalf, in case of illness or unavoidable absence.

#### GENERAL.

Any member making a motion or amendment shall sign and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without consent of the board, nor shall any motion or amendment be entertained nor discussed until seconded.

Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the board.

Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on such motion or amendment. Should two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-eminence.

Any motion for adjournment, when seconded, shall be put at once to the meeting without discussion, and if negatived, shall not be again made until the subject under discussion has been disposed of.

No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, nor shall a reply be allowed to the mover of any amendment, but the same shall be accorded to the mover of an original motion. After such reply, the questions shall be at once put to the vote in the following order, viz. :—The last amendment first, and so on until an affirmative vote be arrived at. On any amendment being carried, it shall be held to have quashed the original motion and all other amendments.

No member shall digress from the subject matter under discussion, nor impute improper motives to others, nor occupy the time of the board by speaking more than fifteen minutes on any motion or amendment; and every member shall stand up whilst addressing the board.

The decision of the chairman shall be final in all matters of order, but he shall be at liberty to take the sense of the board on any question in dispute, which decision, if taken, shall be also final. Any member shall be at liberty to call the attention of the chairman to a point of order or the infringement of any part of these bye-laws, and any member so called to order shall sit down whilst the same is under discussion, but shall be able to speak to the point of order by way of explanation.

Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being spoken, and any member who shall use any unbecoming expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a suitable apology to the board.

Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or motion under discussion.

The board shall vote by show of hands.

No motion to rescind a resolution of the board shall be entertained unless a call of the whole board has been made for the purpose, and no motion to rescind such resolution shall, if negatived, be again brought forward for the space of six months.

In the event of vacancies occurring in the offices at the disposal of the board, no new elections shall take place unless such vacancy has been advertised in such manner as the board may direct, nor unless the time of election shall have been set forth in the summonses to each member of the board.

The salary and allowances to all officers of the board shall be determined on, in all cases, before proceeding to the election.

No member or officer of the board shall be allowed to contract for any work to be done for or in connexion with the board, nor be received as security for any contractor for such work, nor officer of the board.

No collector nor any other officer of the board shall distrain for any amount of rate due unless he shall receive a warrant from the chairman empowering him to do so, except in cases of emergency, where it is apparent there is an intention to evade payment, in which case the distraint levied on the authority of the collector shall be reported to the board at the following meeting.

All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised in such manner and in such newspapers as may be directed, and by notices posted in conspicuous places in the district. Each tender shall be endorsed for the particular work, directed to the chairman, and shall be left at the road board office. No tenders shall be opened except in presence of the board or the committee authorised by the board. The respective amounts shall be entered on the minutes and due security taken for the performance of each contract. All bonds or contract deeds shall be signed by two members acting on behalf of the board, and also by the contractors and their sureties; the expense of preparing such bonds or contracts, in all cases, to be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

All moneys received by way of assessment, together with the share of grants-in-aid, shall be expended in the immediate vicinity of the parish in which the same are raised.

On the secretary receiving seven days' notice, signed by any three members of the board, he shall call a special meeting.

Any one or more of the clauses of these bye-laws may be suspended *pro tem*, in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the whole board.

The foregoing bye-laws of the Mount Eliza District Road Board were agreed to unanimously, all the members of the board being present, at a meeting held 19th December, 1860, at the Masonic Hall, Snapper point.

##### MUNICIPALITY OF SANDRIDGE.

THE First Half-yearly Report of the Municipal Council of Sandridge, up to the 16th February, 1861.

##### ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

The first meeting of the council was held on 16th August, 1860. There were present Councillors Morley, Thomas, Swallow, Isaacs, Allen, and Glynn. Two names were put in nomination for the office of chairman, viz.—Councillor Morley, and Councillor Plummer, who was absent. Councillor Swallow declined to vote. Councillor Morley was elected by a majority of one.

##### RESIGNATION AND ELECTION.

On the 23rd August, 1860, Councillor Plummer, sent in his resignation, which was accepted by the council; and on 28th November, 1860, an election was held to supply the vacancy

thus occasioned in the council. Richard Elworthy, Esq., was elected, and took his seat at the council table at the sixteenth meeting.

#### APPOINTMENTS.

On 30th August, 1860, Mr. Edward Clark, of Sandridge, was appointed clerk to the council.

On 6th December, 1860, Mr. Frederick William Bull, of Williamstown, was appointed town surveyor, rate collector, and inspector of nuisances; but the council finding that the duties of surveying interfered with the collection of the rates, advertised for tenders for collecting on commission, and on the 31st January, 1861, Mr. John Gledhill's tender for collecting at 2½ per cent. was accepted.

The Honorable R. S. Anderson, M.L.A., has consented to act as solicitor to the council.

#### MEETINGS AND ATTENDANCE.

Councillor Plummer did not attend the council previously to his resignation.

#### ASSESSMENT AND RATES.

At the third special meeting of the council, held on 29th October, 1860, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound was struck; the threepence being intended to meet the cost of lighting the district with gas. The valuation of property in the district was made by Mr. W. F. Westall, whose tender for that purpose was accepted by the council on the 30th August, 1860. The number of buildings in the district at the time of making the valuation was 914. The amount of assessment after appeal was £36,675 at 1s. 3d. = £2289 13s. 9d. The reductions on appeal amounted to about 2½ per cent. on the total original assessment.

#### APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The following applications have been made to Government, with the results as stated below:—

- For £1000, grant-in-aid.—Granted.
- For supply of *Government Gazette*.—Granted.
- For a site for municipal chambers.—Granted.

- To prevent licenses being granted for removing loam and sand from the north and west of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway.—Refused.
- For the use of new court house for the sittings of council.—Granted.
- For town commonage.—Under consideration.
- To place a sum on the estimates for 1861 for the extension of the town jetty.—Will attend to.
- For a site for an orphanage or other charitable institution.—Refused.
- To sell certain land north of the M. and H.B. Railway.—Not recommended at present.
- For a site for a seaman's home.—Not granted.
- For a site for abattoirs.—Under consideration.
- For deeds of grant of market reserves.—Will be issued as soon as occupied.
- For permission to light the court house with gas.—Granted.
- To set out the streets in accordance with 18 Victoria No. 14.—Town surveyor authorised to undertake this.

#### BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council and assented to by His Excellency the Governor:—

- No. 1. To regulate, by means of standing orders, the proceedings of the municipal council of Sandridge.
- No. 2. For regulating the proceedings at the election of chairman, and at elections of members of the municipal council, and public meetings of ratepayers.
- No. 3. For levying a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound for the current municipal year 1860-1.

#### PUBLIC WORKS.

- The following works have been carried out:—
- Cleansing channels in Beach and Bay streets.
- Cleansing Bay street of drift sand, from Liardet street to Graham street.
- Cleansing sand from off Beach street.
- Taking up and relaying cube crossing at the intersection of Bay and Graham streets.
- Repairing culvert on Sandridge road.
- Board at south end of lagoon to warn passengers of danger.

The fencing-in of the general market reserve has been just completed. The making-up of footpaths in Beach and Bay streets is now in progress.

The following works are under consideration:—

- Raising Heath and Nott streets, from Raglan street to Ingles street, and forming same.
- Porting and metalling Liardet street, a width of 15 feet, from Bay street to Railway place.
- Forming and metalling Graham street, from Railway place to Railway fence.
- Making up Beach street, from Railway place to Bay street.
- Forming and kerbing footpath in Station place.
- Forming and kerbing footpaths in Bay and Graham streets, and the Sandridge road to the boundary.
- Drainage of the swamp in the centre of the township.

#### BEACH STREET.

A correspondence with the Government has been in progress since September last on the subject of Beach street. Previously to the proclamation of this district as a municipality, the council of the corporation of Melbourne caused Beach street, with some other streets in the district, to be defined on a plan which was submitted to and approved of by His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council. In pursuance of this approval the streets defined were proclaimed on 19th March, 1860. The municipal council having had under consideration the dirty, dangerous, and disgraceful state of Beach street, caused by certain parties keeping thereon, in the most disorderly manner and without reference to public safety and convenience, lumber, old iron, and marine stores, determined to give said parties one month's notice to clear the street. This was not attended to, and the consequence was that these parties were summoned to the Sandridge police court under 18 Victoria No. 14; the magistrates remanded the cases for the purpose of seeking the opinion of the law officers of the Crown. On the re-hearing of the cases, that opinion it was stated by the bench, was adverse to the authority of the council, because the width of the street (although set forth on the plan) had not been defined in feet in the proclamation, and therefore the bench dismissed the cases. The council, however, maintain that the Government is bound, from the fact of having assented to the plan, which shows the width, to remedy the defect stated by the law officers, and re-proclaim Beach street according to the plan. The council has every reason to believe that the new proclamation will shortly be gazetted.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

The importance of a road between this municipality and that of St. Kilda has occupied the attention of the council, and mutual action by the two councils has been taken in the matter, but the question is at present in abeyance.

The district is greatly indebted to the superintendent and directors of the Victoria Sugar Company for the gratuitous supply of the ashes produced on the company's premises. These ashes are now being largely used in the construction of footpaths.
