THE SECOND SESSION OF THE THIRD PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and (subject to the limitation in the said Act contained) such times for holding the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria, and to vary and alter the same respectively as he may think fit: And whereas it is expedient to fix the time for holding the next Session of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now called "The Parliament of Victoria," which stands prorogued to Monday, the twenty-ninth day of September instant: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, appoint and proclaim that the Second Session of the Third Parliament of Victoria shall commence and be holden, for the despatch of business, on Friday, the seventh day of November next, at Two of the clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament Place, Spring Street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

## REQUISITIONS.

16. Requisitions are to be addressed to the Government Storekeeper upon the authorised form (No. 1), and are to be rendered as follows, viz. :—

Stores, on or before the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October, respectively.

Fuel and light, on the dates specified for stores.

Articles for building and manufacturing purposes, from time to time as required. The requisitionist must, however, give timely notice of his requirements.

All heads of departments are expressly enjoined to transmit their quarterly applications in due time. No supplies will be furnished until fourteen days after the receipt of the requisition.

19. The Government Storekeeper, unless with the especial sanction of the minister concerned, is on no account to furnish supplies to any department for which timely provision, as directed by these regulations, shall have been neglected.

## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Brown's and Scarsdale shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

## THE MOORABBIN ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fifth day of May in the present year, the boundaries of "The Moorabbin Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Moorabbin Road District shall comprise the area hereinafter described, that is to say:-

Commencing on the sea-coast at the south-west angle of Dendy's special survey; thence east by the south boundary of the municipality of Brighton to the south-east angle of the said municipality; thence by the eastern boundary of the said municipality bearing north-westerly and north to the north-east angle of the said municipality; thence east by part of the north boundary of the parish of Moorabbin to the north-west angle of section I. in the parish of Moorabbin; thence south to the north-west angle of section VIII. in the said parish; thence east by the north boundaries of sections VIII. and VII. of the said parish to the centre of a road which forms the eastern boundary of sections VII. and X. of the said parish; thence south by the centre of the said road to a point in the centre of a road running east and west, forming the northern boundary of sections XIV. and XV. of the said parish; thence west to a point in the centre

of the said road due north of the centre of a road which forms the western boundary of sections XIV., XIX., XXII., of the said parish; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the northern boundary of the Mordialloc Creek; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the said creek to the sea-coast; thence north-westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

### GREENHILL, EDGECOMBE, AND METCALFE FARMERS' COMMON ALTERED.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, an area therein described was proclaimed as the Greenhill, Edgcombe, and Metcalfe Farmers' Common: And whereas it is expedient to diminish the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the said Greenhill, Edgcombe, and Metcalfe Farmers' Common, by withdrawing therefrom allotments 51, 52, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 70, 71, 72, 73, and that portion of allotment 74 south of the Major's line; also, that portion of land bounded on the south and west by the Mia-mia road from its crossing the Campaspe River at the Barfold Post Office northerly to allotment 51; on the north by that allotment; and on the east by the Campaspe River: all within the parish of Redesdale, and comprising about 3000 acres in all.

### BOARD OF EDUCATION.

#### SECULAR INSTRUCTION.

THE attention of Local Committees of Schools is called to the 11th section of the Common Schools Act, which enacts, "That in every school receiving aid from the consolidated revenue, four hours shall be set apart during each school day for secular instruction alone, and of such four hours two shall be before noon, two afternoon, and shall in each case be consecutive."

The Board of Education will not feel themselves warranted in making grants to any school in which the above provision is not complied with.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 35.—A BYE-LAW TO ESTABLISH A TOLL AT A POINT ON THE YARRA BANK ROAD, WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18th Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, whenever it shall appear necessary, to establish tolls, rates, or dues, upon any road, market, wharf, or jetty within the jurisdiction and under the control of such council, and to erect toll-gates, toll-bars, check-bars, or side-bars, and other works necessary for the collection of such tolls, rates, or dues, and to make such bye-laws for the proper collection and management of such tolls, rates, or dues, as to such municipal council shall seem fit: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, bearing date the 26th day of May, A.D. 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it appears necessary to the council of the said municipal district of Emerald Hill to establish tolls, rates, or dues, at a point at the eastern end of the proclaimed road along the south bank of the River Yarra, near the bridge over the said river at the Falls, which said road is within the said municipal district, and under the control of the said council, and to erect toll-gates, toll-bars, check-bars, or side-bars, and other works necessary for the collection of such tolls, rates, or dues: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the said district, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act:

1. That on and after the first day of August, A.D. 1863, a toll shall be established at a point at the eastern end of the proclaimed road along the south bank of the River Yarra, near the bridge over the said river at the Falls, for the collection of tolls, and also that toll-gates, toll-bars, check-bars, or side-bars, and all necessary works for the collection of tolls, shall be maintained, or erected and maintained, by the said council, at such point upon such road, being within the jurisdiction and under the control of such council.

2. That the tolls specified in the schedule hereto annexed shall be the tolls payable to the said council in respect to any animal or vehicle passing through the said toll-gate or bars, check-bars, or side-bars, until such time as the said council, with such assent as aforesaid, shall see fit to alter the same.

3. That no person or persons shall in any manner evade, or attempt to evade, or aid or assist, or abet any person in evading or attempting to evade the payment of tolls payable in respect of any animal or vehicle legally chargeable therewith under the provisions of this bye-law.

4. That the christian and surname of the toll collector, and a list of the tolls for the time being payable in respect of any animal or vehicle passing through said toll-gate or bars, check-bars, or side-bars, shall be painted in black letters at least two inches in length, on a board with a white ground, which shall be placed in a conspicuous situation in front of the toll-house or contiguous to said toll-gates or bars, and no such collector shall in anywise hinder any person from reading the inscription on such board, nor shall such collector refuse to tell his christian and surname to any person who shall demand the same, nor shall give a false name, nor demand more than the legal toll, nor upon the legal toll being paid or tendered shall detain any passenger or use any abusive language.

5. That it shall be lawful for the said council from time to time, by public auction, or tender duly advertised for in the public newspapers, to let and farm out, for any term not exceeding twelve months, the tolls that may be authorised by said council to be collected at such toll-gates or bars, check-bars, or side-bars, or to employ such person or persons as may be requisite or necessary for the collection of said tolls as to the said council may seem best, and any such person so employed by said council shall be deemed and construed the toll collector within the meaning hereof.

6. No toll shall be demanded or taken by virtue of this bye-law of or from any person in Her Majesty's service, or in the employment or service of the government, or of or from any person going to or returning from any place of public worship, or of or from any minister of religion.

7. That any person or persons guilty of neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—FOR REGULATING THE CATTLE MARKET.

BE it ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Kyneton, from and after the publication of this bye-law in the *Government Gazette*, as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the Kyneton Cattle Market shall be open for the sale of the following animals, namely, horses, mares, geldings, fillies, colts, foals, bulls, oxen, cows, heifers, steers, calves, sheep, lambs, goats, and swine, every day from sunrise to sunset (Sundays, Christmas-days, and Good Fridays excepted).

2. That the following dues shall be paid as and when the animals are brought into the market, that is to say:—

3. That the market shall be under the control and management of the person authorised for the time being by the said council to collect and receive the said dues, whose duty shall also be to direct the placing of the animals for sale in the various yards, pens, or enclosures, and to maintain generally the good order and regulation of the market.

4. No such animal as aforesaid shall be sold, or offered or exposed for sale, or delivered as sold, without paying the market dues aforesaid, at any place within the said municipal district other than in the said cattle market, except at the vendor's dwelling-house or shop.

5. The maximum penalty for any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall be the sum of Five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 16, made by the municipal council of Kyneton, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.
