## MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED ON RESERVED LAND AT AMHERST.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of May, 1861.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that nothing thereinbefore contained shall authorise the holders of miners' rights to occupy for mining purposes any Crown land which shall have been exempted by the Governor in Council from the operations of mining, or which shall have been applied to any public use or purpose, or be lawfully and *bona fide* used as a yard, garden, or orchard, or for any race or dam, or for any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, or to cut or remove from any such Crown land any trees growing thereon, or to cut or construct any race or dam through or upon any such Crown land; but nevertheless it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to authorize the holders of miners' rights to occupy under such miners' rights, and also to cut and construct races and dams for the purposes

aforesaid, through or upon any Crown lands which may have been so exempted or applied as aforesaid, subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Governor in Council shall impose: Now therefore the Honorable Major-General Pratt, presiding in the place and stead of His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order authorise the holders of miners' rights to mine within the area of the land reserved for the purpose of a reservoir at Amherst by an Order in Council of the 15th day of October, 1860, subject to the following conditions and restrictions, that is to say:—

That the drives or shafts do not approach nearer than fifty feet to the dam, nor nearer than fifteen feet to the bye-wash; and that each miner proposing to sink a shaft do deposit the sum of Two pounds (£2) with the warden to cover the cost of repairing the damage to the surface.

And the Honorable John Basson Humfray, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## WILLIAMSTOWN TOWN COMMON ENLARGED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the present year, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Williamstown: And whereas it is expedient to increase the said common by adding thereto the area hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be an addition to the Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Williamstown, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if the said additional area had been included within the area described in the said Proclamation, that is to say:—

THE ADDITION TO THE TOWN COMMON FOR WILLIAMSTOWN.—1522 acres, more or less: Being portions D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, of section 3; C, D, E, F, G, H, I, of section 4; B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, of section 5; all in the parish of Cut-paw-paw and county of Bourke; deducting therefrom all sold or appropriated Crown lands, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.  
 TARADALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-four householders resident at Taradale, in the county of Talbot,\* praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they reside in the district of Taradale, in the county of Talbot,\* and draw attention to the extensive mining operations now carried on in the neighborhood of the township, the large population engaged therein, the substantial and costly character of their dwellings, and the quantity of land under cultivation in their immediate vicinity.

They further state that no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of some of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable; and they desire to impress upon His Excellency the expediency of forming the district into a municipality, as tending greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

They suggest the following area for a municipal district, viz.:—  
 "Commencing at the north angle of Taradale suburban allotment No. 1. of section 12; thence running in a south-westerly direction about twenty-three chains to the western side of Melbourne main road; thence south two hundred and eighty-two chains, more or less; thence east about two hundred and ten chains along the centre of the Government road reserve between portions 54 and 55 and between portions 50 and 51 of the parish of Edgcombe to a point in the centre of the River Coliban; thence due north eighty chains, crossing portions 43, 44, 45, and 46 of the said parish of Edgcombe, and continuing up the centre of a road reserve between portions 3, 2, 1, and 4 of the parish of Metcalfe, to a distance of eighty chains, more or less; thence north 20 degrees west about one hundred and fifty-three chains to the centre of a Government road reserve running on the south side of allotment 4 of section 5, in the parish of Hawkstone; thence due west crossing the Coliban River to the Mount Alexander Railway; thence south-west to the commencing point, no one point in the described area being distant more than six miles from any other point, nor the limits or boundaries of such district embracing an area of more than nine square miles."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Taradale,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

## FREE LIBRARY.

The library was opened on the 21st August, and the books purchased by the council consist of 322 volumes, in the several departments of literature and science; 195 volumes were kindly presented by various gentlemen in the neighbourhood; and 139 volumes were lent by other gentlemen for perusal. The Public Library trustees also contribute on loan 130 volumes, these being exchanged every three months for others. Upwards of 3000 persons have availed themselves of the opportunity of reading which has been afforded by this comparative limited supply, giving an average attendance per week since its commencement, of 123 persons. Increased facilities will be given for extending the library, when removed to the Town Hall.

## BYE-LAW.

A bye-law (No. 66) has been passed, and received the assent of His Excellency the Governor, for the regulation of public vehicles.

## LIGHTING.

No action has been taken further than obtaining information relative to the cost. The streets where gas pipes are already laid would require 100 lamps, the estimated cost of erection would be over £500; the cost of lighting for twelve months, at £17 per lamp, £1700.

## FIRE ENGINE.

The council have purchased the fire engine previously in possession of the Prahran Volunteer Fire Brigade, from Government, for the sum of £125 14s. 3d.

## TOLLS.

Endeavors have been made, in conjunction with the municipal councils of St. Kilda and Richmond, to obtain a reduction of the tolls at the St. Kilda and Chapel street toll-gates, without the least success. The past and present Governments decline to interfere; but they offer to give up possession of the roads to the various corporations interested, leaving them to make what arrangements they may think proper as regards the tolls.

The council have also pressed upon the Commissioner of Roads and Bridges the necessity of erecting a bridge or culvert in Gardiner's Creek road, east of Chapel street, but without success, although the same has been long promised.

## HORTICULTURAL GARDENS.

The council have joined with the Richmond and Hawthorn councils in obtaining a grant of land in the Survey Paddock, Richmond, for the purposes of the Horticultural Society.

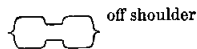
