REGULATION FOR PASSENGER SHIPS CONVEYING NATIVES OF ASIA OR AFRICA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the session held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the Passengers Act, 1852, so far as relates to the passages of natives of Asia or Africa, and also passages between the Island of Ceylon and certain parts of the East Indies, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governors of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, if they shall think fit, to declare by Proclamation that ships intended to pass within the tropics from any ports within their respective governments may convey passengers, being natives of Asia or Africa, after the rate of one for every twelve superficial feet of the passenger deck instead of one for every fifteen such superficial feet, as required by the 12th section of the Passengers Act of 1852: And whereas by "The Passengers Act, 1855," it is provided that nothing therein contained shall extend to repeal or vary the above-recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation declare that ships intended to pass within the tropics from any port in Victoria may convey passengers, being natives of Asia or Africa, after the rate of one for every twelve superficial feet of the passenger deck.*

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint Jamieson, Upper Goulbourn, to be an additional polling place for the electoral district of The Murray; and, with the advice

aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of the division of the said district mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed shall be taken at any election for such district at the additional polling place mentioned in the second column, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON AT PYALONG.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common," provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as are or may be prescribed, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT PYALONG, County of Dalhousie, Parish of Pyalong.—Approximate area, 2130 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 38 on Mollison's Creek; bounded on the south by a line bearing west fifty-two chains; on the west by a line bearing north one hundred and sixty chains fifty links; on the north by a line bearing east two hundred and eighteen chains to the telegraph line; and on the east by the telegraph line, distant forty-eight chains to the north-west corner of allotment 1, section 1, township of Pyalong; thence by the north boundaries of agricultural allotments 51, 50, 48, and 45, to Mollison's Creek; and thence by Mollison's Creek, bearing southerly and westerly to the commencing point. The bearings are given in reference to the true meridian.—(61.D.9517.)

MUNICIPALITY OF HEATHCOTE.

BY-LAW No. 8.—To IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 21ST SEPTEMBER, 1862, ON THE ASSESSMENT ROLL OF TEN THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND EIGHTEEN POUNDS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is entitled and empowered to impose a rate on all houses, lands, and tenements, within the limits of such municipal district, according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Heathcote, that a rate for the current year ending 21st September, 1862, of One shilling in the pound on the annual value of all property in houses, lands, and tenements, within the municipal district aforesaid, be imposed and levied, and that the same become due on and after 31st January, 1862.

The foregoing By-law, No. 8, made by the municipal council of Heathcote, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-seven landholders and householders resident at Brown's and Scarsdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are resident landholders and householders in the locality hereinafter described, and known as "Brown's and Scarsdale," in the parish of Scarsdale, which they are desirous should be erected into a municipal district.

That there are between 5000 and 6000 inhabitants in the proposed district, most of whom are engaged in mining, commercial, and agricultural pursuits, and are located at Brown's, Scarsdale, and Black Hill, and that there is, besides, a large number of scattered habitations, the occupants of which it is desirable to include, and thus to secure to all the comforts and advantages derivable from centralization.

That the locality is well adapted for agriculture, and if rendered available by division into allotments of from half an acre to five acres or more will be capable of producing cereals and vegetables at present imported from other localities, and that the saving anticipated from such an arrangement might be applied to municipal requirements.

That the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, a genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are here concentrated; that 325 acres are held under mining leases at a rental of £1625; and that there are 35 steam-engines in operation, which, with their appliances, are valued at £50,000; fifteen commodious hotels, a large number of mercantile establishments of a costly description, comfortable dwellings, a considerable number of horses and cattle, and a weekly yield of about 1500 ounces of gold.

That the greatest inconvenience experienced by the petitioners arises from want of roads, there being but ten chains of made road in the district, and the intercourse with surrounding localities constant and frequent, and that the prices of articles of necessity are enhanced through the hazards and delay inseparable from bad roads.

Lastly, the petitioners are stimulated to improve the surrounding lines of communication by the anticipation that their district will become the entrepôt between the western district and the sea-board *via* the Ballarat and Geelong Railway.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"Your petitioners seeing the manifold advantages of municipal institutions in other districts believe that similar results would follow the extension of the Municipal Act to theirs, and they therefore most humbly pray your Excellency to proclaim the area herein described as 'The municipal district of Brown's and Scarsdale,' [viz.]—commencing at the south-east corner of the Smythesdale municipality; thence west along the south boundary of the said municipality one hundred and twenty chains; thence by a continuation of the same line sixty chains; thence south three hundred and twenty chains; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, running partly along the north boundary of Brown's pre-emptive right; thence north three hundred and twenty chains to the commencing point aforesaid, the whole area being nine square miles."

They will therefore have to obtain some other design.

BYE-LAWS.

The two following bye-laws adopted by the council previous to the publication of last report, but not then assented to by his Excellency the Governor, have since been gazetted, viz.:

Bye-law No. 18. To provide for the appointment of a chairman to preside at the election of members of council.

Bye-law No. 19. For licensing and regulating the slaughtering of small cattle within the town of Dunolly.

The two following bye-laws have been adopted during the half-year, and have been gazetted, viz.:

Bye-law No. 20. For an assessment of houses and land for the current municipal year.

Bye-law No. 21. For levying a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound for the current municipal year.

The assent of His Excellency the Governor has been refused to:—
Bye-law No. 22. For prohibiting the keeping of swine within a certain portion of the town.

REPORT of the Proceedings of the Council for the half-year ending 31st December, 1861.

PUBLIC WORKS.

- The following works have been executed during the last half-year, namely:—
1. Formation of Crown, Hotham, Park, St. Luke streets, and Clarendon place.
 2. Formation of a portion of a road along the south bank of the Yarra.
 3. Formation of a portion of the Eastern road, and certain streets running into same.
 4. Channelling has been laid down in Raglan, Clarendon, Coventry, York, Cooto, Moray, Park, Church, Montague, Napier, Palmer, Nelson, and Bank streets, east and west, Little Bank street, Park place, &c.
 5. Crossings have been constructed in several streets.
 6. Park street has been metalled and kerbed between Cecil and Clarendon streets, and the channelling on the south side is in progress.
 7. A supply of metal has been procured for the Three-chain road, Clarendon street, York street, Bank street, Napier street, Cecil street, Church street, Market street, Moray street, &c.
 8. Wood kerbing has been laid down in Hotham street, Clarendon place, Crown street, Park street, Church street, Montague street, Three-chain road, &c.
 9. Sheep abattoirs with every convenience for slaughtering have been erected outside the town.
 10. A contract has been entered into for the extermination of thistles.
 11. The whole of the houses in the town have been numbered, and suitable number plates affixed.

PUBLIC WORKS IN PROGRESS.

Erection of drinking taps, extension of the Yan Yean to the abattoirs, ventilation of the Council Chambers, formation of portion of Dorcas street east and Moray place, channelling in various streets, erection of bridges in the line of the Yarra Bank road, formation of the north footpath of Park street produced to the Brighton road, formation of a road leading to the abattoirs, &c.

SANDRIDGE ROAD.

The continuation of the post and chain fence westwards, and the kerbing of the footpaths have been completed, the tree-guards raised, the flight of steps near Prince's Bridge has been rebuilt, the embankment considerably added to, and other improvements effected.

IMPROVEMENTS IN THE SOUTH PARK.

The Government having permitted the council to expend within their district the amount voted in aid of the improvement of the South Park, the following works have been undertaken, namely:—The construction of a road commencing at the Cecil street gates, fencing off a portion of the park which has been planted, construction of seats, tree-guards, &c., and the building

formerly used as the toll-house on the Sandridge road has been removed and re-erected as a gate-lodge at the Cecil street entrance to the park.

ELECTION.

On the 30th September the Chairman (Councillor H. S. Gardner, J.P.) resigned his seat in the council; Councillor Palk, J.P., was elected to the chair, and the vacancy at the board was filled up by the election, on 1st November, of Mr. Robert Atkinson.
