## TOWNS.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered TOWNS within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the areas hereinafter defined shall be considered TOWNS within the meaning of the said Act that is to say:—

BELVOIR, Murray District.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 5, section 15, parish of Belvoir; thence S. 1° 6' W. 77 chains 22 links; thence S. 20° W. 57 chains 64 links; thence east 175 chains 65 links; thence N. 1° 56' W. 108 chains to the Murray River; and by that river northerly and westerly to a point on its south bank bearing N. 1° 6' E. from the commencing point; thence S. 1° 6' W. 121 chains to the commencing point.

BOORGUNYAH, county unnamed, Murray District, Parish of North Barnawatha.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the town reserve, bearing east 1 chain 50 links from the north-east angle of allotment 5, section 31, parish of North Barnawatha; thence (along the north boundaries of lots 5, 4, 3, and 2, of section 31, parish last named) west 78 chains 8 links to the north-west angle of allotment 2, section 31; thence west 1 chain 50 links to the west side of a street; thence by that side of a street north to the Murray River; thence by that river easterly, northerly, southerly, and easterly to a point due north of the commencing point; thence by the east side of Howell street south to the point of commencement.

CARLYLE, situate on Murray River, Murray District.—Commencing at the intersection of the east side of the main road from Carlyle to Wangaratta, at a point on the south boundary of the township; thence east 56 chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of town reserve; thence north 196 chains 50 links to the Murray River; thence by that river westerly and southerly to a point due west of the commencing point; thence east 71 chains, more or less, to the commencing point.

**FRYERSTOWN**, County of Talbot.—Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the town reserve, bearing west 41 chains from the intersection of the east side of Castlemaine street with the north side of Camp street; thence north 59 chains 50 links; thence east 80 chains; thence south 80 chains; thence west 80 chains; thence north 29 chains 50 links to the point of commencement.

**HARCOURT**, Counties of Talbot and unnamed, Parish of Harcourt.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 27, section 4, parish of Harcourt, at a point 1 chain south thereof; thence on the south by a line bearing west 80 chains; thence north 160 chains; thence east 80 chains; thence south 160 chains to the commencing point.

**NEWSTEAD**, County of Talbot and County unnamed, Parish of Strangways.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the town reserve, being a point bearing west 1 chain from the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 1, parish of Strangways; bounded on the west by a line bearing north 100 chains; thence on the north by a line bearing east 160 chains; thence on the east by a line bearing south 100 chains; thence on the south by a line bearing west 160 chains to the point of commencement.

**VACCHAN**, County of Talbot, situate at the junction of Fryer's Creek with the Loddon River.—Commencing at a point on the Loddon River bearing about N. 61° W. 31 chains, more or less, from the junction of Fryer's Creek with the Loddon River; bounded on the west by a line bearing north 25 chains, more or less; thence east 60 chains; thence south, crossing Fryer's Creek, to the Loddon River; and by that river north-westerly to the point of commencement.

**WOOLSTHORPE**, County of Villiers.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 7, section A, parish of Meerai; thence along the north boundaries of allotments 7 and 8, and a line west, 80 chains; thence north 160 chains; thence east 80 chains; thence south 160 chains to the commencing point.

## FARMERS' COMMONS.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be FARMERS' COMMONS for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intention and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as may be hereafter prescribed, that is to say:—

**AT ANAKIE**, County of Grant, Parish of Anakie.—Extent about 7150 acres: Being unalienated Crown lands shown as reserves on plan of the parish of Anakie, county of Grant, and commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 81; bounded on the east by allotments 90, 103, and 104, bearing north to the Little River; on the north by the Little River westerly about 1½ mile; on the west by a line bearing south about 3½ miles to the north boundary of allotment 89; and on the south by part of the north boundary of allotment 89, and the north boundary of allotment 83, to commencing point. Also, commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 48; bounded on the east by allotments 48, 49, 50, 51, 83, and 89, bearing north; on the north by a line bearing west about 1 mile; on the west by a line bearing south about 2 miles; and on the south by the north boundary of a reserve, bearing east about 1 mile to commencing point.

**AT AXEDALE**, County unnamed, Parish of Axedale.—Area, 3866 acres.

First portion.—Comprising allotments 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 of section 9, parish of Axedale, and allotments 6

and 10 of section 5 of same parish, and allotment 17 of section 2 of same parish. Area, 2378 acres.

Second portion.—Commencing at a point bearing south 45° west 100 links from the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 2, parish of Axedale; thence south 45° west 16650 links along east side of a road; thence south 89° 9' east 11063 links; thence south 83° 30' east 11158 links, these last two lines being along north side of a road; thence by a continuation of same on the following bearings and distances—north 90° 43' east 330 links, north 66° 13' east 250 links, north 52° 43' east 250 links, north 37° 43' east 1000 links, north 55° 48' east 300 links, north 81° 43' east 250 links to intersection with south side of a road; thence by south side of said road (which bounds section 2 of parish of Axedale on the south-west) north 45° west 17100 links to the commencing point. Area, 1488 acres.

**AT BALLAN**, County of Grant, Parish unnamed.—Extent, about 13000 acres: Comprising sections 1 to 11, parish unnamed; adjoining on the west the parish of Gorong and on the south the parish of Moorabool West; also commencing at the south-west angle of portion 1 of section 4 of the aforesaid unnamed parish; bounded on the north by sections 4, 3, 2, and 1 to the Moorabool River; on the east by this river to its junction with the Green Hill Gully; on the south by the Green Hill Gully in a westerly direction and by a line to the north-east angle of Mount Egerton reserve, and by part of the north boundary of this reserve, bearing west about 40 chains; and on the west by a line bearing north about 1 mile to the commencing point.

**AT BARINGHUP EAST**, County of Talbot and unnamed, Parish of Baringhup.—Extent, about 6414 acres: Commencing at a point on the Lower Loddon the south-west corner of the township boundary of Baringhup, and bounded on the south from thence by the southern boundary line of the township, bearing east to its south-east corner; thence by a line easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 10, section 1 A; and thence easterly by a Government roadway forming the southern boundary lines of allotments 10, 11, 12, and 13, section 1 A, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; bounded on the east by a Government roadway bearing north, being the eastern boundary line of allotments 13, 7, and 4, section 1 A, to its intersection with the Maldon and Dunolly main telegraph road; bounded on the north by the last-named road, bearing north-westerly to its intersection with the northern boundary line of the parish of Baringhup; and thence by the parish boundary line, bearing west to the north-west angle of the parish; and bounded on the west from thence by the parish boundary line, bearing south to the River Loddon; and thence by the River Loddon, bearing east and south to the commencing point. Exclusive of alienated lands within the before-mentioned boundaries.

**AT BARINGHUP WEST**, County of Talbot, Parish of Eddington.—Extent, about 11000 acres: Being the unappropriated Crown lands in the parish of Eddington, between the Deep Creek and the Loddon River.

**AT BARNAWATHA**.—Area, about 5400 acres: Commencing at the south-east angle of portion E, parish of North Barnawatha; thence south 80 chains, more or less; thence west 430 chains, more or less, until it intersects the east side of the main line of road from Melbourne to Sydney; thence north and north-easterly along the southern side of said road until it intersects the north-west angle of portion G, parish of North Barnawatha; thence by the west side of said portion G south to its south-west angle; thence east along the south sides of portions G, F, and E, same parish, to the south-east angle of portion E, the commencing point. Also, that portion of land lying between the Murray River and the north boundaries of allotments 1, 2, and 3, section 29, North Barnawatha; 1, 2, and 3, section 30, same parish, and the north boundary of the township of Boor-gunyah. Likewise that portion of land lying between the Murray River and the north boundaries of portions B, C, and D, parish of North Barnawatha.

**AT BET-BET**, County unnamed, Parish of Dunolly.—Extent, about 5120 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 10 of section 1, Burnt Creek, parish of Dunolly; bounded on the east by part of the west boundary of the parish of Eddington and by a line together bearing north about 218 chains; on the north by a line bearing west about 160 chains; on the west by a line bearing south about 218 chains to a point bearing west 1 chain 50 links from the north-west angle of portion 1 of section 2; and on the south by the north boundaries of portions 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 2, and portions 1, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 of section 1 to commencing point.

**AT BET-BET**, County unnamed, Parish of Rathscar.—Extent, about 5500 acres: Commencing at a point bearing west 1 chain from the north-west angle of portion 1 of section 3, parish of Wareek; bounded on the north by a line bearing west about 116 chains 73 links; on the west by a line bearing south about 330 chains; on the south by part of the south boundary of the parish of Rathscar, bearing east about 55 chains 73 links, and by the north boundaries of portions 1 and 2 of section 1, parish of Bung Bong, bearing east about 110 chains; and on the east by the west boundary of the parish of Wareek, bearing north about 330 chains to commencing point.

**AT BIRREGURRA**, County of Grenville, Parish of Birregurra.—Extent, about 5555 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 62, parish of Birregurra; bounded on the north by a road bearing east about 5 miles 48 chains to the north-east angle of allotment 31; on the east by a road bearing south to the main road from Geelong to Colac about 4 chains 85 links; on the south by this main road westerly to the Birregurra Creek; on the west and south by this creek to the south-east angle of Messrs. Nicol and Ayrey's pre-emptive section; thence by the east boundary of this pre-emptive section, bearing north about 43 chains; thence, including allotment 68, and from a point bearing east about 1 chain 2 links

from the north-east angle of this allotment, on the west by a road 1 chain wide, bearing north  $6^{\circ}$  west about 90 chains to commencing point.

**AT BOWMAN'S FOREST, Bowman's Forest, Beechworth District.**—Area, about 7167 acres: Being allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, section 3; 1, 2, 4, and 5, section 1; 4, 5, and 6, section 2; 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 5; 4 and 5, section 6; 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, section 9, and allotment 5, section 10, all in the parish of Murrumbidgee. Likewise that portion of land lying between the range and the north-west boundaries of allotments 6, 5, and 1, section 4; 5, 4, and 1, section 1; and the north boundaries of allotments 1 and 2, section 1; 1, 2, and 3, section 2, and 8, 7, 6, and 5, section 3, parish of Murrumbidgee.

**AT BUNG BONG, County of Talbot, Parish of Bung Bong.**—Extent, about 607½ acres: Commencing at the intersection of McNeil's Creek with the south boundary of the parish of Wareek; bounded on the north by part of the south boundary of the parish aforesaid, bearing east about 80 chains; on the east by a line bearing south about 271 chains to the main road from Maryborough to Avoca; on the south by the main road aforesaid, bearing westerly about 2 miles 20 chains to its intersection with a one-chain wide road on the east side of the Bet-bet Creek from Ballarat to Dunolly; and on the west by the aforesaid road, bearing northerly about 4 miles to commencing point. Also, commencing at a point bearing west about 1 chain from the north-west angle of portion 1 of section 1, parish of Bung Bong; bounded on the east by a road bearing south about 263 chains to the south-west angle of portion 13 of section 2; on the south by a line bearing west about 1 mile; on the west by a line bearing north about 4 miles 45 chains; on the north by a line bearing east about 1 mile; and on the east by a line bearing south about 102 chains to commencing point.

**AT BROADFORD, County of Dalhousie, Parish of Broadford.**—Area, about 1610 acres: Consists of allotments 60, 62, 63, 67, 67 A, 73, 73 A, 74, 74 A, 75, 100, and 101.

**AT BURKE, DRUMMOND, AND EDGECOMBE, County of Talbot, Parish of Burke.**—Extent, about 8750 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of portion 16 of section 1, parish of Burke; bounded on the north by part of the south boundary of the parish of Drummond and by a line together bearing west about 120 chains 50 links; on the west by the eastern boundary of the parish of Holcombe, bearing south about 380 chains; on the south by part of the north boundary of the parish of Glenlyon, bearing east about 23 chains; on the west by part of the east boundary of the same parish, bearing south about 1 mile to the proposed main road from Kyneton to Daylesford; on the south by this road, bearing easterly to the Kangaroo Creek; on the east by the Kangaroo Creek in a northerly direction to the south-east angle of portion 15 of section 4; on the north by the south boundary of portion 15 aforesaid, bearing west to the main road to Malmesbury; on the east by this road, bearing north-easterly to the south-east angle of portion 12 of section 4; on the north by portion 12, bearing west; on the east by portions 12 and 9, bearing north; on the south by part of portion 9, bearing east; on the east by portion 8, bearing north; on the south by part of portion 8, bearing east to a tributary to the Kangaroo Creek, forming the west boundaries of portions 5, 4, and 1 of section 4, and 3, 2, and 1 of section 2; on the east by these west boundaries aforesaid to the north-west angle of portion 1, of section 2; on the north by part of portion 17 of section 1, bearing west; and on the east by the west boundaries of portions 17 and 16 of section 1 to commencing point.

**AT CARISBROOK, County of Talbot.**—Extent, about 2500 acres: Commencing at a point bearing north 1 chain 50 links from the north-east angle of section 30, parish of Carisbrook; bounded on the north by the south boundary of section 31 and by a line bearing west about 114 chains; on the west by a line bearing south about 205 chains; on the south by a line bearing east about 71 chains to the south-west angle of section 5; on the east by the west boundary of section 5; on the south by the north boundary of the same; on the south-east by the main road from Carisbrook to Dunolly, bearing north-easterly about 5 chains; on the east by sections 27 and 28; on the south by a road 1½ chain wide, bearing east 37 chains to the main road from Carisbrook to Dunolly; and on the east by the main road, bearing north about 87 chains 50 links to commencing point.

**AT CARISBROOK, County of Talbot.**—Extent, about 3535 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of Mount Greenock Creek reserve, parish of Craigie; bounded on the north by a road 1½ chain wide, bearing east about 68 chains; on the west by a road of similar width, bearing north about 63 chains; on the north by a road of similar width, bearing east about 125 chains; on the east by a line bearing south about 143 chains; on the south by a line bearing south  $57^{\circ} 25'$  west about 234 chains; and on the west by a line and the Mount Greenock reserve's eastern boundary, bearing north about 203 chains to commencing point.

**AT CARISBROOK AND MOOLORT, County of Talbot, Parish of Moolort.**—Extent, about 4450 acres: Commencing at the north angle of portion 1 A of section 4, parish of Moolort; bounded on the east by the eastern boundaries of portions 1 A, 2 A, 2 B, 3 A, 3 B, 16, and 17 of section 4; on the south by the two chains wide road from Novstead to Carisbrook to the south-west angle of portion 11 of section 4; on the west by the west boundaries of portions 11, 10, and 9 A; and on the north-west by the main three chains wide road from Carisbrook to Maldon north-easterly to commencing point. Exclusive of alienated land within the above-mentioned boundaries.

**AT CARLSRUHE, County of Dalhousie, Parish unnamed.**—Extent, about 15000 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of section 34, parish of Langley; bounded on the north by a line bearing east about 5 miles; on the east by a line bearing south about 3 miles 40 chains to the dividing range; on the south and east by the dividing range to where the main road from Lancefield to Carlsruhe crosses it; on the south by this

road westerly to the south-east angle of section 95, parish of Carlsruhe; on the west by part of the east boundary of this parish, bearing north to the north-east angle of section 79; on the south by part of the north boundary of this parish, bearing westerly to the south-east angle of section 40, parish of Langley; and on the west by the east boundaries of sections 40, 39, 38, 37, 37, 35, and 34, parish of Langley, to commencing point.

**AT CONEWARRE, County of Grant, Parish of Conewarre.**—Extent, about 4500 acres: Being all the unappropriated Crown lands within the parish of Conewarre.

**AT CRAIGIE AND EGLINTON, County of Talbot.**—Extent, about 5900 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 17 of section 2, parish of Eglinton; bounded on the west by the road to Carisbrook, bearing northerly about 5 miles to a point bearing east about 1 chain 50 links from the south angle of portion 6 of section 3, parish of Craigie; on the north by the south boundary of McCullum Creek gold fields common, bearing east about 130 chains; on the east by a line bearing south about 226 chains to the south-west angle of portion 15 of section 8, parish of Eglinton; on the south-east by a line bearing south-westerly about 275 chains to the eastern angle of allotment 41 of section 8; on the south-west by allotments 41, 40, 39, and 38 of section 8, and 22, 23, and 24 of section 2; on the north-east by a road 1½ chain wide, bearing S.  $67^{\circ} 25'$  E, about 15 chains 21 links; on the west by allotment 21 of section 2, bearing N.  $16^{\circ} 20'$  E, about 16 chains 85 links; and on the south by allotments 21, 20, 19, 18, and 17 of section 2 to commencing point. Exclusive of all alienated land within the before-mentioned boundaries.

**AT DARRIWIL, County of Grant, Parishes of Durdidwarrah, Anakie, and Yowang.**—Extent, about 6300 acres: Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Durdidwarrah; bounded on the east by part of the east boundary of this parish, bearing north about 3 miles; on the north by a line bearing west about 1 mile 40 chains to the eastern boundary of Steiglitz gold fields common; on the west by part of the east boundary of the common aforesaid, bearing south about 1 mile; on the north by the south boundary of this common, bearing west about 2 miles, and by a line on same bearing about half a mile; on the west by a line bearing south about 1½ mile; and on the south by the Moorarbool River and the south boundary of the parish of Durdidwarrah, bearing east about 3½ miles to commencing point. Exclusive of alienated lands within the before-mentioned boundaries.

**AT DUCK PONDS, County of Grant, Parishes of Morang-hurk and Woornyalook.**—Extent, about 3200 acres: Being the unappropriated Crown lands within the parishes of Morang-hurk and Woornyalook.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to give to such district some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof, and also again to abolish any such district, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the several districts therein mentioned were erected into mining districts: And whereas by another Order bearing date the fifth day of January, 1860, the limits of the mining district of Castlemaine were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient again to alter the limits of the said mining district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the mining district of Castlemaine, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof to be as follow, that is to say:—

Commencing at the junction of the Deep Creek and the River Loddon; thence by a line easterly to the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence by a line bearing south five miles; thence by a line bearing east to the parish of Harcourt; thence by the northern boundary of that parish and the Mount Alexander Range to the Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek and the River Coliban to the River Campaspe; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor or Patterson's Creek; thence south-westerly by the Dividing Range at the sources of Mollison's Creek to the Main Dividing Range; thence south-westerly by the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the range separating the Bullarook and Joyce's Creeks and a line west to the junction of the Tullaroop and Bullarook Creeks; thence northwards by the Deep Creek to the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that parish, and again by the Deep Creek to the commencing point aforesaid.

Commencing again at the junction of the Kooyong-koot Creek and the River Yarra; thence by a line south to the main road leading to Gipps Land; thence easterly by the main road leading to Gipps Land to the sources of the River La Trobe; thence by the Dividing Range forming the basin of the River Yarra to the source of the River Plenty; thence by the River Plenty to the River Yarra; and thence by the River Yarra to the commencing point last aforesaid.
