MINING LEASES.

IT having come to the knowledge of the Commissioner of Mines that many of the holders of lands leased for mining purposes have not fulfilled the covenants of their leases as to expenditure of capital and the erection of machinery, it is hereby notified that in every case where the covenants remain unfulfilled one month after the publication of this notice the warden will be instructed to enforce those clauses of the lease relating to forfeiture; and on the complaint of any holder of a miner's right that lands leased for mining purposes are lying unworked and unprofitable, the warden of the district shall hold an enquiry, and if the complaint be proven, and the lessee fails to show cause for the non-fulfillment of the covenants, the lease will be declared forfeited.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 15th day of December, 1860, intimated to the Governor that the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the 24th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates whereof are hereto subjoined, have been laid before the Queen, and are left to their operation, viz.:

No. 98.—An Act to appropriate the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty and for other purposes. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

No. 99.—An Act for the Administration of the Estates of Deceased Persons in certain cases. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

No. 100.—An Act further to amend and to consolidate the Law of Evidence. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

No. 101.—An Act for supplying the District of the Ovens with water. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

No. 102.—An Act to incorporate a Company to be called "The Bendigo Gas Company" and for other purposes. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

No. 103.—An Act to incorporate a Company to be called "The Collingwood Fitz Roy and District Gas and Coke Company" and for other purposes. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

No. 104.—An Act for the Remission of Penalties and the Discharge of Persons from Imprisonment in certain cases. [Passed 22nd August, 1860.]

THE TOWN OF ST. KILDA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the area hereinafter defined, being a portion of the municipal district of St. Kilda, shall be considered a TOWN within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay, being the south-east angle of the municipal district of Emerald Hill; thence by a line bearing N. 26° 15' E. 16 chains 90 links to a marked post; thence south-easterly by Park street to Marine parade; thence by Marine parade south-easterly to Fitz Roy street; thence north-easterly along Fitz Roy street to the south-west angle of the St. Kilda Railway Station reserve; thence by the south-west side of the station reserve to its western angle; thence by the north-west side of the station reserve to its intersection with the railway fence; thence by that fence north-westerly to its intersection with the boundary of Emerald Hill municipality; thence by a line bearing N. 57° E. to a marked post on the west side of the Main Brighton road; thence easterly by a line crossing the Main Brighton road and passing through the centre of High street, parish of

Prahran, to the Punt road; thence through centre of Punt road to Wellington street; thence east through the centre of Wellington street and the centre of the Main Dandenong road to the centre of a Government road forming the eastern boundary of portion 176 B, parish of Prahran; thence south through the centre of said Government road to the Glen Huntly road; thence west through the centre of Glen Huntly road to Mitford street; thence north-westerly through the centre of Mitford street to Barkly street; thence north through the centre of Barkly street to Acland street; thence north-westerly through the centre of Acland street to the main municipal open drain; thence along the course of said drain to the shores of Hobson's Bay; thence north-westerly by the shores of Hobson's Bay to the point of commencement.

THE ST. KILDA TOWN COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any town shall be a Common for the use of the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town and its vicinity shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture their cattle and horses on such Common, and such Common shall be called a "Town Common;" and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, or, in case such Town Common shall be included within or adjoin the limits of any municipal district, then for the municipal council of such district, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every such inhabitant shall be entitled to depasture on any Town Common: Now therefore J. Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands comprised within the area hereinafter described shall be a TOWN COMMON within the meaning of the said Act, subject to such rules and regulations as shall be hereafter prescribed, for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of St. Kilda and its vicinity, that is to say:—

DESCRIPTION OF THE ST. KILDA TOWN COMMON, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following boundaries, viz:—

No. 1. Commencing at the intersection of the south-west side of Mitford street with the north side of Glen Huntly road; thence in a north-westerly direction by the south-west side of Mitford street and a line being a prolongation of that side of Mitford street to its intersection with the west side of Barkly street; thence by that side of Barkly street north to its intersection with the south-west side of Acland street; thence north-westerly by that side of Acland street to its intersection with the municipal drain; thence by that drain to its entrance to Hobson's Bay; thence by the shore of Hobson's Bay southerly to its intersection with the west side of Barkly street; thence north by that side of Barkly street to a point due west of the prolongation of the north side of Glen Huntly road; thence by a line east, and the north side of Glen Huntly road east, to its intersection with the south-west side of Mitford street, the commencing point.

No. 2. Commencing at the intersection of the south-west side of the St. Kilda Railway Station reserve with the north-west side of Fitz Roy street; thence by the south-west side of the Station reserve to its intersection with the Railway fence; thence by that fence north-westerly to its intersection with the boundary of the municipality of St. Kilda; thence by that boundary south-westerly to its intersection with the north-east side of Park street at the Marine parade; thence by the north-eastern side of the Marine parade survey, easterly and southerly, to its intersection with a line forming the north-east boundary of Marine parade; thence by that side of Marine parade to its intersection with the north-west side of Fitz Roy street; thence by that side of Fitz Roy street north-easterly to its intersection with the Station reserve, being the point of commencement.

QUEENSLIFF VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY CORPS.

THE following Rules and Regulations, adopted by the members of the Queenscliff Volunteer Artillery Corps, having been approved by the Governor, are now published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE QUEENSLIFF VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY AND RIFLE COMPANY.

CONSTRUCTION OF THE COMPANY.

1. The company shall be open to all British subjects and naturalised persons.
2. The name, residence, and occupation of every member joining the company shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.
3. Any member of the company intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of such intention in writing to the commanding officer, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the orderly room, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence.
4. Any member being absent from his district of enrolment more than three months without obtaining leave in writing from the commanding officer, shall be considered to have retired from the company.

DRILLS AND PARADES.

5. Instruction drill for recruits and others shall be held twice a week, at least, morning and evening, at such hours as the commanding officer shall appoint.
6. Any member not attending at least one of these instruction drills in the month, shall be liable to a penalty of Two shillings.
7. No member shall be supplied with uniform until he shall have attended at least sixteen instruction drills from the time of his joining the company.
8. A commanding officer's parade shall be held on the first Wednesday of each month at such hour as the commanding officer may appoint, at which every member shall attend under a penalty of—commissioned officers Four shillings, non-commissioned officers Two shillings, other members One shilling.
9. At every parade, on the roll being called, any member not answering to his name, and not having previously obtained leave to fall out of the ranks, shall be deemed absent.
10. Any member not attending parade or instruction drill, and having a sufficient excuse, shall signify the same in writing to the drill instructor before or within twenty-four hours after the parade, the sufficiency of such excuse to be for the consideration of the board of management.
11. Members in uniform shall salute officers in uniform in accordance with the practice of the regular army.
12. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularity on parade, will be liable to a fine of Sixpence.

ARMS, CLOTHING, ETC.

13. Any member who, having been supplied with clothing, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose clothing shall be dirty or unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine of One shilling for each offence.
14. Any member whose arms or accoutrements shall be found dirty or unserviceable shall be required to deliver up the same, on demand, to the inspecting officer, and be submitted by him for the inspection of the board of management, who shall decide upon the amount of damage done, and impose a penalty not exceeding Five pence.
15. Any member wearing a portion of his uniform shall be liable to a fine of One shilling for each offence.

PROMOTIONS.

16. All promotions shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Legislature. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he shall have passed a satisfactory examination, which shall be public to all the company. Distinguishing badges shall be given to members who have passed in companies, and small arm drill, and promotion examination.

ORDERS, ETC.

17. That every general, brigade, garrison, and other order having reference to this company shall be posted up in the orderly room twenty-four hours after such order shall be received, and copied into a book, such book to be kept in the orderly room for that purpose.

ARRESTS AND COURTS MARTIAL.

18. All members of the company are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances:—
 - 1st. By order of the officer commanding the company pending the investigation of any charge.
 - 2nd. By the senior officer present for any misconduct under arms, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without any remark or altercation, proceed immediately to the orderly room and deliver up his arms.
 19. No member placed in arrest may wear his uniform, or any part of it, until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty of Five shillings.
 20. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.
 21. A court martial has power to censure, fine, or expel.
 22. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.
 23. Every court martial shall consist of seven members of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, including the president,

of whom one at least shall be an officer or non-commissioned officer; the president to be appointed by the commanding officer, the other members to be taken in rotation from the roster.

24. A list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who shall be privileged to challenge any member of such court to the number of four without assigning any reason for so doing, and further that members so challenged shall immediately and without remark vacate their seats.

25. The forms to be observed on courts martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's service.

26. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

CIVIL STAFF.

27. The civil staff of the company shall consist of the commanding officer for the time being who shall be *ex officio* president, a treasurer, and a board of management consisting of six members who shall appoint one of their number as secretary.

28. The board shall audit the accounts of the company, and manage and dispose of the company fund, and generally take into consideration all matters affecting the well being of the company. Three members of such board shall form a quorum.

MEETINGS.

29. A general meeting shall be held yearly in January, of which due notice shall be given.

30. The treasurer and board of management shall be elected annually at this meeting by ballot.

31. Any vacancy occurring in the board of management during the year shall be filled up by the remaining members of the board.

32. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special general meeting.

33. On the requisition of not less than five members of the board of management, or not less than twelve members of the company, the commanding officer shall call a special general meeting, at which no other business shall be entertained.

34. At every general meeting the commanding officer, if present, shall be chairman; if absent, the senior officer present.

35. No person shall be permitted to speak to any motion more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover of the resolution or amendment, who shall be entitled to a reply. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman in writing, and shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division be demanded by six or more members. No protest shall be received, and no meeting dissolved or adjourned without a motion for that purpose.

36. Bye-laws not inconsistent with these regulations may be made by the board of management, and if approved of by the president shall be by him submitted to a general meeting, whether special or otherwise, and if then confirmed shall be thenceforth binding on the company.

37. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any rule or regulation of the company, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice of the same in writing to the president, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescision, or addition, shall then be submitted to a general or special general meeting, but it shall not be recommended to His Excellency unless carried by a majority of two-thirds of the meeting.

FINES.

38. All fines shall form part of the general fund of the company.

39. A book shall be kept called "The Fine Book," in which all fines shall be entered, and signed by the commanding officer. A separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the receiving officer. This book shall be kept in the orderly room, and shall be accessible to every member of the company.

40. The fines shall be collected by the non-commissioned officers, and shall be accounted for monthly to the treasurer.

41. A list of all fines fourteen days and upwards overdue shall be made out by the drill instructor on the Tuesdays preceding the general parades, and shall be exhibited in some conspicuous part of the orderly room, with a notice appended calling attention to this rule. Any overdue fine remaining unpaid for fourteen days after the affixing of such notice as aforesaid, may be recovered according to law, or the commanding officer may, in his discretion, expel the defaulter from the company, and publish such expulsion in the *Government Gazette*, and such other newspaper as he may think fit.

SUBSCRIPTIONS TO THE COMPANIES FUND.

42. Commissioned officers per month, Four shillings; non-commissioned officers, Two shillings per month; other members, One shilling per month.

43. No member whose subscription shall be in arrear shall be permitted to speak or vote at any meeting of the company unless such arrear has been paid.

44. Every member on joining the company to be supplied with a printed copy of these rules.

MUNICIPALITY OF HAWTHORN.
 BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS.
 WHEREAS for the better protection of the public footpaths and watercourses of this municipality, it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations:
 Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the council of the municipal district of Hawthorn, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, pursuant to 15 Victoria No. 15, section 33, any person who shall ride or drive any horse or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any carriage, cart, barrow, or other vehicle upon or across any of the public footpaths or watercourses of the municipal district of Hawthorn, or who shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths or watercourses or any of them, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds:
 Provided that every owner or occupier, or the several owners or occupiers, of any gateway, yard, or lane, to which access by horses, beasts, carriages or other vehicles can be obtained only

by riding, driving, or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses, who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, as may be necessary for approach and access to any such private gateway, yard, or lane, at the expense of such owner or occupier, or respective owners and occupiers, and under the superintendence of such officer as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.

The owner or occupier of any building, premises, or land, who shall cause or suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any such building, premises, or land, into or over any public footpath or highway within the said district, and shall continue to allow such water to be discharged or to overflow after receiving seven days' notice from the duly authorised officer of the council, shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:

Provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building, premises, or land, into the public water tables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, or respective owners or occupiers, and under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinbefore imposed.
