PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sie Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the areas hereinafter defined shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act that is to say: that is to say :-

Belvoir, Murray District.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 5, section 15, parish of Belvoir; thence S. 1° 6′ W. 77 chains 22 links; thence S. 2° W. 57 chains 64 links; thence east 175 chains 65 links; thence N. 1° 5° W. 108 chains to the Murray River; and by that river northerly and westerly to a point on its south bank bearing N. 1° 6′ E. PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Siz Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, initiated, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things contect, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the potition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands on the being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common," provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or rear the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act. Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be Farmens Commons on the exercise of the right of common similar to make any index and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as may be hereafter prescribed, that is to say:—
