MINING LEASES.

IT having come to the knowledge of the Commissioner of Mines that many of the holders of lands leased for mining purposes have not fulfilled the covenants of their leases as to expenditure of capital and the erection of machinery, it is hereby notified that in every case where the covenants remain unfulfilled one month after the publication of this notice the warden will be instructed to enforce those clauses of the lease relating to forfeiture; and on the complaint of any holder of a miner's right that lands leased for mining purposes are lying unworked and unprofitable, the warden of the district shall hold an enquiry, and if the complaint be proven, and the lessee fails to show cause for the non-fulfilment of the covenants, the lease will be declared forfeited.

NOTICE TO VESSELS BOUND TO SPANISH COLONIES.

The undersigned begs to inform the mercantile community and masters of vessels, that by a decree of Her Spanish Majesty, dated Madrid, 21st March, 1860, it is now obligatory for all vessels (Foreign or Spanish) proceeding in ballast or with cargo to any of the Spanish dominions, including Guam, Manilla, or Ilo Ilo, to be provided, besides with the customary bill of health, with a clearance attested by the Spanish Consul or Vice-Consul residing at the port of departure.

Neglect of this subjects the vessel on arrival at her destination to quarantine, and the master to a fine of 200 dollars (about £40 sterling).

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Camperdown, in the county of Hampden, at the public expense, as and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the Police Lock-up, situated at Camperdown aforesaid, as and to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act.

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SMYTHESDALE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred, and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented by the householders at Smythesdale, in the county of Grenville, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SMYTHESDALE.—The township of Smythesdale, on Smythe's Creek, in the county of Grenville: Commencing at the point of intersection of the north boundary with the west side of the main road, one chain fifty links wide, leading to Ballaarat, the said point bearing north 72 degrees 11 minutes east three chains ninety-four links from the north-west corner of allotment 3 of section B; thence bounded on part of the north by a line bearing east eighteen chains sixty links; thence on the east by a line bearing south one hundred and twenty chains; thence on the south by a line bearing west, crossing Smythe's Creek, one hundred and twenty chains; thence on the west by a line bearing north one hundred and twenty chains; thence on the remainder of the north by a line bearing east, crossing the said creek, one hundred and one chains forty links to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Smythesdale."

THE CARNGHAM ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also, to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Ripon and Grenville hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the township reserve of Carngham; thence by a direct line

south-westerly to a point three miles or thereabouts east of a point in the centre of Emu Creek, opposite the north-east corner of the county of Hampden; thence by a line due west to the point in the centre of the Emu Creek before mentioned; thence westerly by the centre of the Emu Creek to a point where the Emu Creek cuts the northern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence westerly by the said boundary to a point where the electric telegraph line cuts the said county boundary; thence northerly and easterly by the electric telegraph line to a point opposite the north-west bend of Lake Burrumbeet; thence by a direct line south to the shore of Lake Burrumbeet; thence by the western and southern shore of the said lake to the junction of the Burrumbeet Creek; thence in a direct line southerly to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Carngham Road District."

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR REGULATING THE KILLING AND SALE OF BUTCHERS' MEAT, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SLAUGHTER-HOUSES UNDER CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for any municipal district, established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the establishment of slaughter-houses, &c., &c., &c.:

Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Daylesford, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, that before any premises within this municipal district shall be licensed as a place where butchers' meat may be lawfully slaughtered and sold, the owner or occupier shall produce to the council a certificate, under the hand of the town inspector or other duly appointed officer, declaring the premises to be situated as not injuriously to affect the health of the neighborhood, and that such premises have been suitably prepared, and properly paved or flagged with brick, stone, or timber, so as to satisfy the council that such premises can be kept inoffensive.

That every premises licensed as a place where butchers' meat may be slaughtered or sold, shall be provided with tubs, bins, or other vessels in which shall be deposited all blood, offal, or other offensive matter, and properly washed and cleansed once in every twenty-four hours.

That no animal weighing more than two hundred pounds shall be slaughtered on any premises where butchers' meat is sold in less quantities than sides or quarters of an animal.

That for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this bye-law, such premises shall be duly registered with the town clerk, who shall, under his hand, on receiving the authority of the council, grant a license to slaughter under the provisions of this bye-law; and any person who shall slaughter butchers' meat without being duly licensed under the provisions of this bye-law (except the *bona fide* servants of a duly licensed person), or who shall sell any tainted or unwholesome butchers' meat for human food, or whose premises shall not be kept and maintained inoffensive as above required, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

And be it further ordered and enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other person to slaughter any butchers' meat on premises situate distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered and licensed as though they belonged to different owners or persons.

And be it also ordered and enacted, that written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given the town clerk at least eight days before the same be granted, and shall be exhibited for such period in his office, at the municipal chambers, and that the said licenses shall issue and be in force for twelve months from the date of granting the same.

MUNICIPALITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR THE REGULATION AND GOVERNMENT OF LICENSED BUTCHERS AND SLAUGHTERMEN.

WHEREAS by Act 18 Victoria No. 14 it is amongst other matters for the management of towns and other populous places in the colony of Victoria provided, that no butcher or other person within the jurisdiction of any local authority shall kill or slaughter any cattle or animal without the license and consent of such local authority: And whereas by Act 18 Victoria No. 13 provision is made for the promotion of the public health in such populous places in the said colony, the same being governed by such local authority as aforesaid: And it being considered expedient for the interests of the inhabitants of the Footscray municipality that a bye-law, under the aforesaid recited Acts, for the regulation and government of licensed butchers and slaughtermen, should be made:

Be it therefore enacted, that on any party making application to the municipal council of Footscray, in the form contained in the first schedule hereunder written, for license to kill and slaughter cattle and animals within the boundary of such municipality, it shall be lawful for the said council, on receiving such application, together with a certificate from their inspector or other authorised agent in the form contained in the second schedule hereunder written, to license from year to year such party to kill and slaughter within their municipality all cattle and animals as may by law be slaughtered therein; and it shall be lawful for the said council, after giving notice in the form contained in the third schedule hereunder written, and on receiving the certificate of their inspector or other authorised agent, stating that the premises of any party licensed as aforesaid are not properly paved and flagged for the carrying on of such business as aforesaid, or that the carrying on of same is offensive to the inhabitants by smell or otherwise, at any time to cancel and annul such license.

Any party carrying on the trade of butcher or slaughterman as aforesaid within the municipality after the passing of this bye-law, without obtaining the license as aforesaid, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Footscray Municipality.

To the Chairman and Councillors of the Footscray Municipality, Gentlemen,

In conformity with the provisions of the Act 18 Victoria No. 14, I hereby apply for a license authorising me to kill and slaughter within the Footscray municipality cattle and animals as may by law be slaughtered therein; and I undertake to act up to the terms and conditions of said Act and also of bye-law No. 10 of your council.

We, the undersigned householders within your municipality, believe the above applicant to be a fit and proper person to hold a license for the above purposes.

MUNICIPALITY OF HOTHAM.

BYE-LAW No. 8 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF HOTHAM.—FOR THE REGULATION OF THE PUBLIC ABATTOIRS OF HOTHAM, AND FOR FIXING THE RATES OF DUES FOR SLAUGHTERING TO BE CHARGED THEREIN.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the killing and sale of butchers' meat, and the establishment of slaughter-houses; and whereas it is expedient and necessary that public abattoirs should be established within the municipal district of Hotham, and also that regulations should be made for the use of the said abattoirs, and that the rates for slaughtering, fees, and dues to be taken for the use of such abattoirs and appurtenances by parties slaughtering, or causing to be slaughtered, live stock therein, should be fixed: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the following rules and regulations shall be observed by and shall be binding upon all persons using the public abattoirs of the municipality of Hotham, or resorting thereto, and that the charges hereinafter mentioned shall be the dues to be paid for slaughtering at the said abattoirs, viz.:

1. *Time when slaughtering shall be permitted.*—The abattoirs shall be open and slaughtering shall be permitted at all hours of the day and night, except on Sunday for its entire duration, and on Christmas Day and Good Friday from the hour of Five o'clock a.m. to the hour of Ten o'clock p.m., when the whole establishment shall be closed, and no slaughtering or other work shall be carried on therein.

2. *Time allowed for slaughtering certain animals.*—Every person who shall pay to the superintendent of the abattoirs the dues for slaughtering, according to the rates hereinafter fixed, shall be entitled to the use of that portion of the abattoirs which shall be appointed to him by the superintendent of the abattoirs, and of the appurtenances of the same, for the purpose of slaughtering any of the animals which may lawfully be slaughtered therein, for a reasonable time, not exceeding the time hereinafter mentioned, viz. :—For the killing and dressing of an ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer, forty-five minutes; of a calf or pig, thirty minutes; and of a sheep, lamb, or goat, twenty minutes.

3. *Persons using the abattoirs required to cleanse the same.*—Every person who shall so use the abattoirs or any portion thereof, or of the appurtenances of the same, shall immediately thereafter remove all offal, filth, and refuse of every description whatsoever which shall remain or result from such use of the abattoirs by him, from the abattoir premises to the pits or places appointed for the reception of such offal, filth, or refuse, and shall cleanse thoroughly, to the satisfaction of the superintendent of the abattoirs, all the portion of the abattoir buildings and appurtenances which he shall so use.

4. *Damages to be made good.*—Every person using the abattoirs or the appurtenances thereof, or any part of the same, and who shall break, injure, destroy, or damage the same or any part thereof, shall make good the destruction, damage, or injury done by him.

5. *Persons bringing live stock to the abattoirs responsible for the safety thereof.*—Every person who shall drive, bring, convey, or conduct any live stock to the abattoirs for the purpose of slaughter, shall inform the superintendent of the abattoirs of the description and number of such live stock, and the superintendent shall enter the information so tendered to him in a book to be kept by him for that purpose; the succession of entries in such book shall, in case of any question arising, decide the order of priority in which the several persons shall be entitled to the use of the yards, pens, killing houses, or appurtenances of the abattoirs; and if no place shall have been previously appointed for the reception of the live stock of the person so bringing the same, such person shall place such live stock in such portion of the yards, pens, or premises of the abattoirs as the said superintendent shall direct, and the person so bringing such live stock shall himself be responsible for the safety thereof.

6. *Rates of dues for slaughtering at the abattoirs.*—The slaughtering dues which shall be demanded, received, and taken at the abattoirs by the superintendent of the abattoirs, or other officer or person for that purpose appointed by the municipal council of Hotham, shall be as follows, namely:—

7. *Persons entitled to use certain portions of the abattoirs shall cleanse the same when required.*—If any person shall desire to kill live stock in one particular portion of the abattoirs under such conditions as to time and otherwise as the said council shall think necessary and prescribe, and shall have a portion of the abattoirs pointed out to him for that purpose, such person shall at all times, while he shall use such portion of the said abattoirs, keep the same, with the appurtenances thereof, clean and free from offence, whether by accumulation of blood, filth, or otherwise; and shall further, whenever so required by the superintendent of the abattoirs, cleanse, scrape, limewash, or otherwise purify, in such manner as shall be necessary, and as

the said superintendent shall direct, the walls, doors, floors, or other parts of the portion of the said abattoirs and appurtenances which he shall be so accustomed and entitled to use; and he shall in all respects comply with the regulations of the municipal council of Hotham for the government of the abattoirs in force for the time being.

8. *Cattle to be supplied with sufficient food and water.*—Every person who shall bring cattle for slaughter to the said abattoirs, and shall permit the same to remain in the yards or pens of the said abattoirs for a longer period than one day, shall provide such live stock with sufficient food and water.

9. *Penalty for offences against any of the provisions of this bye-law.*—For every offence against any of the provisions hereof the offender shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more of the justices of the peace for the said district of Hotham, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR REGULATING THE KILLING OF BUTCHERS' MEAT.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws, amongst other things, for regulating the killing of butchers' meat: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Kyneton, as follows, that is to say:—

1. It shall not be lawful for any butcher to kill large cattle within the said municipal district of Kyneton.

2. It shall not be lawful for any butcher to kill small animals within the said municipal district, except in slaughter-houses, paved, to the satisfaction of the said council, either with closely jointed flags or with bricks set compactly on edge, the outer course of which shall be raised at least two inches above the others, and the floor to be on an incline towards one corner thereof, where a tub or other properly bricked receptacle shall be provided to catch the blood and other matter; and such slaughter-houses shall be open at all times to the inspection of the inspector of nuisances for the said municipal district.

3. It shall not be lawful for any butcher to kill small animals within the said municipal district without being duly licensed by the said council so to do, such license to expire annually on the thirty-first day of December.

4. Butchers shall keep their slaughter-houses clean by washing them out daily if used, and shall remove therefrom and out of the said municipal district all skins, offal, refuse, blood, and filth of every description daily after Six o'clock in the afternoon, and before Seven o'clock in the forenoon, and shall render the same, together with the court, yards, and premises near or adjoining thereto inoffensive to smell or otherwise.

5. It shall not be lawful for butchers or any other person to permit or suffer the offal, refuse, or blood arising from killing small animals, to be consumed by pigs within the said municipal district.

6. Any person or persons convicted of an offence against any of the provisions of this bye-law before two of Her Majesty's justices of the peace in a summary way shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

7. In construing this bye-law, the words "large cattle" shall be held to mean and include bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, steers, and calves over six months old; the words "small animals" shall mean and include calves under six months old, rams, ewes, sheep, lambs, pigs, and goats; the words "kill" and "killing" shall be held to mean and include slaughtering, disembowelling, and dressing; and any word importing the singular number shall be held to include the plural, and *vice versa*.

8. This bye-law shall come into force and take effect from and immediately after the expiration of one calendar month from the same receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor.

Scarlatina is still prevalent at Boroondara, but no fatal cases are reported. Fifteen out of the twenty-two deaths registered at Collingwood were of children under three years. Scarlatina has again made its appearance in the family of the Deputy Registrar of Prahran, in the person of a child six years old, who died after fifty-six hours' illness. Occasional fatal cases of Scarlatina occur on Emerald Hill. With these exceptions, the bill of health is good, and the rate of mortality favorable.
