NOTICE TO MAGISTRATES.

FREQUENT complaints having been made that some justices of the peace do not sufficiently attend to the duties of their office, and that an undue amount of labor consequently devolves upon others, it is hereby notified that the Government expects every justice of the peace to perform a share of the magisterial business of the district in which he resides.

Magistrates are requested to notify to the clerk of petty sessions of their districts their correct addresses, in order that they may be duly summoned when their attendance is needed. The several clerks of petty sessions will be instructed to make returns of the attendance of each magistrate, in order that the Government may have information as to the names of those magistrates who neglect to discharge the duties with which they are entrusted.

The attention of the Government having also been called to cases in which magistrates have interfered in matters connected with licensing and other business of a purely local character in districts with which they are unconnected, it is further notified that the Government regards this practice with the strongest disapprobation, and that in future, if any magistrate be guilty of such interference, his name shall be removed from the commission of the peace.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 20th day of February, 1861, intimated to the Governor that the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 24th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates whereof are hereto subjoined, have been laid before the Queen, and are left to their operation, viz:—

No. 105.—An Act for enabling the Municipal Council of Beechworth to construct Water-works and supply their district with water, and for other purposes. [Passed 18th September, 1860.]

No. 106.—An Act to alter the boundaries of the Electoral district of Belfast. [Passed 18th September, 1860.]

MUNICIPALITY OF CLUNES.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR GUARDING AGAINST ACCIDENTS FROM THE CARELESS AND IMPROPER USE OF FIRES IN OPEN OR PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF CLUNES.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty the Queen, No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires and for the general good rule, &c.:

Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Clunes, that any person or persons who shall incautiously, carelessly, or improperly use, or cause, or permit, or suffer to be used, or make or place any fire or combustible substance whatsoever in or upon any road, street, footway, lane, court, alley, or thoroughfare, or any open or public place in or near any dwelling house, place of business, or building, or within or upon any yard, whether fenced or enclosed or not, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this bye-law; and the provisions of this bye-law shall henceforth extend and take effect within the boundaries of the town of Clunes, as are particularly set forth in the *Government Gazette*, No. 13, 6th February, 1861; and upon any infringement of this bye-law, any person so infringing the same shall be liable, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 29.—A BYE-LAW TO ALTER AND AMEND A BYE-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPELLING RESIDENTS TO KEEP THEIR PREMISES FREE FROM OFFENSIVE AND UNWHOLE-SOME MATTERS, THE RESTRAINING OF NOISOME AND OFFENSIVE TRADES AND THE PRESERVATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, AND TO ALTER AND AMEND A BYE-LAW FOR THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and houses of ill-fame, compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive matters, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas in pursuance of the power therein conferred the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst did, on the third day of June, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, pass a

bye-law, numbered five, intituled, "A bye-law to provide for the compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive and unwholesome matters, and the preservation of public health." And whereas the council of the said municipal district of Sandhurst did, on the thirty-first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, pass a bye-law, numbered twenty, intituled, "A bye-law for the suppression of nuisances." And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the provisions in the said bye-laws contained: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst:—

1. That from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinbefore recited bye-laws, numbered respectively five and twenty, shall be and the same are hereby repealed: Provided always, that all offences against the provisions of either of the said recited bye-laws committed before the date of this bye-law coming into operation, may be punished as if this bye-law had not been passed.

2. That the occupiers, or in any case where there are no occupiers, the owners, of buildings and lands within the municipal district of Sandhurst aforesaid, shall not allow any decomposed animal or vegetable or offensive matter or fifth to accumulate on his or her premises.

3. That no such owner or occupier as aforesaid shall pump or bale out any bilge or stagnant water from the well or cellar of his or her premises between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Ten o'clock at night.

4. That no such owner or occupier as aforesaid shall permit or suffer any noisome or offensive matter or refuse to run or escape into the formed channels of any streets, lanes, or other thorough-fares within the said municipal district.

5. That no person or persons carrying on the business of a soap boiler, tallow melter, candle maker, or boiler of refuse, or any noisome or offensive trade, manufacture or business whatsoever, shall allow, permit, or suffer any stench deemed offensive to the public by the municipal council or their duly appointed officer to arise therefrom.

6. For every offence against any provision of this bye-law, the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace having jurisdiction within the said municipality, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

TARADALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-four householders resident at Taradale, in the county of Talbot,* praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they reside in the district of Taradale, in the county of Talbot,* and draw attention to the extensive mining operations now carried on in the neighborhood of the township, the large population engaged therein, the substantial and costly character of their dwellings, and the quantity of land under cultivation in their immediate vicinity.

They further state that no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of some of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable; and they desire to impress upon His Excellency the expediency of forming the district into a municipality, as tending greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district, viz.:—

"Commencing at the north angle of Taradale suburban allotment No. 1. of section 12: thence running in a south-westerly direction about twenty-three chains to the western side of Melbourne main road; thence south two hundred and eighty-two chains, more or less; thence east about two hundred and ten chains along the centre of the Government road reserve between portions 54 and 55 and between portions 50 and 51 of the parish of Edgecombe to a point in the centre of the River Coliban; thence due north eighty chains, crossing portions 43, 44, 45, and 46 of the said parish of Edgecombe, and continuing up the centre of a road reserve between portions 3, 2, 1, and 4 of the parish of Metcalfe, to a distance of eighty chains, more or less; thence north 20 degrees west about one hundred and fifty-three chains to the centre of a Government road reserve running on the south side of allotment 4 of section 5, in the parish of Hawkstone; thence due west crossing the Coliban River to the Mount Alexander Railway; thence south-west to the commencing point, no one point in the described area being distant more than six miles from any other point, nor the limits or boundaries of such district embracing an area of more than nine square miles."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Taradale,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."


