POLICE AUTHORISED TO PREFER INFORMATION AGAINST UNAUTHORISED OCCUPANTS OF CROWN LANDS.

THE Board of Land and Works has authorised and empowered the officers and men of the Police Force in the colony of Victoria to prefer informations in writing under and in pursuance of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, 24th Victoria No 117, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, to any justice of the peace against any person or persons in the unauthorised occupation of any Crown lands within the colony of Victoria, or in the occupation of any such lands in virtue or under color of any lease, the term of which shall have expired or become forfeited, or of any license which has been forfeited or revoked.

FARMERS' COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now recited section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereafter described to be FARMERS' COMMONS for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intention and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the

exercise of the right of common as may be hereafter prescribed, that is to say:—

AT BAGSHOT AND GOORNONG, County unnamed, Parishes of Bagshot and Goornong.—Extent, about 4000 acres: Being all the unappropriated Crown lands within the parishes of Bagshot and Goornong.

AT BOROONDARA, County of Bourke, Parishes of Pahrnan and Boroondara.—Extent, about 93 acres: Being allotment 204, parish of Pahrnan, and allotment 136 A, parish of Boroondara, on the Kooryoung Koor Creek.

AT BUNGAREE, County of Grant, Parish of Bungaree.—Extent, about 3066 acres: Being portions 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 16, portions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 of section 17, portions 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 18, portions 1 and 2 of section 19, portions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 27, a reserve to the south of portions 5 and 6 aforesaid, and portion 5 of section 28, parish of Bungaree.

AT CAMPERDOWN, County of Hampden, Parish of Merri-da Yallock.—Extent, about 2145 acres: Commencing at the south-east angle of lot 12, section 16; bounded on the north by a line bearing west about 100 chains to a creek; thence by this creek westerly to the north-east angle of lot 1 of section 12; on the west by a road 1 chain wide, bearing south about 143 chains 93 links; on the south by a line bearing east about 156 chains 44 links; and on the east by a road 3 chains wide, bearing north about 133 chains 93 links to commencing point.

AT CATHCART, County of Ripon, Parish of Burrumbeep.—Extent, about 1746 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 10 of section 1, parish of Burrumbeep; bounded on the north by a road 1 chain wide, bearing west 75 chains 98 links, and by a line on same, bearing about 1 mile 20 chains to the Dividing Range; on the west by the Dividing Range, bearing southerly about 2 miles 40 chains to the road from Lexington to Cathcart; on the south by this road, bearing westerly to the south-west angle of portion 7 of section 6; on the east by portions 7 and 6 of section 6, bearing north 20 chains 72 links; on the south by the north boundary of portion 6 aforesaid, bearing east 19 chains; and on the east by a road 1 chain wide, bearing north 65 chains 28 links; thence crossing the road from Cathcart to Ararat Diggings by the Meegenac Gully and a road 1 chain wide, 72 chains 54 links to commencing point. AT FORD'S CREEK, NEAR MANSFIELD, County unnamed, parishes of Loyala, Maindample, and Mansfield.—Extent, about 4000 acres: Being allotments 3, 4, 5, a reserve to the south-east of allotments 5, 6, 7, and 8, allotments 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 57, 58, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 90, and 91, in the parish of Loyala. Allotments 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 15 A, and 15 B, in the parish of Maindample. Allotments 25, 26, 59, 62, 64, 66, 67, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, and 77, in the parish of Mansfield.

AT GLENBURNIE, County of Dalhousie, Parish of Glenburnie.—Extent, about 488 acres: Being allotments 15 and 16, parish of Glenburnie.

AT MELTON, DJERRIWARREH, MOORADORANOOK, PYWHEIT-JORRE, DERRIMUT, MARIBYRNONG, KOROROIT, AND YANGARDOOK, County of Bourke, Parishes of Kororoit and unnamed.—Extent, about 15,000 acres: Being all the unappropriated Crown lands within the parish of Kororoit, excepting section 15; also, commencing at the north angle of allotment 48, parish of Yangardook; bounded on the north by a line bearing west about 4 miles; on the west by a line bearing south about 3 miles to the Coimadai Creek, and by this creek southerly to the north-west angle of section 22, parish of Mer-rimu; on the south by section 22 aforesaid, bearing east to the north-west angle of section 13, parish of Djerrriwarreh; on the east by the Djerrriwarreh Creek, bearing north about 1 mile 30 chains to the south-west angle of section 60, parish of Yangardook; on the south by sections 59, 58, 57, and 56, bearing north-easterly; and on the east by sections 53, 52, 51, 50, 49, and 48, parish of Yangardook, bearing northerly to commencing point.

AT MORANDING, County of Dalhousie, Parishes of Moranding and Glenarona.—Extent, 10,000 acres: Being all the unappropriated surveyed land within the parishes of Moranding and Glenarona.

Exclusive of all appropriated land within the before-mentioned boundaries.

AT WILLOWMAVIN AND MORANDING, County of Dalhousie, Parishes of Goldie and Moranding.—Extent, about 10,000 acres: Commencing at a point bearing S. 48° 30' W., about 8 chains from the west angle of section 63, parish of Moranding; bounded on the north-west by a line bearing S. 48° 30' W. about 5 miles 20 chains to the Dividing Range; on the south-west by the Dividing Range, bearing south-easterly about 2 miles 60 chains; on the south by Number 3 Creek and Forbes Farmers' Common, bearing east about 2 miles to the south-west angle of Anderson's pre-emptive section; on the east by Gin's pre-emptive section, bearing north about 40 chains; on the south by the same, bearing east about 40 chains; on the east by part of Clarke's pre-emptive section, bearing north about 20 chains; on the north by the south boundaries of section 69, parish of Moranding, and section 2, parish of Goldie; on the east by sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, bearing north to a creek forming the north boundary of section 9 aforesaid; on the south by this creek bearing easterly to the south angle of section 55, parish of Moranding; on the north-east by sections 55 and 53, bearing north-westerly; on the south-east by section 53 aforesaid, bearing N. 48° 30' E. about 1 mile; and on the north-east by the

road from Kilmore to Pyalong, bearing N. 41° 30' W. about 2 miles to commencing point.

GOLD FIELDS COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any Gold Field shall be a Common for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, and carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field, and every such holder or other resident shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture his horses and cattle on such Common, subject to rules and regulations hereafter to be made, and such Common shall be called a "Gold Fields Common;" and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the mining board of the mining district within which such Gold Fields Common shall be included, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every holder of a miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, or other resident on a gold field, shall be entitled to depasture on any Gold Fields Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown Lands in the vicinity of the gold field hereinafter mentioned, comprised within the area the description whereof is subjoined to the name of such gold field, shall (save and except the lands hereinafter declared to be a gold field) be a Gold Fields Common within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field: And I do further proclaim, with the advice aforesaid, that the portions of Crown Lands within such area, upon which mining or digging for gold is or shall be actually carried on now or at any time hereafter, shall be Gold Fields within the meaning of 24 Victoria No. 117, and in the vicinity of which Gold Fields Commons may be proclaimed:—

GOLD FIELDS COMMON FOR ITALIAN GULLY, County of Grenville, about 3½ miles south of Smythesdale.—Commencing at the north-east angle of J. Brown's pre-emptive right on the east side of the Woody Yallock; thence east 125 chains; thence south to the Illibarook Creek; thence by that Creek westerly to a point due south of the commencing point; thence north to the south-east angle of Brown's pre-emptive right aforesaid; thence by the east boundary of said pre-emptive right north to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the areas hereinafter defined shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

The municipal district of PRAHRAN.

The town of PANMURE, county of Hampden, situate about four miles easterly of the junction of Mount Emu Creek and the Hopkins River; on the Mount Emu Creek.—Commencing at a point on the north bank of the Mount Emu Creek, bearing

due south 2 chains, more or less, from the south-east angle of block 4, township of Panmure; thence north 56 chains 50 links; thence west 80 chains; thence south 66 chains to the Mount Emu Creek; thence by that creek easterly and northerly to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the premises hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Ballarat: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Ballarat the following premises, situated and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

A house containing five rooms, situated in Exeter street, Ballarat (west), near the Wendouree Swamp, occupied as quarters by the police, from January, 1860.

CHEWTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Chewton General Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 8th section of the Act, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the rest of the year, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year. No funerals will be permitted to take place after Eight p.m. from September to April, nor after Six p.m. during the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees. No wooden fences will be allowed exceeding four feet six inches in height.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

Town Common.—The following have been proclaimed:—Ten acres at junction of six roads, Camberwell; sixteen acres water reserve near Gardiner's Creek; thirty-five acres bounded by Gardiner's Creek; and one acre at Glass's Creek Pound. Total sixty-two acres.

Erection of Court House and municipal buildings.—The grant-in-aid, £750, to be given (contingent upon Estimates passing) to the council for erecting a building to be sanctioned by the Public Works Department.

Water supply.—The Government do not at present propose to convey the Yan Yean water to Hawthorn.

Postal arrangements.—The necessity for a reduction of the fourpenny letter postage and for despatching mails twice a day has been represented to the Postmaster General.

Horticultural Society Garden.—Granted in the Survey Pad-dock upon the joint application of the society and the neighboring municipalities.

Lighting.—The council have agreed to erect twenty-six gas lamps for lighting the main roads, and have asked the gas company to extend their mains to the district.

Public Library.—The trustees of the Melbourne Library continue to lend books; some donations have been received, and the attendance of the town clerk is given on stated evenings to afford the opportunity of reading.

Health of the district.—The officer of the Central Board of Health visits the district occasionally. From the healthy state of the municipality, the appointment of an inspector of nuisances, &c., has not been deemed necessary.

The Hawthorn and Kew Company Volunteers have obtained a grant of money from the council for the erection of rifle butts.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

The foundation stone of the new town hall was laid on the 16th day of August, and during the past half year the municipal council have expended in the erection of town hall offices and police court the sum of £3159 13s. 10d., irrespective of the £2000 paid by the Government in aid of the court house. The portion of the building completed is of the most substantial character, and realises all the expectations the design furnished by the architect conveyed, and is considered one of the most elegant granite structures in the colony.

FIRE BRIGADE.

The municipal council have expended the sum of £541 19s. 3d. in connection with the building of engine-house, apparatus, and grant-in-aid of working expenses, making a total for the year 1860 of £1610 8s. 3d. The expenses of the brigade will in future be limited to an annual grant for working expenses.

MECHANICS' INSTITUTE.

The municipal council have paid over to the treasurer the sum of £250, voted in aid of building the institute.

WATER SUPPLY.

The municipal council of Ballaarat, in conjunction with the municipal council of Ballaarat East, have had additional drains cut on the north of Yuille's Swamp. They have also entered into an agreement with the owners of private property in the vicinity to purchase the land necessary, so that the waters of a large area of gathering ground, including the Little Swamp, may be brought into Yuille's or Wendouree Swamp.

The municipal council have still in view a more comprehensive scheme for supplying this district with water. The chairman of the council at the close of the sitting of the municipal conference in Melbourne, brought forward the subject of water supply to the gold fields of the colony. A meeting was held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, presided over by the mayor of the city. The representative members from the various gold fields, and the delegates from the municipal councils attended; the principle affirming that the future prosperity of the gold fields would materially depend upon an abundant water supply, was unanimously adopted. A central committee was appointed in Melbourne to collect the reports of the most advantageous scheme for each gold field. The municipal councils of Ballaarat assisted by the local bodies, engaged an engineer to collect the necessary statistics, and a very elaborate report was drawn up and supplied to the central committee and the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly.

In consequence of the importance of the subject, Thomas Loader, Esq., M.L.A., placed a notice of motion on the papers of the Assembly for a vote of £500,000 for water supply to the gold fields; and it is a matter of regret, as a member of the central committee, he did not press the motion before the Assembly.

MUNICIPAL CONFERENCE.

The chairman and Councillor Hassell were appointed to represent this council at the late conference. W. C. Smith, Esq., was elected chairman at the conference. The clauses of the Act

were taken into consideration *seriatim*, and a copy of the report was laid before the Honorable the Chief Secretary, who promised to introduce an amended Act upon the principles laid down by the conference.

A deputation, also from the conference, had an interview with the Honorable the Chief Secretary, relative to the permanent endowment of municipalities by grants of land, &c. Should the Government adopt the course recommended, it will eventually supersede the annual Government grant, and relieve the ratepayers from any heavy rates for the necessary improvements in the district.

FINANCE.

The municipal council received from the Government the second instalment, £1291 4s. 3d., grant in aid of this district for 1860. The assessment for the year 1860 numbers as follows:—
