QUARANTINE.

THE existence of Small-pox among the passengers of the ship *Donald McKay*, recently arrived in Port Phillip Bay from Liverpool, having been reported to the Government, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has ordered that the commander, crew, and all other persons on board of the said vessel, be detained in Quarantine, at the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, for a period of fourteen days from the 12th instant.

His Excellency, with the advice aforesaid, has also ordered the said vessel, and the goods, wares, and merchandise on board thereof, to be released from quarantine from the 14th instant, upon condition that the said vessel be delivered over to a fresh master and crew.

All persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean aforesaid are specified in a Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1852.
