## THE TOWN OF EMERALD HILL.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to define what shall be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare and order that the area hereinafter defined shall be considered a TOWN within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF EMERALD HILL:—Commencing at a point on the left bank of the River Yarra Yarra two hundred feet westward of the western building line of Montague street produced to the said river; thence in a line bearing southerly and running parallel with and two hundred feet west of the western building line of Montague street to the Sandridge road; thence along the western boundary of the Nelson road to its intersection with Dundas place; thence along the southern boundary of Dundas place to the South Park fence; thence along the southern boundary of the Three-chain road to the toll-gate; thence along the western building line of the Brighton road to the Barrack fence; thence along the fence westerly and northerly to its intersection with the Sandridge road; thence along the south boundary of the Sandridge road and north boundary of the Brighton road to Prince's Bridge; and thence along the left bank of the River Yarra Yarra to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## BOWMAN'S FOREST FARMERS' COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March now last past, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common at Bowman's Forest: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another area in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said common; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near Bowman's Forest aforesaid, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as may be prescribed, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT BOWMAN'S FOREST, Murray District, Parish of Murrumgee.—Commencing at a point bearing due west forty chains, more or less, from the north-west angle of allotment 4, section 7, parish of Murrumgee; thence south to the Owens River; thence by that river easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 8, section 10, Murrumgee; thence by the Burgois Creek northerly to its intersection with the road from Buckland to Wangaratta; thence by that road north 60° west forty-six chains fifty-five links; thence by a line and the west boundaries of allotments 8, 5, 4, and part of 1 of section 7, Murrumgee; thence by the north-west boundary of allotment 1, section 7, and the north-west boundaries of allotments 6, 5, and 1 of section 4, bearing north 30° east ninety chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of allotment 5, section 1; thence by the south boundary of last-named allotment east to the Burgois Creek; thence northerly by that creek to its intersection with the south boundary of allotment 1, section 1; thence east by that boundary to the south-east angle of last-named allotment; thence north by the east boundary of allotment 1 six chains, more or less, to the Burgois Creek; thence by that creek easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 2, section 1; thence by the west boundary of last-named allotment north fifty-seven chains seventy links to the north-east angle of allotment 2; thence west by the north boundaries of allotments 2 and 1 of section 1 and a line to the range; thence by the range southerly to a point due north of the commencing point; thence by a line south to the point of commencement. Also, the following portion of land, described as follows: Commencing at a point bearing west about eight chains from the south-east angle of allotment 4, section 7 A; thence south 13° west to the Owens River; thence by that river westerly and northerly to the intersection of the south boundary of allotment 10, section 10, Murrumgee; thence by that south boundary east to its south-east angle; thence by the east boundary of allotment 10, section 10, to its north-east angle; thence by the south, west, and north boundaries of allotment 5, section 10, to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the east boundary of allotment 4, section 10, bearing north 13° east to its north-east angle, crossing a road north 13° east to the south boundary of allotment 4, section 7 A;

thence west by the south boundary of allotment 4 to its south-west angle; thence north by the west boundaries of allotments 4, 3, 2, and 1 of section 7 A to the north-west angle of last-named allotment; thence east by the north boundaries of allotments 1 of 7 A and 1 of 8, and part of the north boundary of allotment 2, section 8, to a point bearing due south of the south-west angle of allotment 3, section 5; thence by the west boundary of allotment 3, section 5, the south boundary of allotment 1 of section 5, the west boundary of allotment 1, section 5, and allotment 6, section 2, to the Burgois Creek; by that creek easterly till it intersects the west side of allotment 6 of section 3; thence by that side of allotment 6 of section 3 north to the north-west angle thereof; thence east by the north boundaries of allotments 6 and 5 of section 3 to the north-east angle of last-named allotment; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 9, Murrumbidgee, two hundred and eighty-six chains, more or less; thence west to a point bearing west about eight chains from the south-east angle of allotment 4, section 7 A, the point of commencement. Deducing from above described area all sold and appropriated Crown lands, a plan of which is deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Approximate area, 9200 acres.

FEES FOR THE OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS FOR OTHER THAN PASTORAL PURPOSES.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, the Board of Land and Works has directed the Fees hereinafter mentioned to be charged for the occupation of Crown lands for other than pastoral purposes (in lieu of the Fees specified in the notification dated the 15th of June, 1859, published in No. 96 of the Gazette of that year), subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

Punt or Ferry	Fee to depend on the estimated traffic.
Tent	Within an area of seven miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, £3 per annum, payable quarterly in advance; beyond that distance, £1 per annum, payable in advance.
For Residence and Cultivation on the Gold Fields	£10 per annum, payable quarterly in advance, authorising the holder to occupy and cultivate two acres of land in such a position as may be approved by the Board of Land and Works and to erect a residence on such land, together with an additional fee computed at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per acre per annum for every additional acre enclosed by the holder of the license, subject to the condition that the total number of acres so occupied shall not exceed twenty (20). Area occupied to be estimated (pending survey) by the District Commissioner of Crown Lands or Surveyor.

The occupation of Crown lands as above shall be subject to the following conditions:—

The Government may at any time survey and alienate, by way of auction or otherwise, any of the lots so occupied, subject to the condition of a valuation for improvements.

And further, the Crown reserves to itself the right to survey and dedicate to public use such roads as may be deemed essential for public convenience through any of the allotments so held, without payment for any improvements that may be found on such roads when set out.

The Government shall have full powers to withhold the issue of, or to revoke, any of the licenses aforesaid whenever it shall be deemed expedient so to do.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf by the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, has, by divers Orders, temporarily reserved from sale the lands hereinafter described, for the several purposes specified in connection with each description, subject to the regulation of 14th January, 1861, wherever the same is applicable.

IN MOORPANYAL PARISH, COUNTY OF GRANT, FOR PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH PURPOSES IN CONNECTION WITH THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF VICTORIA (pursuant to Order in Council of 13th May, 1861).—Two roods, being part of allotment 1 of section 10: Commencing at the north-west corner, being the north-east corner of the Roman Catholic Church reserve; thence bounded on the north by a road bearing east two chains; thence on the east by portion of the Church of England reserve, bearing south two chains fifty links; thence on the south by the portion of said section already set apart for a Presbyterian School, bearing west two chains; thence on the west by part of the Roman Catholic Church reserve, bearing north two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.—(61.C.3100.)

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## TARADALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-four householders resident at Taradale, in the county of Talbot,\* praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

R. HEALES.

The petitioners state that they reside in the district of Taradale, in the county of Talbot,\* and draw attention to the extensive mining operations now carried on in the neighborhood of the township, the large population engaged therein, the substantial and costly character of their dwellings, and the quantity of land under cultivation in their immediate vicinity.

They further state that no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of some of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable; and they desire to impress upon His Excellency the expediency of forming the district into a municipality, as tending greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district, viz.—“Commencing at the north angle of Taradale suburban allotment No. 1, of section 12; thence running in a south-westerly direction about twenty-three chains to the western side of Melbourne main road; thence south two hundred and eighty-two chains, more or less; thence east about two hundred and ten chains along the centre of the Government road reserve between portions 54 and 55 and between portions 50 and 51 of the parish of Edgecombe to a point in the centre of the River Coliban; thence due north eighty chains, crossing portions 43, 44, 45, and 46 of the said parish of Edgecombe, and continuing up the centre of a road reserve between portions 3, 2, 1, and 4 of the parish of Metcalfe, to a distance of eighty chains, more or less; thence north 20 degrees west about one hundred and fifty-three chains to the centre of a Government road reserve running on the south side of allotment 4 of section 5, in the parish of Hawkstone; thence due west crossing the Coliban River to the Mount Alexander Railway; thence south-west to the commencing point, no one point in the described area being distant more than six miles from any other point, nor the limits or boundaries of such district embracing an area of more than nine square miles.”

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality; under the name of ‘The Municipal District of Taradale,’ according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.”

**ELECTIONS.**

Councillor Frederick Brown, J.P., having (after twice occupying the chair) resigned his seat in the council, owing to his departure for England, the council, in pursuance of a minute, presented him (at a special meeting on 15th October, 1860) with a valedictory address. And on the 9th of November following, Mr. John Yoxall was elected a councillor in his stead, by 88 votes, his opponent, Mr. Henry Littlewood, polling 74.

On the 4th January, 1861, Councillor J. K. Brown resigned his seat at the council table, and on the 30th of the same month was succeeded by Mr. H. Hunt, elected without opposition.

**WATER SUPPLY.**

The want of funds has alone prevented the council proceeding effectively with the water works, but they have cause to hope that the Government will yet see the very great desirability of rendering pecuniary aid towards the development of a project which is now admitted on all sides as calculated to be of vast benefit to the interests of the district.

The interior of the town hall is now completed, and is, without doubt, a credit both to the architect (Mr. Coe) and to the municipality. The petty sessions are held therein daily, and the hall is also available for concerts, meetings, and other public purposes.

The Government grant for the improvement of the public garden reserve has been duly expended.

The various improvements and repairs to the streets and roads of the municipality have been continued to be carried out by day labor under the town clerk as heretofore.

The Government road works for 1861 in this district were duly completed by the council so far as the votes would admit; and, as they find that they have given very general satisfaction by the improvements effected with that expenditure, the council have offered to undertake the like disbursement of the roads and bridges votes for this district for 1861.

**FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY AND READING ROOM.**

The purchase of the Athenaeum has given great satisfaction; and, in addition to the council's subsidy and local subscriptions, the library has received valuable assistance by the grant of £150 out of the legislative vote in aid of such institutions.

**MISCELLANEOUS.**

The rate for this year was fixed at One shilling in the pound, and the necessary bye-law has been duly gazetted.

The council, believing that such a course would confer a public benefit, framed a bye-law enabling them to appoint a town herdsman, but the same having been twice returned with

various objections from the Crown Law Officers, it has now been abandoned.

A town common has been proclaimed for Beechworth, but as it consists of little else than sold land and the streets of the municipality, the council have declined to frame regulations for its management.

An application of the council for the survey of a continuation of Mellish street in a southerly direction, to join the Buckland road, above Taylor and McCurdy's store, it is believed will be assented to.
